To relieve the needs of people affected by heart/cardiac conditions and their families/carers in Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, Leicestershire and South Yorkshire by:

- a) The provision of a self-help group to reduce social isolation and increase mental wellbeing of those people by coming together to share experiences.
- b) Providing a safe, friendly and non-judgemental space in which people can share, listen and be listened to.
- c) Raising awareness of clinical treatment, prevention, recovery and mental wellbeing related to cardiac conditions.

**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects**

In planning activities for the year H2H kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at our trustee meetings.

The main activities are as follows:

- Hosting self-help groups/meetings at least once per month
- Hosting occasional walking groups

The monthly self-help groups benefit those affected by cardiac conditions and their families/carers by providing a safe space to share experiences. Cardiac Nurses are available during these meetings to offer advice about medications, exercise, treatments, etc. and having such valuable knowledge available boosts the morale of the local community attending these groups. We welcome all those who may be suffering and their extended families and carers regardless of faith, gender or personal circumstances.

The walking groups enable those with cardiac conditions to exercise safely with others in similar circumstances. This boosts morale and gives people self-confidence to try some light exercise after a significant cardiac event.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

Unfortunately, lockdowns, restrictions and general uncertainty due to the Coronavirus pandemic stopped face-to-face self-help groups abruptly. Though trustees hosted a small number of online “zoom” meetings during lockdowns to keep in touch with regular attendees, these were moderately well attended.

Face-to-face groups recommenced in February 2022. There were less attendees than before the pandemic, this would be due to those more vulnerable still wary about socialising.


