Introduction

During 2020 we faced a dramatic change in how we work. Instead of physical meetings in venues most of our events were held on Zoom and other similar online platforms. This is primarily in response to the Covid 19 pandemic. The result of having wider coverage and reaching out to more people worldwide.

We helped in our local community to support families in distress and in need of assistance and support either for food, help with picking up of medication, shopping especially those who are shielded. We supported over 100 families with food stuff in collaboration with the foodbanks and the local supermarkets (Aldi/M&S and Sainsbury's)

Through live streaming events on Facebook we have been able to connect to several Christians and families who benefited from our ministry. We reached families in need of prayers, financial support and health and wellbeing especially due to the covid 19 lock down restrictions. Our expenditure also increased as we had to spend more funds on the event's social media advertisements, offering to guest Ministers as well as torelief financial hardship and distress of individuals and families in need in the UK and anywhere in the world especially during the Pandemic.

We had over 12 major event/conferences online with invited guest and music ministers from all over the world. We spent £900 to such guest ministers in 2020

During this year we spent £700 in donations and financial support to several needy families locally in the in UK and internationally in Italy, South Africa, Uganda, Nigeria, Serriellone, Liberia, Pakistan and India.

We spent £286 to Belinda Spanneberg in Global Awakening as part of the tuition fee for a Leadership Program between July 1st 2020 to December 2020 with the Deborah Arise Leadership Program which was an online Program for growth and development and to better equip us for Ministry.

We paid for Web hosting for 2020 £110 and Zoom subscription monthly.

We spent £116 on Facebook advertising, and £250 on production of events invites and banners.

We planned to go on Mission to Uganda and Nigeria in April 2020 but due to Covid 19 we were unable to travel and all international mission trips postponed till further notice.
