The purpose of this decision was to provide greater protection to the board of Trustees in the event that the charity became insolvent.

In November 2019 on advice from Warwickshire County Council the Trust decided not to proceed with the conversion due to the Inadequate Ofsted rating received in November 2019. The resultant repercussions of Covid 19 meant that inspections were halted and as in the previous year the decision was made not to convert until a "Good Inspection" result was achieved.

In January 2022 the setting received a rating of "Good" after Ofsted inspection. The board felt that a period of consolidation was necessary, given the disruptions of the previous years. It was decided to formally pursue the conversion in the 2023 to 2024 academic year. The Trustees met on 2 July 2024 to agree this formally and the transfer was completed on 31 August 2024.
