The Trustees of Ruh Ministries present their Annual Report and the Financial Statements of the Charity for the period 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024.

1 Objectives

The objects of the CIO are:

To advance the Christian religion in Birmingham, for the benefit of the public mainly, but not exclusively, through the holding of prayer meetings, lectures, public celebrations of religious festivals, broadcasting and distributing literature on the Christian faith to enlighten others about the Christian religion.

2 Review of activities

Ruh Ministries relies on volunteers wholly and our charity is grateful to Jesus Christ foremost and for the efforts and the goodwill of our members who are involved in our church service and charity activities. It has been a year since we moved premises to Smethwick and this year has been a good year, praise be to God. We have been fundraising for a charity mission house and are praying that we will be able to purchase a property in the forthcoming year.

Our aim is to raise the value of active participation of our church members in meaningful, inspirational, reverential prayer and spirituality disciplines with the belief that all belongs to God our Father and is our act of worship. We empower our local congregations and families in their role as the primary faith educators and majority of our attendees are predominantly from the Punjabi and Asian communities with varying backgrounds

Worship and Prayer

Our Sunday services are held in Punjabi & English which includes worship, prayer, preaching and teaching and is the integral part of our Sunday services with the leading of the Holy Spirit. The worship styles are varied with traditional Punjabi and English songs but again we are always open to the leading of the Holy Spirit, as we seek to deepen our personal faith. This year we have been blessed to have new people join our worship team and there has been a steady increase in numbers.

Meals - We provide lunch after Sunday service for our church. We acknowledge the importance of our Christian faith and lifestyle creates community harmony, as Jesus tells us to serve and to love thy neighbour. Our long term plan is to have wider social gathering and supporting the poor and vulnerable people in the community.

Our prayer meetings are held on zoom on Wednesday, which includes the reading of the word and prayer for our families, communities and nations.

We predominately use church Whatsapp group to send our recorded Sunday service and worship, message but we have started to use social media such as YouTube Tv channel and revisiting Facebook.

We are committed to respond to Jesus' call of service to others and His instruction to love others as we love ourselves. We will continue to encourage meaningful social action service provision across our networking with Church of God of Prophecy church and strategically partner with other churches to bring hope to our communities.

We also provide gift aid to itinerant pastors who attend our church services. We believe that the donations received are for the glory of Kingdom of God and his people. The church continues to provide international aid to various projects in India particularly leprosy homes, mobile medical unit, orphanages and feeding the poor project.

Although, this year has proved to be far better year for the church financially, we still have many challenges along the way but our hope and faith is in Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour and He will deliver and bring success and increase to the church. **Matthew 9:38 says** "Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."


