## Section D Achievements and performance

This year we have been so pleased and proud to welcome several volunteers to our group, who have between them made a valuable contribution to our group. We look forward to what the next year will bring with their input of new ideas, enthusiasm and help.

Grants achieved: we received £400 from a local charity – Perranporth Gardens Charities to support our beach cleaning efforts with a beach cleaning station to be positioned on the Promenade. Together with 2 other marine groups in Cornwall, we have been offered more support from Cornwall Wildlife Trust to build a presence in the local community and to receive further training in areas such as social media. In October we were chosen as one of the Co-ops local causes and will be receiving funds as part of their community funding grants. We will be using our funds to run free workshops for the community, with emphasis on inclusion.

The group has contributed to conserving the local environment with regular beach and dune cleans, and this year we twice supported Surfers Against Sewage with their Million Miles Beach clean event, helping them with volunteers and kit.

We have undertaken training on a Shoresearch Survey run by Cornwall Wildlife Trust and aim to hold our own surveys on Perranporth beach in the future, furthering knowledge of species diversification and giving valuable insights into species changes in the light of climate change.

In terms of making the public aware of the natural environment of Perranporth, this year we held two very successful rockpool rambles during the year. The feedback on this was that the participants, in particular children, loved these events and demand is high for more of them. We also added new species to our list for Perranporth beach.

This year, we continued our monthly Seaquest sea watch surveys for marine 'mega fauna' which take place from Cligga Head on the first Sunday of every month, in conjunction with other marine groups. We were pleased to be joined by local wildlife enthusiasts.

We have posted extensively on our Facebook page to highlight our work, environmental issues and information about marine life. We have also posted relevant information from other groups and organisations, in particular that of Cornwall Wildlife's Your Shore projects and the Making Space for Sand (dunes) project, and other charities such as British Divers Marine Life Rescue work and the Seal Research Group. We have also highlighted dangers to wildlife such as flying rings which can harm seals. **Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

Help from new dedicated volunteers has contributed to a better Instagram presence, provided links with other groups such as the local Scouts, given advice on communicating with members of the group more effectively with WhatsApp.

Beach Cleans with collaboration from other groups

Continued to hold our Rockpool ramble events which are increasingly popular.

Held our second workshop with a local artist, this year it was a seaweed printing workshop for adults.

Continued support of past Beach Rangers who wish to volunteer – one of them is now helping us with our Instagram posts. We also supported a marine biology graduate to help him lead a rockpool ramble.

Seaquest Sundays on regular basis to record larger marine animals.

Continued training with Cornwall Wildlife Trust Shoresearch Surveys.

Our Facebook page has now reached 1500 followers up from 1200 last year.

Our Instagram presence has markedly increased due to help with social media from our members:

Instagram followers increased from 107 in June 2025 to 313 in Nov 2025 with 63 posts made in that time.

Engagement in July compared to June was +361% at 7.5k views

Engagement in Oct compared to Sep was +68% at 13k views





## Section D Achievements and performance

Grants achieved: we gratefully received a good grant of £350 from a local charity – Perranporth Gardens Charities to support our beach cleaning efforts and to renew our public liability insurance. We have also been grateful recipients of a collection made on Halloween night by the Tywarnhale Inn, Perranporth, who donated £300 to the group, on account of our involvement of local children in our events. Together with 2 other marine groups in Cornwall, we have been offered more support from Cornwall Wildlife Trust to build a presence in the local community and to receive further training in areas such as social media.

The group has contributed to conserving the local environment with regular beach and dune cleans, and this year once more we supported Surfers Against Sewage with their Million Miles Beach clean event and a National Marine Week beach clean. We also have continued to use illustrated sheets to use during our Litter Scavenger Hunt which aims to encourage children to litter pick at our beach cleans.

We have undertaken training on Shoresearch Surveys run by Cornwall Wildlife Trust and aim to hold our own surveys on Perranporth beach in the future, furthering knowledge of species diversification and giving valuable insights into species changes in the light of climate change.

In terms of making the public aware of the natural environment of Perranporth, this year we held some very successful rockpool ramble during the year. Our first was held during National Marine Week which was attended by over 60 young people and their parents, both local and holiday makers. This was run with an expert from Cornwall Wildlife Trust and this year we trialled our rockpool bingo sheets which encouraged participants to become citizen scientists and to find and tick off marine creatures in the rockpools. We also had an extremely well attended rockpool ramble and weever fish discovery day led by expert, Matt Slater from Cornwall Wildlife Trust, attended by 90 people - over half of them children. The feedback on this was that the participants loved these events and demand is high for more of them, so this year we squeezed in a total of three rockpool ramble events – our last held in November, again with much appreciated help from Cornwall Wildlife Trust.

This year, we continued our monthly Seaquest sea watch surveys for marine ‘mega fauna’ which take place from Cligga Head on the first Sunday of every month, in conjunction with other marine groups. We were pleased to be joined by local wildlife enthusiasts.

We have posted extensively on our Facebook page to highlight our work, environmental issues and information about marine life. We have also posted relevant information from other groups and organisations, in particular that of Cornwall Wildlife’s Your Shore projects and the Making Space for Sand (dunes) project, and other charities such as British Divers Marine Life Rescue work and the Seal Research Group. We have also highlighted dangers to wildlife such as flying rings which can harm seals. We have shared relevant job information.





Grants achieved: we gratefully received a good grant of £200 from a local charity – Perranporth Gardens Charities to support our beach cleaning efforts. We also raised money from quiz nights at the local Bolingey Inn and are very glad of continued support from the new owners.

The group has contributed to conserving the local environment with regular beach and dune cleans, and this year we linked up with Dynamic Dunescapes to clean the beach, and local Scouts group. 

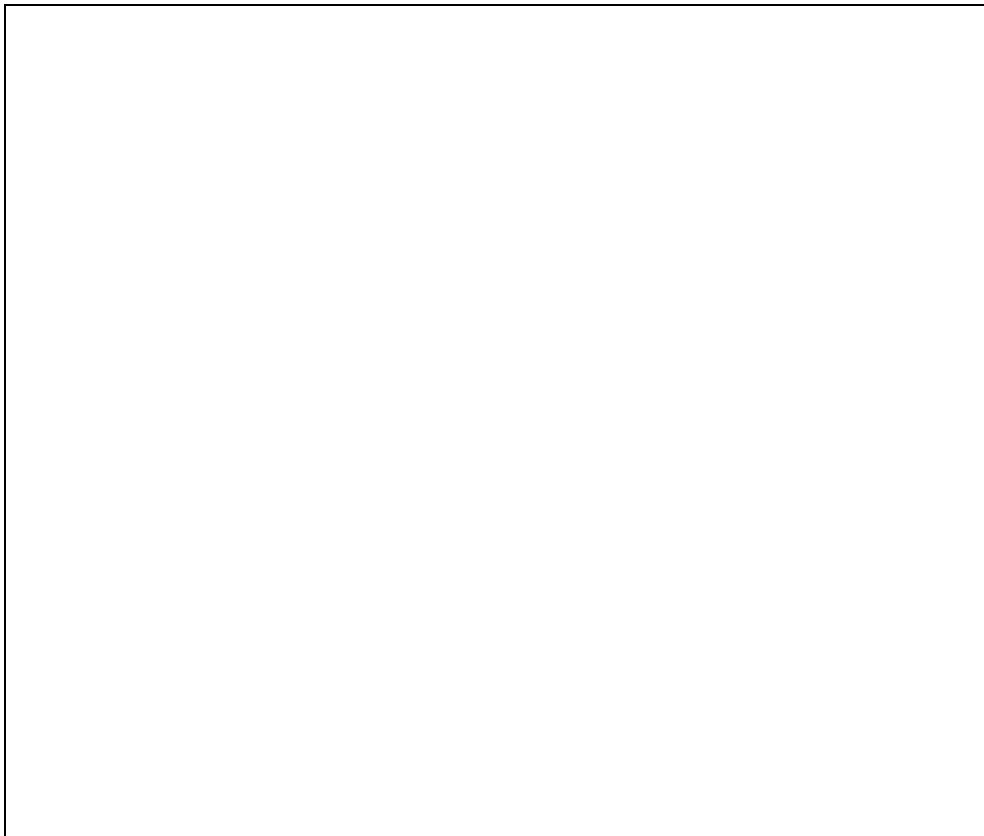

## Section D Achievements and performance

We continued to support our Beach Rangers with volunteering opportunities such as beach cleans and facilitating online training courses run by Cornwall Wildlife Trust and this year, we hosted a marine photography workshop for our beach rangers.

Grants achieved: we gratefully received a good grant of £200 from a local charity – Perranporth Gardens Charities to support our beach cleaning efforts. We also raised money from quiz nights at the local Bolingey Inn and are very glad of continued support from the new owners.

The group has contributed to conserving the local environment with regular beach and dune cleans, and this year we linked up with Dynamic Dunescapes to clean the beach. We also have produced illustrated sheets to use during our Litter Scavenger Hunt which aims to encourage children to litter pick at our beach cleans. We have had interest in local groups and companies who want to join us in our beach clean, for example, Truro Rotary Club Transition.

We have also assisted with surveying work on the dunes with Dynamic Dunescapes (Cornwall Wildlife Trust).

In terms of making the public aware of the natural environment of Perranporth, this year we held a very successful rockpool ramble during National Marine Week which was attended by more than 20 children and their parents, both local and holiday makers.

This year, we continued our monthly Seaquest sea watch surveys for marine 'mega fauna' which take place from Cligga Head on the first Sunday of every month, in conjunction with other marine groups. We were pleased to be joined by local wildlife enthusiasts, some of whom were students at Falmouth University.

We have posted extensively on our Facebook page to highlight our work, environmental issues and information about marine life. This Christmas, we published a 'living advent calendar' to showcase Perranporth's amazing diversity of wildlife both at sea and on the dunes. We have also posted relevant information from other groups and organisations, in particular that of Cornwall Wildlife's Your Shore projects and Dynamic Dunescapes project, and other charities such as British Divers Marine Life Rescue work and the Seal Research Group.



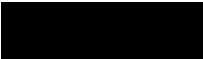

We have continued to support our Beach Rangers with volunteering opportunities such as beach cleans and facilitating online training courses run by Cornwall Wildlife Trust and the Seal Research Group Trust.

Our rockpooling survey training with Matt Slater (CWT Marine Awareness Officer) at Perranporth was a success and trustees have now held their first survey by themselves without the help of experts and also a rockpool session to assess competence for running them for members of the public. We have sought the help of a local expert with this (Charlotte Bearham).

Grants achieved: we received a large grant from The Community Pot Grant from Your Shore Beach Rangers (Cornwall Wildlife Trust), to allow us to continue the training offered by YourShore Beach Rangers which ended this year in March. The trustees are very grateful for this grant which have enabled us to further help young local people.

The group has contributed to conserving the local environment with regular beach and dune cleans, undertaking training for rockpool surveys, and preparing to roll out rockpool sessions for the public in the future, recording marine life finds with ERCISS online recording facility (ORKS).

This year, we set up regular Seaquest seawatch surveys for marine 'mega fauna' which take place from Clligga Head on the first Sunday of every month, in conjunction with other marine groups.

We have posted extensively on our Facebook page to highlight our work, environmental issues and information about marine life. We have also posted relevant information from other groups and organisations, in particular that of the British Divers Marine Life Rescue work and Seal Research Group.




