Despite low levels of help this year, the charity was still able to release 124 animals back to the wild, benefitting the environment and community.

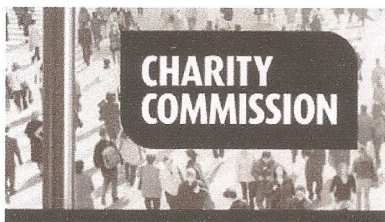

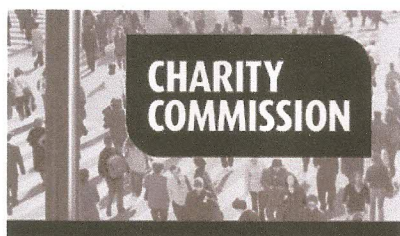

The printed materials were also accompanied by advice given on conservation by the trustees.

Volunteers are aware of local social media sites and direct members of the public that need help with wildlife to the charity manager for advice and help and are willing to fundraise and bring awareness to the community about their environment.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

There has been a record number of patients treated, rehabilitated and released at the hospital this year. 652 patients admitted with 77% success rate.

The charity has raised enough funds to purchase 12 new hospital enclosures, a microscope, a second incubator and a nebuliser. The hospital has moved to larger premises, has been paying rent and utilities, decorated, increased the number of volunteers that help and created a shop to sell items and raise funds for the charity

At present, we now have 30 volunteers that have been trained and are attending weekly.

Educational and Conservation printed material has been distributed to the general public at fundraising events, to local groups and schools to provide public benefit in regard to the Charity Commission's guidance.

The trustees fundraising efforts and donations has allowed the Charity to continue with its work and improve the hospital facilities.

As this is the second year of the Charity, the trustees have decided not to have a reserves policy for the first 2 years to allow funds to build up. After this period, the trustees will reassess and will set a reserves policy which will be reviewed annually.

The Charity has held weekly fundraising stalls selling donated items and used social media fundraising platforms also. Members of the public that find and bring injured wildlife to the hospital will donate at the time or on a monthly basis into the Charity bank account.

This funding has enabled the Charity to achieve its key objectives by supporting the day to day running of the hospital and also to increase the intake of patients by providing more enclosures.
