### **Objectives and Activities**

City Kids Surfing works for the public benefit to advance the lives of young people living in urban locations in the United Kingdom through providing recreational and leisure activities in the interest of social welfare for young people who have a need by reason of their social and economic circumstances, with a view to improving the conditions of life of such persons, in particular by providing opportunities to go surfing.

Specifically City Kids Surfing works to raise children's awareness of ocean-related activities and concerns including:

- Improving their swimming ability
- Raising awareness of beach safety
- Raising awareness of coastal conservation issues
- Giving an understanding of the wider surfing industry
- To share the benefits of engaging with the ocean for an individual's physical, mental, social and environmental wellbeing.

### **Achievements and Performance**

In 2025, City Kids Surfing continued its focus on improving the governance of our organisation. We also sought to develop our fundraising activities and began a review of our strategy.

In September, we welcomed Joe Taylor as a Trustee. Joe brings a wealth of experience from the charity and surf therapy sectors having founded the Wave Project. Joe has immediately helped City Kids Surfing to step back and review its strategy, bringing Trustees and City Kids Surfing founder to a consensus on the charity's mission, vision and direction.

During the year a number of fundraising activities were carried out by our volunteers, including half-marathons and grueling 24 hour swims. We also ran our first ever event: a celebration of cold water surfing at

Brockwell Lido, where we held family friendly races on surfboards across the pool, a raffle with generous prizes from local businesses and surf brands and yoga and breath classes. The event was a success, with raising just under £1k and developing a new relationship with Brockwell Lido and Fusion who are keen to explore further events with us.

We ran another brilliant programme with three primary schools in South London, working with a total of 24 pupil premium children in year 5. This involved spending time with the staff, parents and pupils in school, raising their awareness of both ocean conservation and coastal safety, as well as developing their understanding of both physical and mental wellbeing.

Our programme culminated in a fantastic weekend in North Devon, where the children had the opportunity to experience the benefits of spending time in and near the ocean, to step out of their comfort zones and try surfing for the first time and build new friendships through play and exploration. This year we delivered some of the surf sessions ourselves, with two of our Trustees who are qualified surf instructors. We also ran daily yoga and fitness sessions to build understanding of the importance of physical and mental wellbeing and provide the children with simple tools to implement positive practices in their lives back in London. Each evening we ran fun and educational sessions including a Q&A with a professional surfer and a surf instructor, films to highlight diversity in surfing and an awards ceremony to celebrate everyone's progress in and out of the water over the programme.

This year, we also developed a new short film, in collaboration with talented directors and cinematographers from London. The film depicts the experience of one of the children, and highlights how her two different worlds (one of a big city and the other an ocean) inform each other and teach her lessons of discovery and growth. We plan to launch this film exclusively with the children and their families in 2026, and submit to a number of film festivals. We will use the film as a tool to increase our reach, gain new supporters and attract new funding.

With work underway on our new strategy, 2026 will focus on accessing new and larger grants to deliver a pilot across 2026/27, demonstrating the impact of our interventions and seeking expansion of our work.

City Kids Surfing works for the public benefit to advance the lives of young people living in urban locations in the United Kingdom through providing recreational and leisure activities in the interest of social welfare for young people who have a need by reason of their social and economic circumstances, with a view to improving the conditions of life of such persons, in particular by providing opportunities to go surfing.

Specifically City Kids Surfing works to raise children's awareness of ocean-related activities and concerns including:

- Improving their swimming ability
- Raising awareness of beach safety
- Raising awareness of coastal conservation issues
- Giving an understanding of the wider surfing industry
- To share the benefits of engaging with the ocean for an individual's physical, mental, social and environmental wellbeing.

### **Achievements and Performance**

2024 has been a year of further development for City Kids Surfing. We have continued to improve the governance of our organisation, develop our partnerships with primary schools in London, corporate partners and other community and grassroots organisations.

As our Trustee James Sutton left the charity due to moving to Australia, we recruited two new board members, Kate and Khadija, in September. Kate and Khadija bring experience and expertise from the surfing community, in marketing and communications, and from the arts, charity and business sectors. A huge thanks to James for his support and leadership since City Kids Surfing began!

During the year we ran another brilliant surf trip and this time extended the programme to a third primary school in South London, working with a total of 24 pupil premium children in year 5. This involved spending time with the staff, parents and pupils in school, raising their awareness of both ocean conservation and coastal safety, as well as developing their understanding of both physical and mental wellbeing.

Our programme culminated in a fantastic weekend in North Devon, including a packed programme of different activities to provide ample opportunity for the children to explore, learn new skills, build friendships and have fun. During the weekend they all had the opportunity to learn to surf over a number of lessons. A huge number of children managed to stand up and many enjoyed paddling about in the shallows and the feeling of riding the white water to the shore.

As ever our programme included a focus on healthy eating – both eating healthily over the weekend, as well as inviting the children to play their own part in food preparation and learn new skills and meal ideas to take home with them.

We also ran daily yoga and fitness sessions to build understanding of the importance of physical and mental wellbeing and provide the children with simple tools to implement positive practices in their lives back in London.

Finally each evening we ran fun and educational sessions including a Q&A with a professional surfer, films to highlight diversity in surfing and an awards ceremony to celebrate everyone's progress in and out of the water over the programme.

With increasing costs each year, City Kids Surfing faces challenges in raising sufficient funding to run our activities. In 2025 we will seek to diversify our income, collaborate further with existing and new partners and find ways of making cost efficiencies.

Recognising that it is important that our organisation reflects the children it supports, we have collaborated with other organisations to attract new volunteers and help increase diversity among our volunteers and board of trustees. We have now successfully increased the number of women and people from ethnically diverse backgrounds on both our board and among our volunteers. This will be a continuous effort and a rolling agenda item for our board meetings.

### **Achievements and Performance**

2023 has been a year of further development for City Kids Surfing. We have continued to develop our partnerships with primary schools in London, corporate partners and other charitable relationships. It has been exciting to see our team of volunteers develop, and find new people to connect with and support the City Kids Surfing cause.

During the year we ran a wonderful programme crafted for two primary schools, working with some of their pupil premium children in year 5. This involved spending time with the staff and pupils in school, raising their awareness of both ocean conservation and coastal safety, as well

as developing their understanding of holistic health – i.e. not just physical wellbeing.

Our programme culminated in a fantastic weekend in North Devon, experiencing time at the beach and gaining insight into the beauty and power of the ocean. During the weekend they all had the opportunity to learn to surf over a number of lessons. All of the children improved greatly, finding joy and challenge in the waves, pushing themselves out of their comfort zones within the safety of a great team around them.

As ever our programme included a focus on healthy eating – both eating healthily over the weekend, as well as inviting the children to play their own part in food preparation and learn new skills and meal ideas to take home with them. They made their own pizzas and their own burgers, growing in their knowledge of how to make healthy choices around food.

A growing part of the programme has also been on mindfulness and deliberate movement. We had great sessions helping the children be mindful of their thoughts, emotions and bodies, as well as giving the opportunity to take part together in a HIIT (high intensity interval training) session. This enabled them to think about how they challenge and support their bodies, and again gained skills and practices that they could take with them beyond the year's programme.

With increasing costs each year, City Kids Surfing faces challenges in raising sufficient funding to run our activities. In 2024, we will seek to diversify our income, collaborate further with existing and new partners and find ways of making cost efficiencies.

It's exciting seeing how City Kids Surfing has grown this year, and the individuals who have come on board are keen to see it further develop. Recognising that it is important that our organisation reflects the children it supports, we plan to increase diversity among our volunteers and Trustees in 2024, specifically targeting more women and ethnically diverse communities to support our mission and increase our impact.



### **Objectives and Activities**

City Kids Surfing works for the public benefit to advance the lives of young people living in urban locations in the United Kingdom through providing recreational and leisure activities in the interest of social welfare for young people who have a need by reason of their social and economic circumstances, with a view to improving the conditions of life of such persons, in particular by providing opportunities to go surfing.

Specifically City Kids Surfing works to raise children's awareness of ocean-related activities and concerns including:

- Improving their swimming ability
- Raising awareness of beach safety
- Raising awareness of coastal conservation issues
- Giving an understanding of the wider surfing industry
- To share the benefits of engaging with the ocean for an individual's physical, mental, social and environmental wellbeing.

### **Achievements and Performance**

2022 has been a year of further development for City Kids Surfing. We have continued to develop our partnerships with primary schools in London, corporate partners and other charitable relationships. It has been exciting to see our team of volunteers develop, and find new people to connect with and support the City Kids Surfing cause.

During the year we ran a wonderful programme crafted for two primary schools, working with some of their pupil premium children in year 5. This involved spending time with the staff and pupils in school, raising their awareness of both ocean conservation and coastal safety, as well as developing their understanding of holistic health – i.e. not just physical wellbeing.

Our programme culminated in a fantastic weekend in North Devon, experiencing time at the beach and gaining insight into the beauty and power of the ocean. During the weekend they all had the opportunity to learn to surf over a number of lessons. All of the children improved greatly, finding joy and challenge in the waves, pushing themselves out of their comfort zones within the safety of a great team around them.

As ever our programme included a focus on healthy eating – both eating healthily over the weekend, as well as inviting the children to play their own part in food preparation and learn new skills and meal ideas to take home with them. They made their own pizzas and their own burgers, growing in their knowledge of how to make healthy choices around food.

A growing part of the programme has also been on mindfulness and deliberate movement. We had great sessions helping the children be mindful of their thoughts, emotions and bodies, as well as giving the opportunity to take part together in a HIIT (high intensity interval training) session. This enabled them to think about how they challenge and support their bodies, and again gained skills and practices that they could take with them beyond the year's programme.

We have been excited in the later part of 2022 to be looking ahead to the future and planning towards 2023 with the opportunity to revamp our website and online presence. We look forward to this being completed and launched in early 2023.

It's exciting seeing how City Kids Surfing has grown this year, and the individuals who have come on board are keen to see it further develop. Watch this space!

City Kids Surfing works for the public benefit to advance the lives of young people living in urban locations in the United Kingdom through providing recreational and leisure activities in the interest of social welfare for young people who have a need by reason of their social and economic circumstances, with a view to improving the conditions of life of such persons, in particular by providing opportunities to go surfing.

Specifically City Kids Surfing works to raise children's awareness of ocean-related activities and concerns including:

- Improving their swimming ability
- Raising awareness of beach safety
- Raising awareness of coastal conservation issues
- Giving an understanding of the wider surfing industry
- To share the benefits of engaging with the ocean for an individual's physical, mental, social and environmental wellbeing.

### **Achievements and Performance**

Following the challenges of 2020, City Kids Surfing has done its best to navigate 2021 and the ebb and flow of coronavirus restrictions. With the early part of the year spent in lockdown, we worked hard to maintain our relationships and communication with the schools we have formed partnerships with – as well as with other corporate partners such as Finisterre.

As lockdown restrictions eased heading into the summer, there was the opportunity to run a slightly limited programme – still including elements such as sessions in school and the residential surfing trip. We worked with a school in Croydon developing a bespoke programme for some of their year 5 pupil premium students.

This led to a fantastic weekend in North Devon with some of the children having never been to the sea before. They were able to experience the beauty of the UK's coastal areas, and grow in confidence as they developed their own skills. This included a number of surf lessons, during which they improved dramatically, smiles beaming across their faces.

This year we have also been able to develop elements of the residential trip, including our food provision. This year we crafted a food menu allowing the children to learn new skills in the kitchen as well as at the beach. They both made their own burgers as well as their own pizzas over the weekend, as well as understanding how to make healthy choices for their lunches which they prepared themselves with the City Kids Surfing team's support.

Also included in the residential were sessions on both mindfulness and children-centred yoga, enabling the children to pick up skills for calming their minds and bodies, alongside the physical challenges of surfing.

It was also an exciting time as an organisation as Finisterre journeyed with us this year, documenting the trip both in video and photo format. We have been very grateful for this!

In the Autumn of 2021 City Kids Surfing was also invited to deliver a number of assemblies in local primary schools for 2021's *Green Week*, highlighting the need for blue spaces (seas, oceans, rivers, lakes, ponds etc) to be protected and enjoyed. We were also able to participate in a local primary school's *Green Week Fair* running a stall alongside other community organisations where we ran a surfing-based competition which enabled a significant amount of engagement with children, parents and the wider community.

It has been great to make the most of the opportunities afforded in 2021, and City Kids Surfing looks forward to the possibilities for developing again into 2022!
