BWD Chairman's Statement 2023/4

For Bourne Water Dragons, the year to end March 2024 was encouraging and eventful. Encouraging because we increased our membership by 50% to 42 over the year, and also encouraged by the level of support from local businesses and charities which enabled us to acquire our own smaller dragon boat to replace the one we had on loan. Eventful because this was the first year that “climate change” impacted on club activities. In the 18 months to March 2024 rainfall was the highest ever recorded since records began in 1836 with the early months of 2024 proving exceptional and rendering our local River Stour unsafe for paddling on most days. Our competitive events in 2023 started with a first ever entry at the Sherborne County Fair on Spring Bank holiday at the end of May, when the weather was sunny and windy.

Our 16 paddler team acquitted themselves well finishing half way down a leaderboard of over 20 teams and we vowed to come back the following year and do better still. In June we started a recruitment drive to attract new members. A table of literature, trophies and paddles was used by members to broaden awareness of BWD and attract interest. Venues that we attended, included David Lloyd, Littledown and Haskins Garden Centre. In the summer we also took delivery of our new 30 foot 10 man dragon boat which had been bought using a

very generous donation from Haskins Garden Centre. We prepared for an official launching and the traditional and requisite “dotting of the Dragon’s eye” ceremony. This dramatic and colourful event was well attended and took place in August, when our boat “Coleman’s Dragon Fly” decked out in BWD colours was formally launched. Early September and we were competing for the third year at the Cookham Regatta on the river Thames and after tough, very close heats we made the final. We were then beaten by a very small margin and found it touching when the young fit winning team gave a Cancer Survivor team a standing ovation when we left the jetty. After serious discussion we put in a November entry for the well-established Henley Winter Series. Rather than a sprint this would be a lung-busting 7 kilometre time trial. Nevertheless, we were very disappointed when the aforementioned rainfall levels led to a cancellation and a subsequent postponement to March which also resulted in a similar level of flooding and cancellation again.

In May 2024 Bourne Water Dragons will be 5 years old. We are the result of the vision and belief held initially by Mary Milne that a club such as ours can offer physical and mental well-being to those who have been affected by cancer. We have a significant role which we hope will continue to grow.

Bourne Water Dragons Annual Report 2023

The year ending March 2023 for Bourne Water Dragons proved to be eventful, active and financially successful. The key issue facing us, as well as most Dragon Boat Clubs, is the stabilisation and growth of membership numbers. Our belief that our club can help and improve the life of Cancer survivors is an important message that must be constantly re iterated and spread..

It is clear to all our members that Cancer survivors who wish to remain active have a growing number of options available to them from walking groups to paddle boarding, the latter appears to be increasing exponentially on our river and harbour. The Trustees are fully aware of the challenge of new membership and this issue and marketing initiatives feature consistently on our Trustee meeting agendas.

In May 2022 BWD was privileged to welcome the Mayor of Bournemouth and his official entourage to a beautiful morning, paddling in bright sunshine. An event which was surprisingly reciprocated by an invitation to evening buffet, refreshments and a guided tour of Bournemouth Town Hall.

Interestingly, the much needed pontoon at our base, shared with the Sea Cadets was completed in July 2022. Over half the cost was funded by the BCP Community fund and the Living Legacy Fund and the balance by the Sea Cadets and BWD.

In August 2022 we had the privilege and pleasure of a day paddling with a full boat on the beautiful Beaulieu river at Bucklers Hard, organised by our long standing and much valued BDA coach Tim Smith. The weather was overcast, mild and breezy and was a wonderful experience for all.

In early September we sent a team to compete in the 10 paddler boat Cookham Regatta. We were once again competitive and beaten by a very narrow margin in the Plate final. In mid September we had a sombre and

respectful paddle down the river Stour honouring our Queen who died on September 8 th. and a week later our last mid week evening twilight paddle with head torches.

In early January we took delivery of our own 9 metre (10 paddlers) dragon boat replacing the one on loan from the BDA.This was funded by the the very generous donation from Haskins Garden Centre and secured by Hilary Coleman.By acquiring a nearly new boat at a substantial discount and with the agreement of Haskins we released a significant cash sum for equipment spending .In addition we received a significant donation from " Going for Bust" and also a large sum from a very successful coffee morning organised by Christine Bailey and Hilary Coleman.

Dragon boat paddling was offered to Members on a twice weekly basis subject to weather conditions and public awareness of this facility was increased by frequent and regular local media coverage as well as the main boat making the public aware of who we were through the distinctive boat livery. We took a prominent riverside position on major national events including Armistice Sunday.

We continued to support the initiative of the British Dragon Boat Association to develop an All Cancer survivor Dragon Boat initiative nationally.

The Charity played a key part in the March 2022 symposium "Creating Harmony in the Community" delivering a talk on the importance of offering a new horizon of hope and fitness for cancer survivors which generated considerable interest including encouraging the Mayor of Bournemouth and his team to come paddling with us to increase their awareness of what we could offer..

At every stage the Trustees of BWD are fully cognisant and diligently compliant with the guidance given by the Charity commission on acting for the public benefit

Covid restrictions were not fully lifted until the late summer of 2021 and therefore we were limited in the active part of our calendar, but were able to field a very competitive Dragon Boat team in early September to compete in the Cookham Regatta. A fund raising initiative was successful enough to enable us to purchase high tech Carbon paddles and we were also able to secure a long term loan of a second smaller boat which enabled paddling even if numbers were limited on a specific day. Towards the end of our financial year we were invited by Bournemouth University to speak and host a stand at their Harmony in the Community initiative.

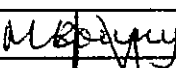

Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	The preservation and protection of good health among people living with or affected by cancer and their supporters for the public benefit in particular by: a) the provision of facilities for exercise and physical activity, in particular dragon boating and other water sports capable of promoting physical health and fitness. b) providing information through seminars, workshops and talks to raise awareness of and promote the benefits of physical activity and a healthy lifestyle for cancer survivors; c) supporting and undertaking research into the benefits of dragon boating for those affected by cancer and publishing the useful results for the public benefit; d) supporting the development of other cancer survivor dragon boating teams locally, nationally, and internationally.
Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.	During the year paddling was suspended because of COVID 19. Members were given the opportunity to take part in paddle boarding, canoeing, organised walks - in line with government guidance in relation to COVID - and to maintain contact via zoom meetings. A project to create an ACs (All Cancers Survivor) category within the British Dragon Boat Association was initiated by a BWD member and supported by the trustees. Preliminary discussions took place with Bournemouth University to development mutually beneficial links between the two institutions where students would be given the opportunity to train and volunteer as helms and coaches. One trustee took up a position as BWD representative within a community project where the overarching aim is to promote the health and wellbeing of the community through a variety of projects. BWD also became members of CAN (Community Action Network).
