Objectives and activities of the Charity

The Trustees are keen to support activities that advance the objects in an effective way. However, they recognise that a limited funds is available to distribute each year.

Trustees' current funding priorities are:

Relief of patients suffering from any form of illness, disease or disability, the promotion of research into the causes and treatment of such illness, disease or disability and the provision of medical equipment for such patients.

Support and relief of relatives of and carers for patients suffering from any form of illness or disease, the elderly or the the disabled by the provision of support and training to such relatives and carers.

To provide and advance the education of children and young people who do not have access or have limited access to schooling by providing and assisting in the provision of facilities for education.

Provision or assistance in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship of social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

Prevention or relief of poverty or financial hardship anywhere in the world by providing or assisting in the provision of education, training, healthcare projects, housing and all other necessary support, or by providing donations, grants, items and services to individuals in need.

Relief of unemployment for the benefit of the public in such ways as may be thought fit, including assistance to find employment.

Promotion of human rights (as set out in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and subsequent United Nations conventions and declarations) throughout the world.

Promotion of equality and diversity for the public benefit and the relief of financial need and suffering among victims of natural or other kinds of disaster or war, in the form of money (or other means deemed suitable) for persons, bodies, organisations and/or countries affected including the provision of medical aid.
