### **OUR OBJECTIVES**

Our objectives align closely with our aims. Ensuring the maintenance and enhancement of the BB standard is paramount to us. In formulating our objectives and organising our activities for the year, our Trustees have meticulously considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. Nonetheless, these objectives are formulated within the framework of the broader goals we have set for the Charity.

The Trustees of the Benevolent Bonds present their annual report and accounts for the year ended 30th April 2024 and confirm they comply with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 and the Charities SORP (FRS 102).

### **REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES**

#### **Chairman BB Activities**

The Chairman of BB made three visits to Senegal to personally evaluate the progress of BB's ongoing projects. Additionally, he held several phone and Zoom meetings with the Chairman of HF Senegal to discuss various administrative issues.

#### **FACE-Elementary School Tambacounda (FACE-EST)**

In support of our goal of "Education for All," BB made a generous donation of £7,612 in 2023-24. This contribution enabled the painting of four classrooms at FACE-EST, as well as the office space and preparing the football ground. Additionally, the donation helped cover the school's operational costs.

#### **FACE Vocational Sewing School**

The school is currently in negotiations with a local charity for a

franchised partnership to expand access to sewing facilities at a vocational institute. This collaboration is expected to benefit more students, particularly with the transfer of sewing machines to the new location.

### **OUR FINANCES**

The financial statement for the fiscal year 2023-24 shows a cash balance of £580 in the bank. Net incoming resources totaled £7,839, while expenses amounted to £8,076. These funds were raised through donations and charitable activities, with the following breakdown:

- Donations received via bank transfer: £7,839

All funds raised during the year were used for painting the school, constructing the football ground, and supporting the school's operating costs, after covering mandatory expenses.

The school's operating costs for the year amounted to £4,521. The cost of painting the classrooms, exterior, and developing the grounds was £3,091.

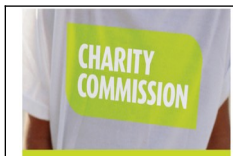

**FACE-Elementary School Tambacounda (FACE-EST) Construction**

BB continued the construction of the FACE-EST building in pursuit of our goal, "Education for All," with a donation of £6,113 in 2022-23. Plastering and flooring were finalised for four classrooms and the office space.

**FACE Vocational Sewing School**

The school is in negotiations for a franchised venture with a local charity to expand the availability of sewing facilities to a vocational

institute. There is hope that more students will benefit from this arrangement, especially with the transfer of sewing machines to the new location.

### **OUR FINANCES**

The financial statement for the fiscal year 2022-23 reveals a surplus of £942 in BB activities. Net incoming resources amounted to £8,498, while expenses totaled £7,556. These funds were generated through donations and charitable activities, with a breakdown as follows:

- Donations received via JustGiving: £1,020
- Donations received via bank transfer: £7,478

All funds raised during the year were allocated to the construction of the school after fulfilling mandatory expenses.

### **Development and Maintenance**

The primary development project accomplished was the plastering and flooring of the infrastructure, for the first phase of four classrooms at FACE Elementary School in Tambacounda, Senegal.

Naeem Ahmad Sadiq, chairman of the charity, visited Senegal to establish a working relationship with Humanity First Senegal and saw all the potential project sites.

A virtual meeting was held with Mr Nasir Ahmad Siddhu, Chairman Humanity First Senegal, on 10th January 2019. A detailed working plan was discussed and agreed upon between the parties.

### **Chairman FACE Visits to Senegal**

Naeem visited Senegal in Feb / March 2020 and had several meetings with the Chairman of Humanity First Senegal (HFSI) and their working body.

This visit was in continuation of his previous visit to Senegal in Jan 2019 to help establish a better working relationship with HF Senegal.

Naeem met with the Board of Governors of FACE Elementary School Tambacounda Senegal (FACE-EST) on 25th Friday, 2020.

He visited Tambacounda and met various dignitaries for FACE-EST registration, guided and helped set up the Board of Governors and held multiple meetings. He saw the land donated for the School and assisted in planning for the forthcoming construction. He discussed the water facilities at the proposed site, and HFSI agreed to have their water well at the site for School.

Naeem also held a meeting with parents of the students FACE-EST who thanked FACE UK for looking after their children's education.

In a ceremony on 26th Saturday, 2020 with parents, he distributed school uniforms to 73 students. He also handed over 50 tables and 100 chairs for the students to the school administration.

He signed an agreement by virtue of which HFSI would be responsible for running, maintaining and disciplining the School and will send a report to FACE UK regularly.

**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)**

It was agreed that the School is following the government set syllabus for schools and implementing local government rules.

Naeem also had a meeting with the Board of Governors of FACE Sewing School Rufisque Dakar (FACE-SSR) on 28th February 2020.

Board members said that HFS has agreed to provide ten sewing machines initially. Naeem decided that FACE UK will use some donation money to pay for the renovation, electric work, and environmental improvement.

Naeem supervised the work, and all work was completed during his visit, and he attended the inauguration ceremony of FACE-SSR on 11th March 2020.

Naeem had a very successful visit as both the projects were completed during his stay as per the protocol signed with HFSI.

### **Land Acquisition to Build School**

Humanity First Senegal acquired land of 3 hectares, of which 1 hectare was allocated to the FACE Elementary School in Tambacounda, Senegal.

### **Elementary School Upgrade**

We took following initiatives to accomplish our aim, "Education for All":

1. Identified a local school with a capacity of 100 students in Tambacounda, Senegal, to upgrade its facilities to promote education for the local community by spending £111.
2. Enhanced the facilities by providing tables and chairs for the selected school classrooms by spending £2,395.
3. Installed ceiling fans in the School classrooms to provide education in a comfortable environment by spending £43.
4. Provided school uniforms to seventy three deserving pupils of the School by spending merely £295 by hiring a local sewing person's services to sew all uniforms instead of buying ready-made uniforms from the market.

### **Setting up of Vocational School**

1. Established a new vocational school, FACE Sewing School Rufisque, in partnership with Humanity First Senegal.
2. The local community Refusic Dakar Senegal donated a hall which we refurbished with plastering, painting, tiling and electrification to make a conducive environment by spending £1,009.

### **Establishing Presence**

We developed the website [www.faceforafrica.org](http://www.faceforafrica.org) to promote our charitable activities and to raise funds for the public's benefit. We also built our presence on social media, including Facebook, Twitter,

Instagram and YouTube. We created an official page on the Justgiving platform for collecting donations

### **OUR FINANCES**

The financial statement shows net incoming resources for the year on FACE activities of £ 2,240 and expenses of £3,961 which makes a deficit of £1,721.

The principal source of income is the donation accounting for £ 2,240. The Trustees are maintaining their approach of deploying all net incoming resources to utilise for funding educational projects in Senegal Subsaharan West Africa with a motto of "Education for All".

9. Established an official page on the Justgiving platform for collecting donations from across the globe.
