Objects of the Charity

The promotion of community participation in healthy recreation in particular by the provision of facilities and services for the teaching of martial arts. The charity has achieved this by providing facilities and services to the local community.

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit and are committed to adhering to the guidance.

Achievements and Performance

This has been a successful year for the Charity with both continued and new support provided to a number of individuals, organisations and schools to allow them to experience Martial Arts training or to support them in their ongoing training. We ran a number of free events including a very successful free ladies self defence course, some free teenagers mental health workshops and we provided space for other organisations to fund raise for various charities. At Christmas we also provided a number of food hampers to a local community charity. Last we ran a series of smaller events where people were asked to donate as much as they wanted to benefit smaller local charities.

Financial Review

The current year has met with our expectations in terms of fundraising activities and expenditure on the new building. Our cash funds at the end of the year were £1,260

Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is a charitable incorporated organisation, registered charity number: 1184208 founded on 17th June 2019 by trust deed.

Trustees are appointed by the board and serve initially for two years. There is no minimum or maximum requirement for length of term after this nor to number of trustees.

The trustees along with the board determine the broad strategy and areas of activity for the Charity.
