

The other main achievement has been the successful relocation of the Men's Shed workshops and social facilities following termination of our licence in September due to redevelopment, with only a short notice provided. Comparable self-contained facilities were secured but unavailable for occupation for 2 months, followed by a further period of creating a new layout, re-equipping and stocking up.

The main activity of Skipton Men's Shed has been the provision of workshop and communal lounge facilities for Men's Shed Members in the Skipton area.

During the year we ran sessions twice a week in 2 classrooms at a former primary school, giving us parking space and ramped access to the designated rooms.

We were commissioned to construct 60 bird boxes for the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust and their work with teenagers. We had support during the year from a local cabinet-making business which allowed members to increase their skills and confidence in woodwork.






