The purposes of Reach North Wales are:

1. the advancement of the Christian faith in accordance with the Basis of Faith primarily but not exclusively within North Wales and the surrounding area.
2. such other charitable purposes, as shall in the opinion of the charity trustees, facilitate the work of the CIO, provided that such purposes must be carried out in a manner consistent with the basis of faith.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects

All the charity trustees have confirmed that they have read and understood the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit, and have given due regard to this guidance when exercising any relevant powers or duties.

Regular Meetings of the Trustees

Reach North Wales is a partnership of gospel churches and individuals working together to plant new churches and revitalise existing churches across North Wales. In 2019 Reach was a newly formed charity with the following aims during meetings:

- To identify areas which need new churches;
- To recognise that gospel partnership in North Wales ought to be regional, as well as local. Our work to start with was divided into two regions North Wales East and North Wales West, and focused on the specific needs within each of them;
- To help existing churches support planting work in areas identified which are near to them;
- To lead and establish church plants ourselves;
- To promote informed praying for the Lord's work in these situations;
- To identify gifted and trained gospel workers who are being called by God to plant in North Wales;
- To connect with supporters who can bring prayer, finances and other help in order to see churches planted;
- To direct resources to the planters and churches we partner with;
- Where possible, to partner bilingually, recognising the need to serve communities in North Wales in their respective heart-languages;
- To provide training events, conferences, advice and support to those interested and aligned to its objectives and vision;

We were able to meet 3 times in 2024 (16/9, 24/10 and 6/12), discussing how to progress prayer meetings with leaders in the region aligned to our charity objectives, and how to prioritise the focus of our time so we can most effectively progress the aims of RNW. We recognized that our numbers had reduced and work in our local church situations had taken us away from more focus on RNW.

Reach North Wales exists to help the planting of local churches in North Wales. The churches represented have collectively planted three churches already and our hope with God's help is to accelerate this in the coming years. However we recognised during 2024 to have a lack of direction in terms of a focused project other than to develop praying more regularly for church planting and connecting with gant i cymru.

Fundraising

Reach North Wales does not have a formal membership but is an informal group of individuals and churches who support its aims. It aims to be funded by

churches, Christian trusts, and individual donors who wish to assist its aims through financial support.

Section D *Achievements and performance*

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Following the formation of the charity in 2019, the trustees made good progress in moving towards appointing a Director and formulating a church planting vision for North Wales. However, as a result of the pandemic, the change in trustees, and local church priorities we agreed that during 2021 and 2022 we would meet for prayer and send out regular social media posts. Since this point we have had some good prayer meetings in the region but struggled to have the available time to organise something more regular and to develop a clear project for Reach North Wales to support. We are still considering strengthening the board with new trustees, broadening the representation to geographically cover more of North Wales, and how best to start to part with churches to progress church planting or the revitalisation of existing churches. We have identified at least two people that have a passion for planting in our region and might be willing to join Reach North Wales. We committed to progress this in 2025.

Reserves and Deficit

The charity does not presently have a reserves policy. There are no funds in deficit.

Further financial review details

The charity has not actively fundraised in 2024. The balance of the account was £2,293.73 for year ending 2024. The only cost in 2024 was for

webhosting at £223.20. RNW received a regular anonymous monthly gift via Stewardship Services.

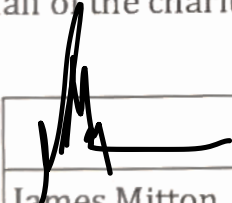
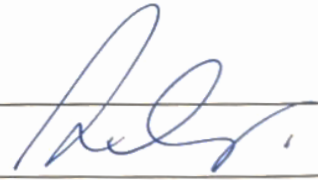

However, considering the nature of our work, it is wise for a safeguarding policy to be in place in future. Dafydd has progressed advice from CSS and Midlands Gospel partnership. Agreed we need a policy, led by Dafydd, if we are to reignite activities and this is still ongoing. This action was carried forward into 2025, with Dafydd to consider if we can use MGP as the template on which to create an appropriate policy for RNW.

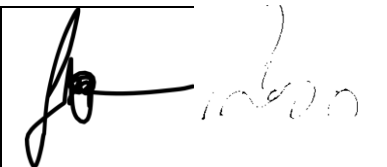

- To identify gifted and trained gospel workers who are being called by God to plant in North Wales;
- To connect with supporters who can bring prayer, finances and other help in order to see churches planted;
- To direct resources to the planters and churches we partner with;
- Where possible, to partner bilingually, recognising the need to serve communities in North Wales in their respective heart-languages;
- To provide training events, conferences, advice and support to those interested and aligned to its objectives and vision;

We were able to meet 6 times in 2023 (16/1, 6/2, 22/5, 9/11, 16/10, 27/11), discussing how to start to progress galvanizing prayer for the region with individuals aligned to our charity objectives, and how to prioritise the focus of our time so we can most effectively progress the aims of RNW.

Reach North Wales exists to help the planting of local churches in North Wales. The churches represented have collectively planted three churches already and our hope with God's help is to accelerate this in the coming years. The Buckley church plant had to temporarily pause in 2022, and RNW has sought to consider opportunities to reignite this.

Fundraising

Reach North Wales does not have a formal membership but is an informal group of individuals and churches who support its aims. It aims to be funded by churches, Christian trusts, and individual donors who wish to assist its aims through financial support.

Following the formation of the charity in 2019, the trustees made good progress in moving towards appointing a Director and formulating a church planting vision for North Wales. However, as a result of the pandemic, the change in trustees, and local church priorities we agreed that during 2021 and 2022 we would meet for prayer and send out regular social media posts. Although the pandemic has been challenging, we agreed that we didn't feel we should cease RNW activities. We did agree that we shouldn't appoint a director as local churches were not yet in a position to support funding one. This situation remained the case in 2022.

The charity does not presently have a reserves policy. There are no funds in deficit.

Further financial review details

The charity has not actively fundraised in 2022. The balance of the account was £113.60 for year ending 2022. The only cost in 2022 was for webhosting. Reach North Wales costs for 2022 related only to the hosting of the website.

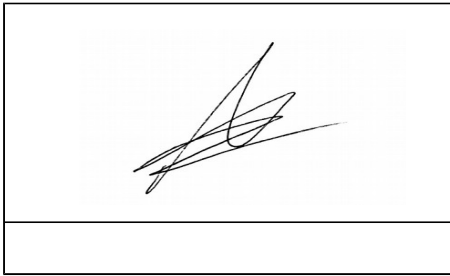
