Statement of Trustees' responsibilities:-

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. In preparing those financial statements the trustees are required to:-

- make judgements and estimates which are reasonable and prudent;
- state which accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice- Accounting by Charities; and
- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the concern will continue in operation.

The trustees are required to act within the framework of trust law and the Charities Acts, and are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records. The trustees have a general responsibility for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the assets of the funds and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.

Objectives and activities:

The objectives and activities of the organisation are to continue to support and house homeless and vulnerable people in Bridlington and the surrounding district through its partnership with Green Pastures. Green Pastures is a Christian Charity which provides the investment and expertise needed to provide that accommodation.

Trustees' Report continued

The two leased houses, which have been leased through Green Pastures on Thorpe Street and Havelock Street, Bridlington, have continued to be run efficiently during the year. However, major refurbishment was needed at Havelock Street when tenants left during the summer of 2024. Due to the main Housing Support Officer's ongoing health issues, he resigned from his position on 29th November 2024. The part-time Housing Support Office was offered and accepted the available 20 extra hours and commenced on 1st December as the sole Housing Support Office on 30 hours per week.

In support of the Housing Support Officers, the Trustees have meetings with them every two months, as well as Rev Richard Hare supporting them daily.

Reports are brought to the meetings which include a building report, report on achievements reached with the residents and the reporting of any on-going problems that they are encountering with the residents.

The Trustees of the Charity take their responsibilities seriously and all policies needed in relation to running a Charity of this type are in force. These include: -

The Trustees of the Charity are mainly made up of Clergy and Lay Ministers from the Churches in the Deanery of Bridlington. Through mission and outreach work in their parishes the Trustees are endeavouring to ease the situation of those sleeping rough on the streets of Bridlington and elsewhere and thereby ease the homelessness situation in the town.

Financial report

The accounts for the year to 5th April, 2025 show £9081 excess of receipts over payments.

The monthly income lost from one empty room per month amounts to between £783 and £823

Lost income from empty rooms has cost the Charity a total of £11,522 during the year. The loss of income from empty rooms seriously affects the Trustees' ability to improve the financial resources of the Charity and therefore impacts on the Charity's long-term financial resilience.

Trustees' report continued

Havelock Street had to have major and costly improvements. Much of the property was refurbished. Whilst the property was empty the charity was not in receipt of Housing Benefit. Green Pastures kindly agreed a lease payment suspension during this period for both properties for August and September. Subsequently, a debt of £5151 was accrued which is being paid off on a monthly basis and due to finish in October 2025. At the end of the financial year the debt owed was £2981.

Much of this cost, as well as helping towards the cost of the wages of the Housing Support Officers, has been met by grants and donations totalling £8414.

In addition to this, Churches in the Town of Bridlington, individual donations and regular giving by Direct Debit payments from individuals, amounts to £17803. Without this financial support the Charity could not continue. At the AGM in October 2024 the difficult financial situation was discussed. As a result the Charity was blessed with a number of four figure donations and an increase in the number of people giving donations on a monthly basis. Praise God.

The Trustees have also arranged fund raising events in the year and this has raised a further £3966. Other new initiatives are planned for fund raising throughout the forthcoming year.

There is much optimism for the success and future of the Charity. The Trustees do realise that this will continue be a challenge and can only be achieved by the continued support of Grants, financial giving, volunteers and prayer.

Reports are brought to the meetings which include a building report, report on achievements reached with the residents and the reporting of any on-going problems that they are encountering with the residents.

The Trustees of the Charity take their responsibilities seriously and all policies needed in relation to running a Charity of this type are in force. These include:-

- Grievance procedure
- Health and Safety policy

The Charity continues to face challenges with financial issues both with the upkeep of the two properties and also the difficulty in recruiting suitable residents. The monthly income lost from one empty room per month amounts to between £750

and £798.

Lost income from empty rooms has cost the Charity a total of £4,110 during the year. The loss of income from empty rooms seriously affects the Trustees ability to improve the financial resources of the Charity and therefore impacts on the Charity's long term financial resilience.

Independent Examiner's Report

I report on the accounts of the Hope Housing Bridlington charity for the year to 5 April 2023, which are set out on pages 4 to 7.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The Charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The Charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- (a) examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act 2011;
- (b) follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act 2011); and
- (c) state whether any particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. Review of the period

The organisation continues to support and house homeless and vulnerable people in Bridlington and the surrounding district through their partnership with Green Pastures, a Christian charity that provides the investment and expertise needed to provide that accommodation.

At the present time three male residents live at the first house, 7 Thorpe Street, Bridlington. They have been supported over the year by a Housing Support Officer who is paid by Hope Housing. Covid 19 and the lockdown affected many of the plans for the mentoring of the residents but as restrictions ease attention will be given to the progress of moving them into their own properties.

Green Pastures have completed the purchase of a second house, 6 Havelock Street, which is now occupied by another three male residents. All alterations have been completed in accordance with the regulations of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council for housing vulnerable adults.

The hours of the Housing Support Officer have been increased as he now looks after all six residents in the two houses.
