Para 1.20	<p>We were able to successfully deliver 5 holiday camps during this financial period for children aged 4-13 years old and numbers varied from 25-50 kids per day .</p> <p>This was a very good thing to happen for these groups of children in the community as we offer them a safe place to play ,form friendships and obtain some knowledge on healthy eating habits and the importance of it .</p> <p>Furthermore, we were able to provide hot meals to these kids on the majority of the days they attend. This helped the parents as some of them are really feeling the rise in the cost of living. The meals and snacks were provided free of charge. The children also actively participated in a variety of indoor and outdoor activities. This helped to keep them fit mentally and physically. They also participated in arts and crafts showcasing their creativity . In addition to the above TLNBT took the children out on day trips to places such as the theatre , museum , farm ,bowling and historical parks of interest.</p> <p>TLNBT also delivered knife crime workshops to young adults.</p> <p>TLNBT also participated in the Community Champions scheme delivered by Merton council. To this end we continued to maintain our Community Champions news letter to help promote and enhance people's well-being in the community by sharing information on health related issues.</p> <p>Overall TLNBT had a good year in making progress with its objectives.</p>
