1. The Club has developed good links with the local secondary schools whose students take an active part in fund raising and community events organised by the Lions.

2. The Club supports the Penrith Town Council and Penrith BID by providing manpower when requested for their community events.

3. The Club is open to new members, provides its members with a wide range of opportunities for volunteering and encourages members to become active Lions and take up these opportunities.

4. The Club makes donations to local individuals and groups who are in need and makes donations to help with international disasters and health related projects through the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

5. The Club participates in the Lions 'Message in a Bottle' and 'Message in a Wallet' projects and maintains a defibrillator which the club funded and installed in a local hotel. The Club makes donations to Water Wells and Eye Camps organised by LCIF.

6. The Club maintains planters that it has installed at the edge of the main roads into the town.

Due to the Covid-19 Pandemic all the Club's fundraising and social activities during the year have been severely curtailed. S challenge notwithstanding, the Club has continued to pursue its programme of charitable activities and support, albeit on a reduced scale and financial footing.

The Club has made donations to local good causes including:

- educational institutions such as Brunswick Road School, Stainton Playgroup and Queen Elizabeth Grammar School.
- local organisations including Salvation Army, East Cumbria Family Support, Eden Country Care, Hospice at Home, Patterdale Mountain Rescue Team, Penrith Mountain Rescue Team.
- local individuals including grants to local families via the Barnardos organisation, and support to a talented young ballet dancer.

Internationally the Club has made donations through LCIF to help with major disasters such as flooding in Japan, the Beirut explosion, and the Indian pandemic while continuing its long established support of Lions Sight Savers and Water Aid.

The Club has also supported elderly local residents through donations to care homes and by making presentations to people celebrating their 100th birthdays.
