Introduction

From November 2023 to November 2024, The Christian Eye Foundation has remained committed to improving the lives of individuals both locally and internationally through humanitarian aid, educational support, and community development. Our efforts have especially focused on supporting underprivileged communities in Ghana, West Africa, and providing practical assistance to the elderly in our local areas.

Key Achievements and Ongoing Projects

1. Library Construction in Ashanti Region, Ghana

One of our most significant ongoing initiatives is the construction of a community library in the **Ashanti Region of Ghana**, specifically designed to serve the communities of **Kubease, Hwereso, and Boankra**. This project aims to enhance literacy, education, and access to information for children and adults alike.

- **Project Scope:** Community library with reading spaces, educational materials, and digital resources.
- **Timeline:** Started in 2023 and expected to be completed and officially opened by **March 2026**.
- **Beneficiaries:** Residents of Kubease, Hwereso, and Boankra – over 10,000 people across the three communities.

2. Support for Elderly People

Understanding the challenges faced by elderly individuals, particularly those living alone or in poverty, The Christian Eye Foundation initiated several support programs:

- **Food Donations:** Distributed food packages to lonely and elderly individuals within our communities to alleviate hunger and bring comfort.
- **Shopping Support:** Volunteers helped with grocery shopping and essential supplies for elderly residents, ensuring their needs were met with dignity and care.

3. Donations to Ghana, West Africa

We continued our commitment to supporting families and individuals in need in Ghana through:

- **Clothing & Shoe Drives:** Collected and shipped clothing and footwear for children and adults in underserved areas of Ghana.
- **Community Support Initiatives:** Engaged with local leaders in Ghana to identify further opportunities for impact.

4. Empowering Young Women and Supporting Education

Education remains a cornerstone of our mission. This year, our trustees have pledged greater support for **girls' education and youth empowerment** in Ghana and within our local communities.

- **Girls' Education:** We are expanding our efforts to sponsor more girls through school and vocational training programs.

- **Nursing Scholarships:** We successfully supported **three young individuals** in Ghana to pursue careers in nursing, covering not only their tuition but also contributing to their overall **mental well-being and personal development**.

Looking Ahead

As we move forward, The Christian Eye Foundation is committed to expanding our reach and deepening our impact. Priorities for the upcoming year include:

- Continuing the library construction and resource mobilization for the March 2026 launch.
- Increasing educational sponsorships for girls and young people in Ghana.
- Sustaining and growing our elderly care initiatives.
- Strengthening partnerships with local and international organizations to enhance our effectiveness.

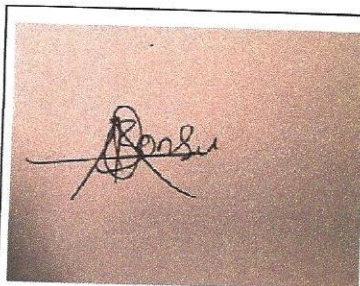

During the onset of the COVID 19 Pandemic, the Charity entered into partnership with WAITROSE BEACONSFIELD to offer food supplies to the vulnerable elderly in the local community. The help extended to Single parents with young children in the local community. The Charity also offered free telephone Counselling to those suffering from anxieties and depression, as a result of the negative impact the COVID had on the livelihood of people, generally.

Activities of the Charity caught the attention of the MP of Beaconsfield who awarded the Chairman 'HERO OF BEACONSFIELD'. The Chairman was subsequently included in the Prime Minister's Queen's Honour's List and awarded a BEM -British Empire Medal in 2020, by the Queen.

The Charity also sends donations of food and clothing as well as various items to Hospitals. Orphanages and widows in Ghana, periodically.
