Spaniels4Life is a non-profit organisation run by a group of volunteer spaniel owners, based out of the UK and founded in July 2017. The objects of the Group are for the public benefit: (a) to relieve the suffering of unwanted, abused and neglected spaniels, by the provision of grants to any such charitable animal rescue organisation as the trustees consider appropriate. (b) to educate and raise public awareness about the welfare issues pertaining to spaniels and to make available advice and information by the provision of a website and in such other ways the trustees consider appropriate.

The main activities in Spaniels4Life for the FY2024-2025 period were online fundraising activities – a series of 13 separate consecutive fundraising events that provided grants to our 14 chosen beneficiaries in UK, USA, Australia and South Africa:

- Northern English Springer Spaniel Rescue
- South Yorkshire English Springer Spaniel Rescue
- Spaniel Aid
- Save Our Spaniels Rescue
- Springer Rescue for Scotland
- English Springer Spaniel Welfare
- Spaniel Rescue Foundation
- UK Spaniel Rescue
- Sprocker Assist & Rescue
- Florida Brittany Rescue
- Springer Spaniel Rescue, Inc.
- Cocker Spaniel Rescue Queensland Inc
- Cocker Spaniel Rescue Australia Inc
- Spaniel Welfare South Africa

In addition to raising funds online Spaniels4Life maintains a Facebook page which shares news of activities of beneficiaries, posts stories from its beneficiaries as part of its fundraising and maintains a website with details of the organisation.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Spaniels4Life is a non-profit organisation run by volunteers consisting of three Trustees and a small team of Admins. Membership of Spaniels4Life is open to anybody wishing to donate, participate or volunteer to help us achieve our goals. Our aim is to raise money for our beneficiaries to relieve the suffering of unwanted, abused and neglected spaniels. Our beneficiaries are carefully selected dog rescue organisations who are registered charities / 501c3 non-profit organisations in their respective countries with a focus on helping different breeds of spaniels. We support beneficiaries in the UK, USA, Australia and South Africa.

We raise awareness of the work our beneficiaries do by sharing stories of their work within our fundraising Facebook group and our dedicated Facebook page. Our beneficiaries also share our fundraisers with their own members on their Facebook pages with links to join our fundraising activities. Each beneficiary is allocated one or more slots during the year where we fundraise solely for them. This can be a week, 2 weeks, or a month. Sometimes we can be asked to fundraise for a particular dog who needs lifesaving treatment but mainly it is to help them with the day-to-day care of the dogs who they care for. We then have one or two extra special fundraisers during the year where all beneficiaries take part – July is our Birthday fundraiser and Christmas is our Paws Around the World fundraiser, where all beneficiaries receive a share of the total raised, and we sometimes run a special on New Year's Eve which is a 24-hour only fundraiser raffle with one beneficiary winning the raffle takings.

At the end of each fundraiser all money raised in that period is sent to the beneficiary we are supporting at that particular time. This means that our PayPal/Bank balance goes back to zero. Funds are raised through, raffles, games and auctions all completed online. Trustees, Admins and some of our members donate items for us to use as Raffle/Game prizes and auction items. All money raised goes directly to the beneficiaries.

We also have a prize account where Trustees and a few of our members donate money for us to use to buy prizes for future raffles or auction items.

FY24-25 was a successful year for Spaniels4Life – our sixth as a registered charity in England and Wales and the end of June 2025 marked the completion of our eighth anniversary operating as a fundraising group. FY24-25 showed a notable improvement on fundraising over FY23-24.

During the 12 months period of FY24-25 we raised the following amounts for each of our beneficiaries:

UK Spaniel Rescue (UKSR): £1,331.82; Spaniel Rescue Foundation (SRF): £918.41; Sprocker Assist and Rescue (SAR): £1,493.15; Springer Rescue for Scotland (SRS): £3,183.13; Northern English Springer Spaniel Rescue (NESSR): £2,262.75; South Yorkshire English Springer Spaniel Rescue (SYESSR): £3,553.51; Spaniel Aid (SA): £3,411.12; Save Our Spaniels Rescue (SOS): £352.72; English Springer Spaniel Welfare (ESSW): £352.72; Cocker Spaniel Rescue Queensland Inc (CSRQ): £352.72; Cocker Spaniel Rescue Australia Inc (CSRA): £2,835.55; Florida Brittany Rescue (FBR): £1855.38; Spaniel Welfare South Africa (SWSA): £918.41; Springer Spaniel Rescue Inc (SSRI): £1,287.60.

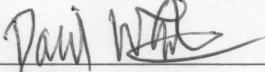

FY21-22 was a reasonably successful year for Spaniels4Life – our third as a registered charity in England and Wales and the end of June 2022 marked the completion of our fifth anniversary operating as a fundraising group. However, we did notice a significant decrease in fundraising for this period compared to FY20-21 – presumably due to effects of COVID-19 and the cost of living crisis.

During the 12 months period of FY21-22 we raised the following amounts for each of our beneficiaries: Northern English Springer Spaniel Rescue (NESSR): £4,103.59; South Yorkshire English Springer Spaniel Rescue (SYESSR): £3,580.20; Cocker Spaniel Rescue Australia Inc (CSRA): £3,324.59; Spaniel Welfare South Africa (SWSA): £3,072.32; Spaniel Aid UK (SAUK): £2,907.06; Save Our Spaniels Rescue (SOS): £2,620.91; Florida Brittany Rescue (FBR): £2,499.72; Springer Rescue for Scotland (SRS): £2,112.13; Brittany Rescue in Texas (BRIT): £1,390.73; Cocker Spaniel Rescue Queensland Inc (CSRQ): £1,267.89; Springer Spaniel Rescue Inc (SSRI): £364.52

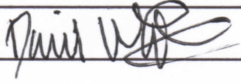

Spaniels4Life is a non-profit organisation run by a group of volunteer spaniel owners, based out of the UK and founded in July 2017. The objects of the Group are for the public benefit: (a) to relieve the suffering of unwanted, abused and neglected spaniels, by the provision of grants to any such charitable animal rescue organisation as the trustees consider appropriate. (b) to educate and raise public awareness about the welfare issues pertaining to spaniels and to make available advice and information by the provision of a website and in such other ways the trustees consider appropriate.

The main activities in Spaniels4Life for the FY2020-2021 period were online fundraising activities – a series of 24 separate consecutive fundraising events that provided grants to our 12 chosen beneficiaries in UK, USA, Australia and South Africa:

- Northern English Springer Spaniel Rescue
- South Yorkshire English Springer Spaniel Rescue
- Spaniel Aid UK
- Save Our Spaniels Rescue
- English Springer Spaniel Welfare
- Springer Rescue for Scotland
- Springer Spaniel Rescue Inc
- Brittany Rescue in Texas
- Florida Brittany Rescue
- Cocker Spaniel Rescue Queensland Inc
- Cocker Spaniel Rescue Australia Inc
- Spaniel Welfare South Africa

Each fundraiser clearly states who the beneficiary will be.

In addition to raising funds online Spaniels4Life maintains a Facebook page which shares news of activities of beneficiaries, posts stories from its beneficiaries as part of its fundraising and maintains a website with details of the organisation.

Spaniels4Life trustees have paid due regard to Charity Commission guidance on public benefit in order to decide on the fundraising and awareness activities the charity should undertake.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Spaniels4Life is a non-profit organisation run by volunteers consisting of three Trustees and a small team of Admins. Membership of Spaniels4Life is open to anybody wishing to donate, participate or volunteer to help us achieve our goals. Our aim is to raise money for our 12 beneficiaries to relieve the suffering of unwanted, abused and neglected spaniels. Our beneficiaries are carefully selected dog rescue organisations who are registered charities / 501c3 non-profit organisations in their respective countries with a focus on helping different breeds of spaniels. We support beneficiaries in the UK, USA, Australia and South Africa.

We raise awareness of the work our beneficiaries do by sharing stories of their work within our fundraising Facebook group and our dedicated Facebook page. Our beneficiaries also share our fundraisers with their own members on their Facebook pages with links to join our fundraising activities. Each beneficiary is allocated one or more slots during the year where we fundraise solely for them. This can be a week, 2 weeks, or a month. Sometimes we can be asked to fundraise for a particular dog who needs lifesaving treatment but mainly it is to help them with the day-to-day care of the dogs who they care for. We then have 2 extra special fundraisers during the year where all 12 beneficiaries take part. These are New Year's Eve which is a 24-hour only fundraiser raffle with one beneficiary winning the raffle takings and then the first 2 weeks in July is our Birthday fundraiser where all beneficiaries receive a share of the total raised.

At the end of each fundraiser all money raised in that period is sent to the beneficiary we are supporting at that particular time. This means that our PayPal/Bank balance goes back to zero. Funds are raised through, raffles, games and auction all completed online. Trustees, Admins and some of our members donate items for us to use as Raffle/Game prizes and auction items. All money raised goes directly to the beneficiary.

We also have a prize account where Trustees and a few of our members donate money for us to use to buy prizes for future raffles or auction items.

FY20-21 was a very successful year for Spaniels4Life – our second as a registered charity in England and Wales and the end of June 2021 marked the completion of our fourth anniversary operating as a fundraising group. Our fundraising has grown year on year over this period.

During the 12 months period of FY20-21 we raised the following amounts for each of our beneficiaries: Northern English Springer Spaniel Rescue (NESSR): £4,292.80; South Yorkshire English Springer Spaniel Rescue (SYESSR): £4,251.79; Spaniel Aid UK (SAUK): £1,871.30; Save Our Spaniels Rescue (SOS): £5,163.91; Springer Rescue for Scotland (SRS): £2,643.14; English Springer Spaniel Welfare (ESSW): £316.94; Springer Spaniel Rescue Inc (SSRI): £2,681.44; Brittany Rescue in Texas (BRIT): £1,245.99; Florida Brittany Rescue (FBR): £3,794.46; Cocker Spaniel Rescue Queensland Inc (CSRQ): £3,588.86; Spaniel Welfare South Africa (SWSA): £3,084.43; Cocker Spaniel Rescue Australia Inc (CSRA): £2,737.32

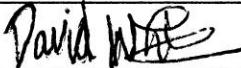
