1. Aim and purposes

Warriors of Praise International Church ("the Church") was registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 4th June 2019 with two aims;

- firstly, to advance the Christian religion for the benefit of the public through the holding of prayer meetings and lectures, public celebration of religious festivals, producing and/or distributing literature on the Christian religion to enlighten others about the Christian religion, and the broadcasting of messages of an evangelistic and teaching nature and
- Secondly, to provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

2. Objectives and Activities

In 2024, the Trustees focused on consolidating the momentum gained in the previous year by reinforcing the spiritual, operational, and outreach pillars of the church. A key priority was the re-establishment and consistent running of core weekly activities, including:

Prayer Meetings: Revived to strengthen spiritual discipline and unity within the congregation.

Sunday Services: Continued to serve as the central gathering for worship, teaching, and fellowship.

Drum Beat Children's Program: Expanded to nurture musical talent among children and youth, while also addressing social challenges such as idleness, stress, and substance abuse.

Choir Practice: Regular sessions enhanced worship quality and encouraged active participation from musically gifted members.

Community Outreach: Activities such as the gospel show and participation in the Broadfield Art Festival helped extend the church's presence and message beyond its walls.

These initiatives were not only successful in engaging members but also in attracting new participants from Crawley, London, and surrounding areas. The gospel show, in particular, was a landmark event, drawing large crowds and showcasing the vibrancy of the church's music ministry.

To support this growth, the Trustees undertook a comprehensive review and overhaul of the church's policies and procedures. This included:

- Strengthening governance structures to ensure accountability and sustainability.
- Recruiting additional Trustees with the time, commitment, and spiritual maturity to guide the church forward.
- Enhancing coordination across departments to ensure smooth execution of events and programs.

The Trustees remain committed to upholding the church's vision and mission, ensuring that every activity—from children's programs to evangelistic outreach—serves the greater purpose of spreading the Gospel and building a Christ-centered community.

3. Pastoral Care

Pastoral care during 2024 continued to be led by Pr. Frank with support from Church Trustees and volunteers.

4. Achievements and Performance

In alignment with our church's vision and mission, we have successfully hosted a variety of activities designed to bring people to Christ and foster community engagement.

- **Youth Empowerment through Drumbeats Program**

Our Drumbeats program has been instrumental in nurturing young children, teaching them to play instruments such as the keyboard, piano, and drums. This initiative has not only developed musical talent but also played a vital role in combating idleness, stress, and drug use among the youth.

- **Special Events and Departmental Services**

Throughout the year, we organized special events as part of our ongoing commitment to the Great Commission. These included men's, youth, and women's services, where various departments led church activities and showcased their unique contributions. The enthusiasm and dedication displayed during these services were truly inspiring.

- **Gospel Show and Community Outreach**

A highlight of our outreach was the gospel show, which attracted a large crowd from Crawley and London. Ministers from different backgrounds participated, blessing the congregation with uplifting melodies and joyous songs. The atmosphere was electric as members took turns to share their musical gifts.

- **Community Engagement at Broadfield Art Festival**

Our Drumbeats team also performed at the Broadfield Art Festival, marking a remarkable moment in our evangelism and community-building efforts. This event further strengthened our ties with the local community and showcased the talents nurtured within our church.

5. Safeguarding

Safeguarding remains a key concern in all activities, and the Church continues to take guidance and support from Thirtyone:eight (formerly Churches' Child Protection & Advisory Service).

6. Public Benefit

Trustees continue to have due regard for the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission and within the scope of the Church's stated objectives, they endeavor to comply fully therewith.

7. Governance

Matters of Church doctrine and ministry are the direct responsibility of the Senior Pastor, working with the Trustees.

The Church is registered with the Charity Commission under its Association Model form of constitution for a CIO. The constitution requires a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 12 eligible trustees who have the power to admit or expel members.

8. Financial Review

Total receipts for the full year ended 31st December 2024 amounted to £5223 (2023: £2,860). There was no grant income and receipts during the period were made up almost entirely from tithes, donations and cash collections. There were no restricted donations or endowments, and all receipts were therefore unrestricted funds.

Total expenditure for the full year to 31st December 2024 amounted to £2940 (2023: £3,017), of which £2930 (2023: £2,657) was for the hire of premises to conduct public worship services. There was no expenditure on capital equipment during the year.

The net cash balance at 31st December 2024 was £11931 (2023: £9,685).

9. Reserves policy

It is the Church's policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds (if possible), equivalent to at least six months' unrestricted payments for planned regular activities. The main purpose of this reserve is to cover unforeseen or emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The Trustees consider that the balance of £11931 held as unrestricted funds at the year-end is more than sufficient to meet this requirement.

10. Financial Controls

The Church endeavors to maintain strict financial controls and has adopted the following policies.

Church Expenditure: All Church income & expenditure is strictly accounted for.
No single Trustee, Pastor or Member can make a financial commitment on behalf of or in the name of the Church. All payments and other financial commitments require the approval of at least two Trustees.

Offerings, tithes & other income: The full amount of money collected or received on behalf of the Church is required to be paid or transferred as soon as possible into the Church Bank account.

Where appropriate the following information is recorded.

- the name of the donor/payor,
- the full amount received,
- any restrictions or instructions attached to donations (e.g. for support of a particular project, the purchase of a piece of equipment or for use in a specified area of the Church's work). Any money received without notified restrictions is used solely to support the mission of the Church.

All donors/payors are requested to make cheques payable to "Warriors of Praise International Church" or encouraged to make payments by direct transfer to the Church bank account

Cash donations should be placed in the collection basket at Church Services.

Where reasonably practical, all Church officers are asked to avoid personally accepting cash payments intended for the Church or for Church activities.


Employees: All Church functions and activities are carried out on a voluntary basis and the Church has no paid employees.

Trustee Payments: No trustees receive any remuneration, payments or benefits from the charity.

Trading: The Church does not have any trading subsidiaries.

secondly, to provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

Objectives and Activities

The Trustees' main objective in 2023 has been to consolidate the previous year's efforts to re-establish prayer meetings, Sunday services and other activities that had suffered during the COVID pandemic.

Work continued on overhauling policies and procedures necessary to support the Church's activities, including identification and recruitment of additional trustees with the commitment and time available to guide the Church going forward.

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care during 2023 continued to be led by Pr. Frank with support from Church Trustees and volunteers.

Achievements and Performance

Whilst some members of the regular Church congregation moved on to different areas during 2023, there has been a number of new attendees, including young people willing to play musical instruments and participate in ministry. Several longer term members of the Church congregation have shown interest in taking up leadership roles and there has been continued involvement and close collaboration with other groups within the Crawley community.

During the early part of 2022 and following completion of a wide-ranging training program attended by Trustees, Pastors and volunteers, plans were developed to refine the Church's Vision and Mission Statements. Throughout 2023 the Statements continued to provide a clear focus on where and how best the Church's available resources may be directed.






firstly, to advance the Christian religion for the benefit of the public through the holding of prayer meetings and lectures, public celebration of religious festivals, producing and/or distributing literature on the Christian religion to enlighten others about the Christian religion, and the broadcasting of messages of an evangelistic and teaching nature and

secondly, to provide or assisting in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

Objectives and Activities

The Church's objective in 2022 was to re-establish prayer meetings, Sunday services and other activities that had been seriously disrupted and curtailed during the Covid pandemic.

Regular Sunday gatherings for worship had been resumed at Broadfield in Crawley during 2021 but restoring outreach activities, as well as our program to overhaul associated policies and procedures proved a much greater challenge during 2022 than expected.

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care during 2022 continued to be led by Pr. Frank with support from Church Trustees and volunteers.

Achievements and Performance

During the early part of 2022 and following completion of a wide-ranging training program attended by Trustees, Pastors and volunteers, plans were developed to refine the Church's Vision and Mission Statements. These Statements now provide a much clearer focus on where and how best we can direct available resources.

Safeguarding

The Church is a subscriber to Thirtyone:eight (formerly Churches' Child Protection & Advisory Service).

Public Benefit

Trustees continue to have due regard for the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission and within the scope of the Church's stated objectives, they endeavour to comply fully therewith.

Governance

Matters of Church doctrine and ministry are the direct responsibility of the Senior Pastor, working with the Trustees.

It is the Church's policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds (if possible), equivalent to at least six months unrestricted payments for planned regular activities. The main purpose of this reserve is to cover unforeseen or emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The Trustees consider that the balance of £9,842 held as unrestricted funds at the year-end is more than sufficient to meet this requirement.

Financial Controls

Aim and purposes

Warriors of Praise International Church (the Church) was registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 4th June 2019 with two aims;

firstly, to advance the Christian religion for the benefit of the public through the holding of prayer meetings and lectures, public celebration of religious festivals, producing and/or distributing literature on the Christian religion to enlighten others about the Christian religion, and the broadcasting of messages of an evangelistic and teaching nature and

secondly, to provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

Objectives and Activities

The Church's immediate objective in 2019 was (a) to regularise and sustain prayer meetings, Sunday services and weekly youth groups that had previously been established under the same name at Crawley in West Sussex and (b) to develop outreach and evangelical activities both nationally and internationally. By the start of Covid restrictions in April 2020 most of these objectives had either been realised or were in the early stages of development.

Many established functions were suspended during the Covid period but regular Sunday gatherings for worship were successfully resumed at Broadfield during 2021. Trustees and the Senior Pastor were also able to resume earlier work to improve policies and procedures for Church governance and compliance with best practice. Areas receiving priority attention in this regard included Gospel ministry, safeguarding, data protection and financial accountability, although some of this work has been hampered by the slow return to normal working of certain Government Bodies and other external agencies.

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care continues to be led by Pr. Frank with active support from the Church Trustees and volunteers who sought to maintain regular contact with members of the congregation throughout the year.

Achievements and Performance

In addition to restarting regular worship services at Broadfield, the Church used the latter part of 2021 to prepare for the resumption of other activities in 2022.

Safeguarding

The Church is a subscriber to Thirtyone:eight (formerly Churches' Child Protection & Advisory Service).

Public Benefit

The Trustees continue to have due regard for guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission and within the constraints and ongoing effects of Covid 19 restrictions, they endeavour to comply fully therewith.

Governance

Matters of Church doctrine and ministry are the direct responsibility of the Senior Pastor, working with the Trustees.

The Trustees meet regularly together and also with the Senior Pastor to oversee and direct the activities of the Church. Work to facilitate greater delegation of is continuing.

The Church is registered with the Charity Commission under its Association Model form of constitution for a CIO. The constitution requires a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 12 eligible trustees who have the power to admit or expel members. One third of Trustees retire by rotation at each AGM and may be reappointed or replaced by a majority vote of members.

Financial Review

Total receipts for the full year ended 31st December 2021 amounted to £6,915. There was no grant income and receipts during the period were made up almost entirely from tithes, donations and cash collections. There were no restricted donations or endowments and all receipts were therefore unrestricted funds.

Total expenditure for the full year to 31st December 2021 amounted to £3,060 of which £1,721 was for the hiring of premises. Capital expenditure on equipment during the year was £51.

The net cash balance at 31st December 2021 was £9,947 (2020: £6,092).

Reserves policy

It is the Church's policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds (if possible), equivalent to at least six months unrestricted payments for planned regular activities. The main purpose of this reserve is to cover unforeseen or emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The Trustees consider that the balance of £9,947 held as unrestricted funds at the year-end is more than sufficient to meet this requirement.

Financial Controls

The Church endeavours to maintain strict financial controls and has adopted the following policies.

Church

Expenditure:

All Church income & expenditure is strictly accounted for.

No single Trustee, Pastor or Member is able to make a financial commitment on behalf of or in the name of the Church. All payments and other financial commitments require the approval of at least two Trustees.

Offerings, tithes & other income: The full amount of all money collected or received on behalf of the Church is required to be paid or transferred as soon as possible into the Church Bank account.

Where appropriate the following information is recorded.



Aim and purposes

Warriors of Praise International Church (the Church) was registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 4th June 2019 with two aims;

firstly, to advance the Christian religion for the benefit of the public through the holding of prayer meetings and lectures, public celebration of religious festivals, producing and/or distributing literature on the Christian religion to enlighten others about the Christian religion, and the broadcasting of messages of an evangelistic and teaching nature and

secondly, to provide or assisting in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

Objectives and Activities

The Church's immediate objective in 2019 was (a) to regularise and sustain prayer meetings, Sunday services and weekly youth groups that had previously been established under the same name at Crawley in West Sussex and (b) to develop outreach and evangelical activities both nationally and internationally. By the start of 2020 most of these objectives had either been realised or were in the early stages of development.

Initial work by Trustees and Pastors to improve policies and procedures for Church governance and compliance with best practice in areas such as Gospel ministry, safeguarding, data protection and financial accountability continued during the early part of 2020. However, the impact of Covid 19 regulations on all areas of Church activity was considerable and from March 2020 many regular functions had to be suspended until April 2021 when legal restrictions began to ease. Trustees and Pastors, together with several Church members were able to use some of 2020 for training and strategic planning but progress towards the Church's stated objectives was severely handicapped.

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care is led by Pr. Frank with active support from the Church Trustees and volunteers who maintain regular contact with members of the congregation and respond to various individual needs as they arise.

Achievements and Performance

The regular local activities of the Church are based at Broadfield Youth & Community Centre in Crawley where, except for the period of Covid 19 restrictions, services have been held every Sunday.

The Church is a subscriber to Thirtyone:eight (formerly Churches' Child Protection & Advisory Service).

Public Benefit

The Trustees remain mindful of their duty to have due regard for the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission and within the constraints of Covid 19 restrictions have endeavoured to comply fully therewith.

Governance

Matters of Church doctrine and ministry are the direct responsibility of the Senior Pastor, working with the Trustees.

The Trustees meet regularly together and also with the Senior Pastor to oversee and direct the activities of the Church. Pre Covid work to facilitate greater delegation of tasks to appointed committees or suitable members of the Congregation was resumed towards the end of 2020 and it is now hoped this will be largely implemented during 2021.

The Church is registered with the Charity Commission under its Association Model form of constitution for a CIO. The constitution requires a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 12 eligible trustees who have the power to admit or expel members. One third of Trustees retire by rotation at each AGM and may be reappointed or replaced by a majority vote of members.

Financial Review

Total receipts for the full year ended 31st December 2020 amounted to £3,810. There was no grant income and receipts during the period were made up almost entirely from tithes, donations and cash collections. There were no restricted donations or endowments and all receipts were therefore unrestricted funds.

Total expenditure for the full year to 31st December 2020 amounted to £2,458 of which £1,018 was for the hiring of premises. There was no expenditure on capital equipment during the year.

The net cash balance at 31st December 2020 was £6,092 (2019: £4,740).

Reserves policy

It is the Church's policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds (if possible), equivalent to at least six months unrestricted payments for planned regular activities. The main purpose of this reserve is to cover unforeseen or emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The Trustees consider that the balance of £6,092 held as unrestricted funds at the year-end is more than sufficient to meet this requirement.


