Achievements against objectives set	Para 1.41	24 clients have reported improvement in mental health. 2 from last year and 2 clients from this period clients have self referred back to the service and continue to do so as a means of ongoing support. There is still a need to find a way other than 'no news is good news' evaluative tool however this has been investigated and other similar charities for example Samaritans, SWAST and Mosac have also reported similar issues.
Performance of fundraising activities against objectives set	Para 1.41	Coming to the end of the pandemic has seen a resumption in trying to sort out the bank account although this is beset by issues of time in getting to an actual bank with all trustees present to change account.
