Charity Activities and Achievements:

WWS UK's Trustees continue to be committed to its charitable aims complying with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

With the impact of Covid and global lockdown still being felt, activities remain limited. WWS UK has however assisted with the purchase of elephant friendly bins now positioned within the Bannerghatta National Park. In partnership with local teams who have been conducting anti-plastic drives to make the forests plastic free, it had been noted, post COVID, that some of the elephant thoroughfares within the park were subject to increased waste disposal by the commuters. The bins together with regular maintenance by the forest ground staff, have resulted in considerable reduction of random waste on the elephant trails.
