This allows the charity to make grants as appropriate to Maher to support its work. Public interest in Maher's work is actively promoted by means of printed material, talks to outside groups, displays and presence at events such as craft fairs.

The Board of Trustees, consisting of the elected and appointed Trustees, reviews the Charity's activities, monitors performance and agrees donations. Procedures are continually being developed and/or reviewed in regard to these matters, which are particularly useful both for existing Trustees and for new Trustee inductions.

The main risks faced by the Charity are the security of donations received and being made, and security of stock for resale. Procedures are being developed and/or reviewed in regard to these.

## Section C Objectives and activities

### Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The relief of poverty, sickness and distress amongst people living in Maharashtra State in India, in particular but not exclusively, by the provision of funds to alleviate the need.

The advancement of the education of women and children, in particular but not exclusively, by providing and assisting in the provision of facilities for education at Maher Women's Refuge Centre in Maharashtra State in India.

**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)**

Donations have been received from members and supporters and through fundraising activities enabling the Charity to make grants to Maher in Pune, Maharashtra, India to support its work in the following areas, in pursuance of our charitable objects.

The Charity has once again been able to encourage public interest in Maher's work through active promotion and the dissemination of information at 16 Craft Fairs and one Talk. Sales of goods at such events generated additional income and donations for the Charity. In this way we have been able to further both our charitable objects.

During 2024 the Charity has been able to send 4 quarterly donations to Maher totalling £17,750. This included the final 2023 quarterly donation of £1,750, but not the final 2024 donation of £8,000 which was sent in January 2025.

During the year we have continued to support financially the second group of ladies training as nurses, to the tune of £5,400 over the year for this group of five. £5,124 in support was given to Maher for various maintenance projects, both large and small, and this included much-needed repairs to Maher's ambulance.

We were advised that Maher's COVID-19 Relief Work still continues for certain vulnerable groups of people. While this is now mainly supported by another major sponsor, it was agreed to continue our support, and FOM (UK) was able to send a further £695 during 2024.

The Trustees confirm that, at all times, they have had regard to the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission. To ensure continued compliance each trustee is required to read the current Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

The Trustees now generally make grants to smaller projects run by Maher, where a relatively small amount of money 'goes a long way' with immediately visible results, rather than have the donations swallowed up by a large on-going project.

All Trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no remuneration or other benefits. The Trustees may claim reimbursement of expenses incurred in undertaking their duties, eg travel costs in attending Trustees Board meetings.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

Activities in pursuance of our charitable objects are achieved by:

1. Promoting awareness of the work of Maher by means of printed material, talks and displays, and presence at events.
2. Generation of funds to support the work at Maher through appeals, organised events and other individual fundraising efforts.

Promoting awareness of Maher's work is normally achieved by distributing information leaflets and engaging members of the public in conversation. We continue to make use of our online social media, such as Facebook, as an alternative avenue. Towards the end of the year work was begun on a new FOM (UK) website,

Once again we have held 3 of our 4 Trustees Meetings and our AGM as online sessions using Zoom. At the other face-to-face meeting we were fortunate to host our Patron, Sr Lucy Kurien, who was visiting the UK on a Speaking Tour. She gave some valuable input to our discussions, both at the meeting and the business lunch afterwards.

As a result of Sr Lucy's speaking tour we received a large number of donations, mostly from new supporters, and a few new memberships as an added bonus. £5,000 of this was used to support Maher's Loni home in Karnataka.

In addition the Trustees had a very successful Training Day in February. Additional training was given to maintain and improve our governance of the Charity, and to enhance further good practice.

Proceeds from the sale of Indian Goods at Craft Fairs and Talks add a tremendous boost to the donations we have been able to send. Many of the items we sell are made by ladies in Maher's Training Facility, under Maher's Project Parishram training programme. These ladies receive payment for the goods we buy, thus helping them individually, then the proceeds from our selling these items in the UK goes back to help Maher in other ways.

In early June we teamed up with Helen Hitchcock, long-time friend and supporter of Maher, who was planning a Car Rally in India in February 2025. The monies raised will be divided between two UK charities, including FOM (UK). An account was set up with GivenGain in order for us to accept donations. This raised £1,025 to the year end, with expectations of much more during 2025. An added bonus is that we have this account to run out own promotions and appeals.

The purchase of the land in Bihar, reported last year, was successful and work has started on this new home.

## Section E Financial review

The Charity aims to hold in reserve no more than is necessary to meet budgeted expenditure which relates mainly to insurance, postage, stationery and printing materials. The Trustees keep this under regular review.

The principal source of funds has been voluntary donations from supporters and members of the Charity. This is backed up by occasional appeals for funds, such as that in 2020 to support Maher's Covid-19 Relief Work and the land purchase for a new home in 2023.

Income from sales of Indian goods at events has continued throughout 2024, plus one talk to an outside group about the work carried out at Maher, and the role of FOM (UK) in supporting this. Income has been received from these in the form of sales of Indian goods and donations.

The Charity has no investments.



## Section F Other optional information

## Notes on the Accounts for the period

### 1 Receipts & Payments Accounts:

Receipts and Payments Accounts are statements that summarise the movement of cash into and out of the charity during the financial year. In this context "cash" includes cash equivalents, for example, our bank account where cash can readily be withdrawn to pay for debts as they become due.

### 2 Restricted Funds:

Restricted Funds reflect money donated to Friends of Maher (UK) for a specific purpose - the Trustees must respect this intention.

### 3 Unrestricted Funds:

Unrestricted Funds reflect money donated to Friends of Maher (UK) with no specified purpose - the Trustees are able to use such funds to make such donations as deemed appropriate by the Trustees, for public benefit and to achieve the Charity's Objects.

### 4 Receipts:

#### Unrestricted Donations - £19,361

£3,600 - Donations by regular monthly standing order from two of our members.

£12,500 - Large Donations from 4 UK supporters of Maher, all between £1,000 and £5,000 - from Sr Lucy's Speaking Tour

£3,261 - Other miscellaneous donations, all between £5 and £200, many from Sr Lucy's Speaking Tour

#### Restricted Donations - £4,981

£3,751 - Donations received from a Car Rally organised by Maher Supporter, to support a new home in Andhra Pradesh

£240 - Donations received following our appeal to members for funding for Maher's ongoing Covid-Relief Work.

£600 - Donations received following our appeal to members for funding for Maher's Nursing Training Programme.

£390 - Other miscellaneous donations for Child Sponsorship and Maher's Christmas Expenses

#### Fundraising Activities - £3,554

£3,482 - from sales of goods at Craft Fairs and similar events held in 2024.

£71 - from talks given to outside groups by members of FOM (UK) during 2024.

£5,400 - sent to Maher during 2024 to support Maher's Nursing Training Programme.

£5,135 - for maintenance projects, including vehicle repairs for Maher's ambulance

£695 - raised by fundraising appeal to support Maher's continuing Covid-Relief Work.

£365 - to provide Sponsorship for one child for one year.

Goods bought in India and shipped to the UK for resale at our Craft Fairs.

#### Charity Administration Expenses - £357

£221 - for Insurance Premiums with Zurich, our new insurers.

£120 - for bank charges for international bank transfers of donations sent to India.

£11 - for other miscellaneous administrative overheads.

#### Other Payments - £1,707

£1,188 - Craft Fair booking fees and stall rentals for 2024/25

£213 - training and other expenses for Trustees Away Day.

£153 - for lunchtime Trustees Meeting with Sr. Lucy Kurien

£125 - purchase of Craft Fair display and consumable items.

£28 - Other miscellaneous purchases.
