3. To establish, or secure the establishment of a Centre and to maintain and manage the same (whether alone or in co-operation with any local authority or other person or body) in furtherance of these subjects and;
4. To promote such other charitable purposes as any from time to time may be determined. ^[1]_[SEP]

Makki Masjid is a place of worship (mosque) that Muslims attend to offer prayers in congregation five times a day. The Masjid also offers other activities such as learning about Islam and teaching Arabic. Our belief is Sunni Islam and is entirely based on the teachings of the Holy Quran and Sunnah (teachings) of the Prophet Mohammed (SAW) with the tenets and doctrines of Jamiat Ahl-e-Hadith which is a group of mosques in the UK that adhere to the above teachings.

In addition to the five daily prayers, the Masjid offers after school childrens' Islamic education classes and other community needs for the Muslims of the area. There are regular weekly study circles for men, women and children. There are also daily/weekly classes/ lectures and activities for all ages and for all members of the local community.


