This must have been recommended by an AHP/ specialist teacher and evidence provided. Age from 3-19 we cover both home schooled and in an educational establishment in West Yorkshire.

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Trustees Annual Report 30-06-2024 – 30-06-2025

The objects of the CIO are:

To relieve the needs of Neurodiverse children and young adults in West Yorkshire (without attached funding or diagnosis necessarily) by providing grants to assist with the provision of specialist equipment to aid and enable their access to education and the curriculum. For the purposes of this clause 'Neurodiverse' refers to the different ways the brain can work and interpret information. Neurodivergence includes, but is not limited to: Attention Deficit Disorders, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Developmental Coordination Disorder (DCD), Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, Dyscalculia and Dyspraxia.

The year this annual return covers has yet again been challenging, due in the main to the continued cost of living crisis. We continue to witness a drop in donations but thankfully for us, a slight increase in support, with the knock-on effect being more applications than previous years, as we become more established. As a charity, the interest and support from West Yorkshire is very slowly gaining momentum and given the current financial climate we still find ourselves in, we continue to feel privileged that we are able to carry on the work we are doing. We seek all avenues and opportunities presented to us, to enable us to spread the word about what we do and what we can provide and have actively sought to be more present at networking and events where not only can we raise some funds but also awareness around what we do and who we support.

In this time frame, we have held 3 applicant windows and have had 49 applications, which is an increase of 5% from the previous report. This is significant, bearing in mind that within

this time period, due to a lack of funds, March and June's window was shut early when our funds did indeed run out. Equipment has yet again varied and is totally bespoke to the applicant, from laptops, sensory equipment, specialist pens, Dyslexia software and resources, Dyscalculia resources, sensory seating and fine motor resources (to name but a few). All applications bar two met our criteria and could provide evidence from an AHP/SpLD teacher/psychologist as to why the equipment was needed to access their education. However, due to the fact we had to close two application windows early, at our annual AGM we voted to change our application to 2 pieces of equipment and not 3 in the hope our finances would stretch yet further.

We have added value by asking for feedback from applicants as to how they have found the process and any changes they would make, in order for us to continue to offer the ease of service we want and to grow and learn from any negative feedback received. To date all feedback has been very positive.

Fundraising, as mentioned, has been challenging but once again this year we had planned out a fundraising timetable that ensured we had some events on during the year in order to replenish our funds, although unfortunately due to a lack of support one event despite being re organised failed to lift off the ground and was cancelled twice, this had a knock on effect with our June window. Once again, we tried to have a variety of fundraises both in person and online, to widen the net of those that can participate, with postal prizes ensuring those outside of West Yorkshire could become involved.

Looking to the next year we have once again tried to pre plan in the years fundraisers for the coming financial year, ensuring funds are generated before each application window, by a larger in person event. All trustees and charity ambassador agree that we absolutely must prioritise events

that enable us to spread the word about our charity further across West Yorkshire and get out and about to encourage engagement and use. We have also completed several bids/grants which are in process, in order to try and secure bigger blocks of funds.

Our commitment to this charity and the heart of what we set out to achieve annually, never waivers, come what challenges we face. We are more determined than ever to continue to get the funds needed for each application window to ensure the needs of the children and young people are met, who apply. We are also fully committed to spreading the word and gaining support from both individuals and local businesses across all of West Yorkshire, to ensure the ever-steady increase of applications we are receiving, has all the backing necessary. We know the future is challenging, as it is for all small charities, but as we now use as a motto, we are small but mighty.

Neurodivergence includes, but is not limited to: Attention Deficit Disorders, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Developmental Coordination Disorder (DCD), Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, Dyscalculia and Dyspraxia.

The year this annual return covers has once more been challenging, as the cost-of-living crisis deepens, we have seen a notable drop in donations but thankfully for us, a steady increase in support, with the knock-on effect being more applications than previous years, as we become more established. As a charity, the interest and support from West Yorkshire is gaining momentum and given the current financial climate we still find ourselves in, we continue to feel privileged that we are able to carry on the work we are doing. We seek all avenues and opportunities presented to us, to enable us to spread the word about what we do and what we can provide.

In this time frame, we have held 3 applicant windows and have had 47 applications, which is an increase of 147% from the previous report and we can only foresee this increasing. Equipment has yet again varied, from laptops, sensory equipment, specialist pens, pencils, Dyslexia resources, maths resources, wobble stool and splint (to name but a few)

All applications met our criteria and could provide evidence from an AHP/SpLD teacher/psychologist as to why they were needed to access their education. However, we came under increasing financial pressure toward the later end of this time period and found ourselves in the sad position of having to close our June application window early, only able to meet just 1 of the 3 items listed for those applicants. We are always honest to our applicants about the possibility of this happening, and all were understanding but as a charity, this is not a position we would like to have been in.

We have added value by asking for feedback from applicants as to how they have found the process and any changes they would make, in order for us to continue to offer the ease of service we want and to grow and learn from any negative feedback received. To date all feedback has been very positive. We currently have 4 applications on a waiting list for our next application window later in the year, because funds didn't permit them to be processed. We process applications in date order received, fully completed.

Fundraising, as mentioned, has been challenging but once again this year we had a well-planned out fundraising timetable that ensured we had an event on most months in order to replenish our funds, although unfortunately due to unforeseen reasons we did not have the main one in May that we had planned in, and this did not aid our June application window. Once again, we had a variety of fundraises both in person and online, to widen the net of those that can participate, with postal prizes ensuring those outside of West Yorkshire could become involved. We were also fortunate enough to have a couple of very generous donations.

Looking to the next year we have again pre planned in the years fundraisers for the coming financial year, ensuring funds are generated before each application window, by a larger in person event. All trustees agree that we absolutely

must prioritise events that enable us to spread the word about our charity further across West Yorkshire and get out and about to encourage engagement and use. We have also completed several bids, in order to try and secure bigger blocks of funds and have attended free training for this.

Having had our AGM, we are still continuing with 3 applicant windows a year, through the months of March, June, and October, to afford us time to fundraise in between. We have also agreed to continue for now, prioritisation of up to 3 items per applicant but only one electrical item and only one application per key stage. However, it is made very clear in the criteria and application form that these items are not guaranteed, and it will depend on funds available, and we are always very honest with what we can and cannot commit to, in these ever-challenging times.

Our commitment to this charity and the heart of what we are achieving never waivers. We are more determined than ever to continue to get the funds needed for each application window to ensure the needs of the children and young people are met, who apply. We are also committed to spreading the word and gaining support from both individuals and local businesses, to ensure the huge increase of applications we are receiving, has all the backing necessary.

Neurodivergence includes, but is not limited to: Attention Deficit Disorders, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Developmental Coordination Disorder (DCD), Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, Dyscalculia and Dyspraxia.

The year this annual return covers has once more not been without its challenges, as the cost-of-living crisis has understandably seen a notable drop in donations but thankfully for us, an increase in support. As a charity, the interest and support from West Yorkshire is slowly but steadily growing and given the current financial climate and circumstances we still find ourselves in, we continue to feel privileged that we are garnering support out there, although fully appreciate it takes time to establish. We have been fortunate enough to have taken part in a number of events to share the work we are doing as a charity and also to spread the word about what we do and what we can provide.

In this time frame, we have held 3 applicant windows and have had 19 applications through for various specialist pieces of equipment including a tablet for speech and language communication, laptops, speech to text software, weighted items, dbuds, Maths resources, angled boards, theraputty and an E reader pen. All 19 applications met our criteria and could

provide evidence from an AHP/SpLD teacher/psychologist as to why they were needed to access their education and in all cases the applicants request for 3 items of equipment were all met, which we feel is quite a significant achievement. We have added value by now asking for feedback from applicants as to how they have found the process and any changes they would make, in order for us to continue to offer the ease of service we want and to grow and learn from any negative feedback received. To date all feedback has been very positive. One application was rejected as they didn't meet our criteria, and school were not on board to use the equipment, this was explained fully to them. We also have two applications on a waiting list for our next application window later in the year, because funds didn't permit them to be processed and for the first time ever our March application window was closed early due to this situation.

Fundraising, as mentioned, has again been challenging but this year we had a well-planned out fundraising timetable that ensured we had an event on most months in order to replenish our funds. We have not been defeatist and have continued to think outside the box. Our fundraising has been through donations, attending a Halifax store to carry out tombola's, guess the name of the elephant, stalls at local shows, scratch card events, virtual balloon race, lots of events around the kings coronation and an in-person quiz and bingo night, which raised £686.91. We were also incredibly humbled to have got the top spot for Tesco blue tokens in our local stores and were awarded a grant of £1500. We also still have some kind local businesses that have our charity boxes housed with them. All our monies go fully on our applicants, so any help is greatly appreciated.

Looking to the next year we have again pre planned in the years fundraisers for the coming financial year, ensuring funds are generated before each application window. All trustees agree that we absolutely must prioritise events that

enable us to spread the word about our charity further across West Yorkshire and get out and about to encourage engagement and use.

Having had our AGM, we have agreed to continue with 3 applicant windows a year, through the months of March, June, and October, to afford us time to fundraise in between. We have also agreed to continue for now, prioritisation of up to 3 items per applicant but only one electrical item. For the purposes of this clause 'Neurodiverse' refers to the different ways the brain can work and interpret information. Neurodivergence includes, but is not limited to: Attention Deficit Disorders, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Developmental Coordination Disorder (DCD), Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, Dyscalculia and Dyspraxia.

The year this annual return covers has been equally challenging whilst still in our infancy as a Charity. Fundraising has still very much been carried out in a virtual manner up to June 2022 and the lack of in person events has hampered our ability to raise large amounts of funds at one time. Therefore, we have held much smaller fundraisers online in order to keep our ability to meet application requests going. As a charity, the interest and support from West Yorkshire is slowly but steadily growing and given the current financial climate and circumstances we still find ourselves in, we continue to feel privileged that we are garnering support out there, although fully appreciate it takes time to establish. We were extremely excited to design a poster and have our charity details on several lorries from Brocklehurst Transport, to spread the word across West Yorkshire

and beyond. A few local businesses are now also housing our collection pots.

In this time frame, we have managed to hold 4 applicant windows and have had 11 applications through for various specialist pieces of equipment including a tablet, laptop, speech to text software, weighted items, ear defenders, and an E reader pen. All 11 applications met our criteria and could provide evidence from an AHP/SpLD teacher as to why they were needed to access their education. We have added value by now asking for feedback from applicants as to how they have found the process and any changes they would make, in order for us to continue to offer the ease of service we want and to grow and learn from any negative feedback received. To date all feedback has been very positive. One recurring application was rejected as they didn't meet our criteria, this was explained fully to them.

Fundraising, as mentioned, has again been challenging to engage with our supporters in a virtual manner, we have however done well in attracting more support as the year has progressed. We have not been defeatist and have continued to think outside the box. Our fundraising has been through virtual quizzes, auctions (knitted and felted items) and raffles, which have gone down amazingly well, knitted Christmas tree treat socks were donated and sold last Christmas. We have also had 2 virtual balloon races and two events where we sold scratch card squares (Halloween and the Jubilee) We have been amazingly lucky with the kind generosity of people supporting us and donating items or their time to host the quizzes for free and have again been supported by the local round table, Amazon Smile and Tesco. This has meant

all the monies raised we can honestly tell people go on our applications. We have raised £2420.33 ourselves which for such a small charity and given the year again people have had, is wonderful.

On a negative note, we did have to cancel a planned in person quiz for June due to lack of uptake. This was a huge setback both financially in order for us to boost funds and as a way of continuing to gain the momentum we were starting to have following Covid. We learnt from it and moved forwards, with pre planning and more advanced notice of bigger events.

Looking to the next year we have planned ahead an event in the summer to publicise the charity and spread the word with an open afternoon and an in-person quiz night at the end of the year, alongside our regular online fundraisers. All trustees agree that we absolutely must prioritise events that enable us to spread the word about our charity further across West Yorkshire and get out and about to encourage engagement and use.

Having had our AGM, we have agreed to continue with 3 applicant windows a year, through the months of March, June, and October, to afford us time to fundraise in between. We have also agreed to continue for now, prioritisation of up to 3 items per applicant. However, it is made very clear in the criteria and application form that these items are not guaranteed and it will depend on funds available, and we are always very honest with what we can and cannot commit to. We are once more excited and buoyed for the coming year and cannot wait to tackle it head on.

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Trustees Annual Report 31-03-2020- 31-03-2021

The objects of the CIO are

To relieve the needs of Neurodiverse children and young adults in West Yorkshire (without attached funding or diagnosis necessarily) by providing grants to assist with the provision of specialist equipment to aid and enable their access to education and the curriculum. For the purposes of this clause 'Neurodiverse' refers to the different ways the brain can work and interpret information. Neurodivergence includes, but is not limited to: Attention Deficit Disorders, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Developmental Coordination Disorder (DCD), Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, Dyscalculia and Dyspraxia.

This year has been only our second year as a charity, and it certainly has been an equally challenging year to experience in our infancy. Fundraising has still very much been carried out in a virtual manner and the lack of in person events has hampered our ability to raise large amounts of funds at one time. Therefore, we have held much smaller fundraisers in order to keep our ability to meet application requests going. As you may note, due to a relatively quiet time with our first application window in this time frame, we placed a request to amend our objectives and cover England because at the time we decided that we could support this move. This was agreed, but as you may also note, we have not made a move to change to this. As a charity, the interest and support from West Yorkshire is slowly but steadily growing and given the current financial climate and exceptional circumstances we find ourselves in, we felt it prudent not to change our geographical area at present because we realised that it

wouldn't take that many applicants to wipe our funds and we would then not be able to meet other application demands, a position we really didn't want to be in. We also felt given the current financial climate, opening to the whole of England would potentially open floodgates of need that again we couldn't meet. We felt it would be irresponsible of us, but it is a change we aspire to make further down the line.

In this time frame, we have managed to hold 3 applicant windows and have had 6 applications through for various specialist pieces of equipment ranging from a tablet, laptop, speech to text software, and weighted vest to an E reader pen. All 6 applications met our criteria and could provide evidence from an AHP/ SpLD teacher as to why they were needed to access their education. Parents and the schools have given feedback which suggests results are already being felt since the equipment was provided and what a positive impact it has had on the child or young adult. Feedback has also been received as to the positive experience and the speed of decisions and delivery of equipment through our charity which is fantastic. Two applicants did not meet our criteria and were therefore declined and a further two applicants were asked to provide more concrete evidence from an AHP, or Specialist SpLD teacher and they failed to come up with this and their application process was halted.

Fundraising, as mentioned, has again been challenging and harder to engage with our supporters in a virtual manner. We have not been defeatist though and have managed to think outside the box. Our fundraising has been through 2 virtual quizzes and raffles, which have gone down amazingly well, facemasks were sold last Christmas, which were kindly made and donated to us and we have had online auctions mainly for knitted items, again kindly donated to us. We have also had a Crowdfund, virtual balloon race and two events where we sold scratch card squares. We have been amazingly lucky with the kind generosity of people supporting us and donating items or

their time to host the quizzes for free. This has meant all the monies raised we can honestly tell people go on our applications. We have raised just shy of £1000 ourselves which for such a small charity and given the year again people have had, is wonderful. We have also, once again been incredibly fortunate to have the support of our local Round Table, with their donation of £1000.

Looking to the next year we are really hoping to incorporate two big in person events, as we know this is what draws us the most revenue, but again we are waiting to see what the current situation is at the start of the year before booking too much in. We are also looking at events such as a garden party, more virtual races, as they were well received, and we are all looking to prioritise spreading the word more in West Yorkshire and across social media and upping our presence and profile publicly. What was really encouraging at our last virtual quiz a couple of weeks ago, was the number of new supporters we had in attendance, we hope to build on this

Having had our AGM, we have agreed to continue with 3 applicant windows a year, through the months of March, June, and October, to afford us time to fundraise in between. We have also agreed to continue for now, prioritisation of up to 3 items per applicant. However, it is made very clear in the criteria and application form that these items are not guaranteed and it will depend on funds available, and we are always very honest with what we can and cannot commit to. We are excited for the coming year and cannot wait to tackle it head on.
