The trustees are each allocated particular roles to facilitate the day to day operations. Decisions are made by the trustees at formal quarterly trustees meetings and, additionally, informal meetings as required.

There are no relationships with any related parties

There are no major risks to consider. Vet bills for dogs that either need operations or emergency medical treatment when they are in kennels or foster care in the UK or potentially kennel costs in relation to RBU (Rescue Back Up), for which trustees have assessed both of these risks as low.

To promote humane behaviour towards dogs in Romania in particular, but not exclusively, by supporting shelters that provide appropriate care, protection, treatment, and security for dogs which are in need of care and attention by reason of sickness, maltreatment, poor circumstances or ill usage, rehoming dogs who are in need of rehoming and educating the public in matters pertaining to dog welfare in general and the prevention of cruelty and suffering among dogs

Supporting financially, by way of grants, and with advice, so that the dogs in the care of our preferred rescuers can be fed, cared for and given veterinary treatment as and when necessary.

The transportation and rehoming of dogs from Romania to the UK.

Providing veterinary care to those dogs that require veterinary care over and above the usual veterinary care required i.e. specific or lifesaving surgery and/or treatment.

The spay & neuter of both street and owned dogs; furthermore, giving advice on the upkeep for those dogs that are owned, thereby improving their standards of welfare.

Reserving dogs from the Public Shelter (kill shelter) and bringing to the UK for rehoming.

GRANT MAKING POLICY

In furtherance of our charitable purposes we provide ongoing financial support by way of monthly grant payments to our preferred rescuers, predominantly based in Romania. Grant payments are a combination of, mostly, restricted and, to a lesser degree, unrestricted funds.

VOLUNTEERS

The charity has no paid staff and all of the activities undertaken are fulfilled by volunteers who undertake a range of activities including fundraising, running our social media pages and the rehoming of the dogs.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The transportation and rehoming of 165 dogs from Romania to the UK. This is lower than previous years due to the suspension by Defra of importing commercial dogs from Romania between August 2023 to the end of November 2023.

Grants made to enable our preferred rescuers to meet the costs for the welfare of the dogs in their care, so they can be fed and cared for.

The funding of vet bills for dogs being treated for parvovirus and needing orthopaedic operations in Romania.

The spay and neuter of 168 dogs. In addition, giving advice on the upkeep for those dogs that are owned and thereby improving their standards of welfare. The figure of neutered dogs does not include those of the supported rescuers, which are categorised under “outgoing vet costs”

Total income of £169,278 and total expenditure of £168,000 has been incurred in the year.

The net surplus for the year was £1,278.

Any overall surplus will be reinvested in further expanding our work to fulfil our charitable purposes and part to be held for general UK costs.

Income was lower this year as a result of the Defra suspension for importing commercial dogs from Romania, resulting in reduced adoptions.


