2. Structure, Governance and Management

DOPPSI is governed by its trustees, who are responsible for the overall direction, financial stewardship, and governance of the charity. Trustees meet as required to review activities, oversee finances, and ensure that the charity operates in accordance with its charitable objectives and applicable Charity Commission guidance.

The trustees are committed to good governance, accountability, and transparency, and ensure that appropriate controls and insurance are in place to manage risk and protect beneficiaries, volunteers, and the organisation.

3. Objectives and Activities

Charitable Objectives

The objectives of DOPPSI are to advance health, relieve poverty, and promote wellbeing through outreach programmes, education, and practical support. The charity seeks to improve the quality of life for vulnerable and underserved communities, particularly through health screening initiatives, community engagement, and capacity-building activities.

Activities Undertaken to Achieve the Objectives

During the reporting period, the charity undertook the following activities in furtherance of its charitable objectives:

1. Health Outreach and Medical Screening

DOPPSI supported healthcare screening initiatives, including the use of HbA1c testing cartridges to assist in identifying individuals at risk of diabetes. These activities contributed to early detection, improved health awareness, and appropriate signposting for further care.

2. International Outreach and Community Support (Ghana)

The charity facilitated international outreach activities in Ghana, supporting volunteers to deliver practical assistance and community-based interventions. Funds were used to cover essential travel, logistics, and local transport to ensure effective delivery of outreach programmes.

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3. Volunteer Mobilisation and Support

DOPPSI provided financial support to assist volunteers travelling between the UK and Ghana, helping to reduce barriers to participation and enabling skilled individuals to contribute meaningfully to charitable activities.

4. Governance, Safeguarding, and Risk Management

The charity maintained appropriate insurance cover throughout the year to support safeguarding, volunteer protection, and risk management, ensuring that activities were conducted safely and responsibly.

Public Benefit Statement

In carrying out its activities, the trustees have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The charity's work provided clear public benefit through improved access to health screening, support for disadvantaged communities, and the promotion of wellbeing. Access to services was not unreasonably restricted.

4. Achievements and Performance

Despite limited resources, DOPPSI successfully delivered key outreach activities during the reporting period. The charity:

- Enabled health screening using HbA1c testing equipment
- Supported international outreach activities in Ghana
- Mobilised and supported volunteers
- Maintained essential governance and safeguarding arrangements

These activities contributed positively to community wellbeing and strengthened the charity's operational capacity.

The core objective of DOPPSI is the prevention and protection of good health of people at risk of or who have diabetes in developing countries with particular emphasis on the poor and needy sectors of communities who are unable to afford the cost of healthcare by the provision of education, training and outreach programs focused on the prevention, treatment, rehabilitation and support for all impacted by diabetes.

DOPPSI has survived the many challenges in past years notably COVID-19 and the Ukraine war. Notwithstanding the abovementioned challenges, we were able to embark on outreach programs that saw us deliver about 2000 blood sugar in London, Oxford, and Sheffield all in the United Kingdom, worth more than £10,000.

It is worth mentioning that all these blood sugar machines were donated to DOPPSI by GlucoRx, also in 13/09/2022 we received £1142.86 from Gogglesdocs Ltd. In August 2022 CloserStill Media Limited gave us a free registration at the Diabetes Conference worth £3,201.

The outreach programs and education have provided a life-changing impact on the communities which gave rise to us referring about 130 people to their GPs.

DOPPSI is focused on working hard to achieve our mandate to the community and the world at large giving the opportunity.

I am writing to complain about that the experience I had in trying to open a bank account for our charity, Diabetes Outreach Prevention Programmes International (DOPPSI). I was puzzled to hear that "HSBC does not have appetite for our business". A charity that provides education, training and outreach programs that are focused on prevention, treatment and

rehabilitation of persons whose life has been impacted by diabetes. I still cannot believe that decision and the rationale for that decision taken by HSBC.

I started filling out the application form on ...

My colleagues were asked to complete their part of the verification which they duly did and completed by on or around 26th December 2019.

I was asked to attend an interview on the 4th Feb which I attended with one of the key members of the charity. We answered all questions asked and provided all the documents requested as well as our signatures. We were told that we will hear from you within 2 weeks.

After 3 weeks of not hearing from you, I asked the gentleman with whom I attended the interview to call to enquire about the outcome of the application, only to be told that there was no record of us attending the interview and all that was on the system was an interview booked. The customer service assistant who handled the call insisted that we had not attended the interview. She reluctantly obliged to send an email for the gentleman we went to see for the interview to check why the notes were not showing on the system and to get in touch with us.

The gentleman did get in touch with my colleague with a telephone call to tell him that, the application had been unsuccessful 'HSBC does not have appetite for our business.

I have opened a charity account with HSBC before, my colleague too has personal accounts with HSBC. I find the whole process fishy and would like to lodge a formal complaint for our application to be reviewed.

COVID-19 has created a perfect storm for charities worldwide, as major swathes of income have been lost, demands on services have increased and some are unable to run at all because of imposed limitations.

Nonetheless the untold stories of COVID, we were expectant to have a great year base on our previous performance but the Covid pandemic eroded all our prospects. Last year Glucorx donated about £15000 worth of blood glucose monitors with strips. This year has been a total drought with no donations or income as a direct result of the Covid pandemic

There are tough decisions ahead, with so much demand, so little money and resources, we are having to look at what we can continue doing to achieve our mission which is to provide education on prevention, early diagnosis and access to treatment of diabetes in the UK and worldwide.
