Para 1.20	<p>The Foundation commissioned the design and manufacture to specifications of a Motorised Mobile Medical Treatment Trailer Clinic in July 2019 for a contract price of £127,162. The vehicle is 6.2 metres long x 2.4 metres wide insulated with hospital grade specifications, air conditioning, solar powered /auxiliary battery charger system and a mobile generator.</p> <p>The finished vehicle will be supplied with a UK whole vehicle type approval certificate and be fitted with associated mandatory identification plate. The vehicle has a 3-year warranty. The vehicle was delivered to Nigeria in October 2020.</p> <p>The Chair is continuing his efforts developing good working relationships with other similar charitable foundations locally in Nigeria to seek joint-venture or donation of medical equipment to local clinics to enhance efficiency and better achieve the aims of the Foundation helping remote villagers receiving medical assistance.</p>
