The Trustees confirm that they have complied with their duty under section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, "Charities and Public Benefit".

The trustees, supported by a team of UK-based volunteers, have established a secure and responsible rescue back-up service for stray and abused dogs in Romania.

These animals are often found in extremely poor conditions by individual local rescuers who lack the financial means to provide necessary medical treatment or to rehome them safely, either within Romania or internationally.

The charity, operating under the name *Freedom Angels Romania*, is committed to assisting these independent rescuers—many of whom the trustees have supported over the past seven years.

Each case is reviewed on an individual basis, and full support is provided to ensure the animals receive appropriate veterinary care and are rehomed through a managed and ethical process.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

The charity has now rescued and rehomed over 140 dogs now, since the inception.

Freedom Angels Romania has developed a strong online presence to promote its rescue and rehoming efforts, primarily through a successful Facebook group, our website ([www.FARDogs.co.uk](http://www.FARDogs.co.uk)), and advertising platforms such as Pets4Homes, alongside Twitter and Instagram. These platforms enable us to raise awareness of the charity's work in Romania and promote dogs in need of adoption or foster homes in the UK.

All dogs are carefully assessed—either while in Romania or in UK foster homes—before being promoted for adoption. A thorough home check is conducted by at least one trustee to ensure suitability, and we provide full post-adoption support, including follow-up and neutering verification.

We have continued to grow our network of volunteers and foster homes across the UK to support the rehabilitation and rehoming of rescued animals. A fundraising platform has also been established to support our "Spayathon" initiative, aimed at reducing the stray dog population through targeted spaying programmes in Romania.

To maintain engagement and transparency, we manage private social media groups for adopters, rescuers, and foster families, in addition to our public Facebook group with a significant following. Most adoption applications are received via our website, which lists all available dogs.

Our dedicated team of volunteers actively organises fundraising events to support the charity's core objectives, including medical treatment, rehabilitation, and specialist care for dogs in need.





### **Summary of the objects of the charity**

To relieve the suffering of animals in need of care and attention and, in particular, to provide and maintain a rescue and rehoming service for the reception, care and treatment of stray dogs in Romania who by reason of abandonment, neglect or mistreatment are in need of such care and attention.

### **Summary of the charity's main activities**

The trustees and a group of volunteers acting as admin members of the UK Rescue charity, have come together to create a safe and secured Rescue Back up, for some of the stray and abused dogs and cats from Romania, which are found by individual animal lovers in appalling conditions. These rescuers have no means to pay for the medical needs of the dog or cat, or indeed rehome it either within their own country or abroad in a managed, safe and correct way.

Freedom Angels Romanic will undertake to assist individual "loan rescuers" in Romania, that we the Trustees have helped and assisted over the last 6 years. We look at each loan rescuer and assess each case individually. We offer full support to ensure that the stray and abused dogs receive all the care it needs and rehome correctly.

### **Summary of the charity's main achievements in the period**

We have found new permanent homes for over 800 dogs.

We have done so by building a considerable on-line presence with a successful Facebook group, supported by our website [www.FARDogs.co.uk](http://www.FARDogs.co.uk). We use 'Pets4Home' to further advertise our presence, and have twitter and Instagram accounts. This enables us to promote the work we undertake in Romania, and the dog's needing adoption and/or foster homes in the UK.

Our dogs are fully assessed, whether in Romania, or in their UK foster home before being promoted. A robust "Home Check" occurs, by at least one trustee from the charity for suitability prior to placing the dogs. We offer a full back up service for support and follow up on each dog to ensure that all is well, and if required that the animal has been neutered.

We have continued to recruit volunteers and foster homes to assist us in rehabilitation and rehoming of the dogs in our care in the UK.

We have set up a fundraising platform for a Spayathon programme to carry out spaying of dogs in Romania.

We have set up private social media groups to keep our adopters, loan rescuers and foster families informed on the progress of our dogs. We also have a public Facebook group with a very strong following. Our main source of adoption applications has come from our webpage which has all dogs that are available for adoption.

Freedom Angels Romanic have a dedicated team of volunteers that are focused on organising fundraising events to help boost the charities funds to enable us to carry out Spayathons and help dogs that need specialist care and rehabilitation.

## 1 Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

### Incoming resources

#### *Charitable trading activities*

Income from adopters of animals is accounted for in the period in which it is received.

Income from donations and grants, including capital grants, is included in incoming resources when these are receivable, except as follows:

- When donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods.
- When donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use have been met.

When donors specify that donations and grants, including capital grants, are for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources of restricted funds when receivable.

### Interest receivable

Interest is included when receivable by the charity.

### Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis, exclusive of VAT.

### Fund accounting

Funds held by the charity are either:

- Unrestricted general funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the Trustees.
- Designated funds - these are funds set aside by the Trustees out of unrestricted general funds for specific future purposes or projects.
- Restricted funds - these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value

Going concern

The Trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern nor any significant areas of uncertainty that affect the carrying value of assets held by the charity.

Taxation

The Charity is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 of the Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes. Accordingly, the Charity is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income or capital gains received within categories covered by Chapter 3 Part 11 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992, to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes.

Exemption from cash flow

The charity opted to early adopt Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2017 and have therefore not included a cash flow statement in these financial statements.

Tangible fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £500 or more are initially recorded at cost, less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses. Capital items below £500 are written off through the income and expenditure account.

Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

TO RELIEVE THE SUFFERING OF ANIMALS IN NEED OF CARE AND ATTENTION AND, IN PARTICULAR, TO PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN A RESCUE AND REHOMING SERVICE FOR THE RECEPTION, CARE AND TREATMENT OF STRAY DOGS IN ROMANIA AND CYPRUS WHO BY REASON OF ABANDONMENT, NEGLECT OR MISTREATMENT ARE IN NEED OF SUCH CARE AND ATTENTION.

#### **Summary of the charity's main activities**

The trustees and a group of volunteers acting as Admin members of the UK Rescue charity, have come together to create a safe and secured Rescue Back up, for some of the stray and abused dogs and cats from Cyprus and Romania, which are found by individual animal lovers in appalling conditions. These rescuers have no means to pay for the medical needs of the dog or cat, or indeed rehome it either within their own country or abroad in a managed, safe and correct way.

FAAR will undertake to assist individuals/ small Rescue Pound centres (to commence with) from both countries, that all trustees have known and assisted over the last 5 years or more, on individual cases. We call these people the Lone rescuers, and as such they need full support to ensure the stray and abused dog or cat receives all the care it needs, and rehomed correctly.



## Summary of the charity's main achievements in the period

Our first period as a registered Charity is a longer financial period of April 2019 to 31<sup>st</sup> Aug 2020, as we received Charity Registration in April 2019 and our rehoming commenced in Sept 2018, where we assisted in a handful of dogs in desperate need.

In late 2018 an application was made to charity commission, as we believed that we needed to be an established Charity to succeed in our long term goals and aspirations. We held a number of meetings, we created all the structures, processes, Policies, agreements, together with our Partnership agreements and Risk Assessments with our European Lone Rescuers.

We instantly created a Charity registration with PeTtrac, where we have registered all our dogs and cats' microchips from the point of entry in to the UK, with Dual registration to our Charity. We further established a Rescue Partnership agreement with Agria Pet Insurance, and all our rescue pets have a 5 weeks free pet insurance once adopted.

We purchased and established from the very first adoption, a fully managed database known as Shelter Manager, which we maintain for all the financial and Pet details and since the 1<sup>st</sup> Sept 2020 we have transitioned to Sage 50 Accounts for digital management of all our accounts, Gift Aid and VAT returns.

A registration was also established with Pets4Home, adoption online portal, where we successfully build our Rescue presence and promote all our dogs in our UK foster homes, that have been assessed and are ready for the forever homes.

From outset we registered with The Homecheck rehoming group, which carry out all our required home checks and strict GDPR regulations and followed by them and maintained at all times.

During the early months we started to recruit volunteers and foster homes, so we could assist with the rehabilitation of some of the dogs under our care in the UK, this has continued to grow.

We rehomed 405 dogs and 5 cats during the period of April 2019 to Aug 2020, and we took under our care a further 82 dogs in both Cyprus and Romania.

Our Facebook Group was created during this period and we established very quickly a strong following and a high number of adoptions and enquiries are to come from our Facebook presence, Pets4Homes and recommendations.

We soon realised that our team had to grow, in both Trustees and volunteers, where a number of administration roles needed to be filled, so we create a detailed rehoming structure for both Cyprus and Romania and we now have Rehoming Guardians for all our dogs and a follow up administration team. We have recruited further Trustees and Volunteers within our own supporters group.
