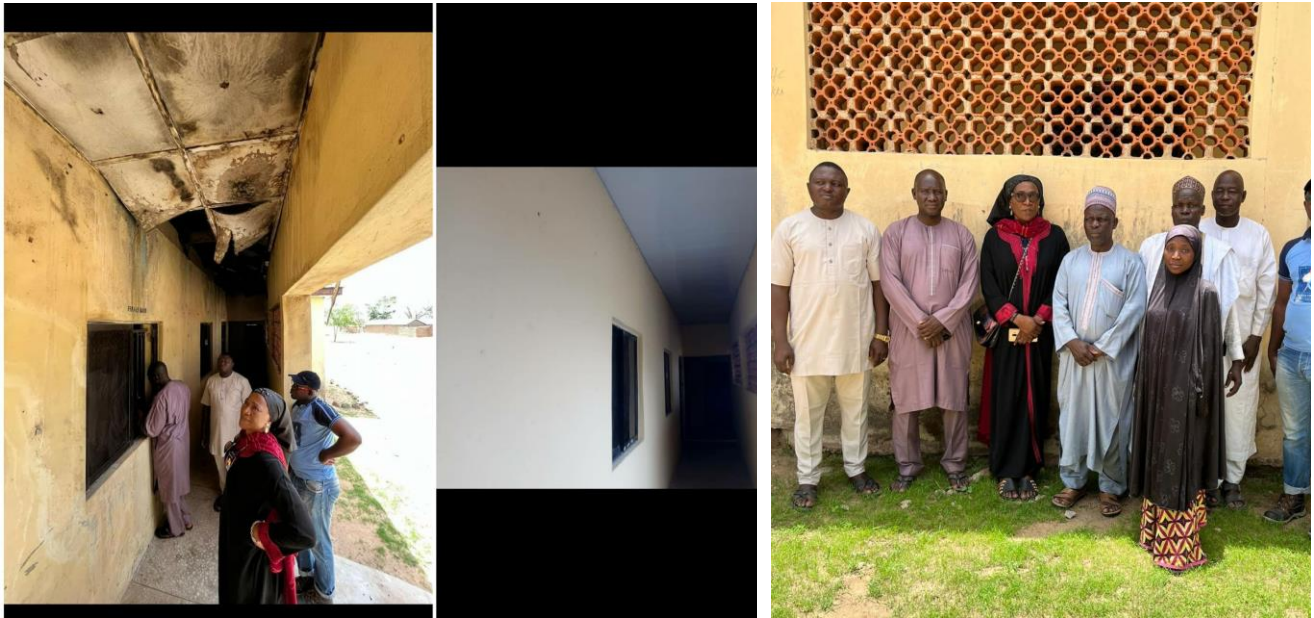

Renovation of Primary Healthcare Clinic in Bauchi State



The Kairos Initiative partnered with the Kitchen Table Charities Trust in renovating the Primary Health Clinic in Bauchi State, Nigeria. Current statistics reveal a concerning doctor-to-patient ratio of 1:5,000, far from the World Health Organisation's recommended 1:600, which endangers community health and risks worsening key health indicators. This project will provide essential healthcare access for men, women, children, and infants, addressing critical needs. Additionally, it created employment opportunities within the community, enhancing local livelihoods and supporting broader socio-economic development. This partnership aims to make a lasting, positive impact on public health and community resilience
