During the period, the trustees secured unrestricted income of £400 and had expenditure of £957. The deficit of £557 was met with prior year surplus and a total of £9,077 was held at the end of the period to further the aims of the charity by supporting projects aligned with its charitable aims and to meet liabilities.


