FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year the Charity received donations totalling £25,000 (2023: £31,085) representing part of a series of regular annual donation from The Newcombe Estates Company Limited, the amount of which depend on the Company's profitability.

The Newcombe Estates Company Limited is a private limited company in which the Trustees are all shareholders and Mr R.W. Newcombe and Mrs A.C. Houghton are directors.

The funds received in the year were added to cash reserves brought forward of £5,361 (2023: £2,176) and a total of £28,662 (2023: £27,900) was distributed by way of grants to charitable organisations providing educational, religious, health, social care; and humanitarian relief services at either a local, national or international level.

The Trustees provide their services without remuneration and no funds were spent on support costs in the year or in the previous year.

Reserves policy






