Alive to the World Educational Charity

Trustees' report for the year from 1 June 2024 – 31 May 2025

“Can Relationships and Sex Education be Transformed?” Commission to write a report for the Family Education Trust

Louise Kirk, UK Co-ordinator for the Charity, was invited by the Family Education Trust to write a research paper on Relationships & Sex Education, its origins and how marriage, family and chastity could be given emphasis within government guidelines. This enabled her to draw on Alive to the World and incorporate the principles of the programme into a framework which would encourage use of the books. The framework shows how the Alive to the World helps children to develop into well-balanced adults, able to make friends and communicate easily with others and appreciate the importance of family.

Progress on the report, which is comprehensively referenced, continued through the year.

Alliance for Responsible Citizenship (ARC) Conference, February 2025

Mrs Kirk contacted Jordan Peterson's wife, Tammy, through the ARC conference. This resulted in two podcast interviews on the Tammy Peterson podcast, each for over an hour.

Christine Vollmer, creator of the Alive to the World programme, spoke on [The Hidden Curriculum Changing Lives Worldwide](#) (3.7K views).

Mrs Kirk spoke on [Raising Strong Children: The Values That Build a Better Future](#) (1.8K views).

The 3-day conference in London between 17-19 February enabled Mrs Kirk to raise interest in her report and take down names through whom to disseminate it. These included representatives from influential organisations and think tanks in the field of education, marriage, demography and child rearing. She had a private meeting with Erica Komisar, who is a world authority on the importance of mother/child bonding in the first three years of life.

Contributing to outside organisations

Mrs Kirk continued to make an impact at meetings of the Catholic Union, the Lords & Commons Family & Child Protection Group, the Family Education Trust, Mothers at Home Matter, Christian Concern's RSE Developers group, and, locally, the Crewe Pro-Life Group of which she is secretary.

Her display of books at the Christian Union's Education Revolution conference in April 2025 led to an opening for creating a distance learning RSE programme for homeschoolers. She also spoke at meetings of the Marriage, Sex & Culture Group and sold books there.

ATW internationally

The Trustees have been encouraged by the success of the Alive to the World programme in Trinidad, using books developed by the UK team. These were now being piloted in over 100 schools.

The Trustees noted the [Trinidad Communities Alive](#) group's steady progress, working first in primary schools before beginning to pilot resources at secondary level.

The Trustees further noted that keys to success include:

Training. Educators are trained specifically in teaching Alive to the World, using a format and materials supplied by ALAFA, the programme creators in Venezuela. Teachers, school governors and also volunteers are trained and kept up-to-date with refresher courses. Volunteers are made up of parents and student/young professional mentors, both of whom contribute invaluable to the programme's success.

Mix of faith and state schools. The mix of schools taking up the programme helps to give it credibility.

Support from the Ministry of Education. Having the backing of the regulatory authorities is critical to the programme's acceptance.



During the year in question the Charity spent most of the money that had been raised the previous year in updating its website to promote the Alive to the World series of books and online materials.

The trustees received the news in early 2024 that Gracewing Limited, who own the hard copy stock of books that the Charity has been promoting, had given the bulk of their stock to Communities Alive Education and Training Trinidad and Tobago. This will enable the work of Alive to the World to be carried out as a major project in Trinidad and the Charity has been in regular touch with the organisers of Community Alive to assist them in their work.

The Charity continues to promote the work in the United Kingdom with the stock that remains. Efforts are now being concentrated on promoting it with educational institutions of various denominations.

Alive to the World Educational Charity Trustees' report for the year from 1 June 2022 to May 2023

Mexico World Congress of Families September 2022, attended by 9,000 people

Attending major international events enables us to speak with authority and bring in some of the latest science in the field of family which many people in England appear to lack. A key speaker said that even in Mexico ordinary good families cannot expect to pass on their values to their children without the aid of external reinforcement. This underlines the value of a programme like ATW.

We also heard from a mentor to blended families that it can take 5-7 years to heal the web of relationships that can arise outside a straightforward married family. This puts paid to the idea that teaching children at school that "any couple is family" is a kindness to those from broken homes who may be aching inside in all sorts of ways.

Week of talks in Kazakhstan November 2022

Belinda Brown and Louise and David Kirk gave a full week of talks in Kazakhstan. They worked under pressure to prepare their respective presentations; these knitted together into an extraordinary whole, showing how closely the various aspects of family life based on Christian moral teaching complement each other. Our hosts faced practical difficulties in creating a Russian edition of ATW, given the small number of Catholics and Protestants in a largely Muslim and Orthodox country, but our talks were well received, and we all learnt an enormous amount. Archbishop Peta himself attended our presentations in Astana.

Presentations and tables at non-Catholic events

Louise Kirk has made short presentations/had tables of ATW books at the Christian Schools Trust; Marriage, Sex and Culture Group; Family Education Trust; and the Association of Christian Teachers (online). She was invited to attend the Alex Timpson Trust launch of its research into schools and looked after children. At each of these events, she made useful contacts and built up her own knowledge. We have smartened up our presence with a new logoed display cloth and attractive leaflets.

Books have been sold to a variety of teachers, catechists and private buyers in England and abroad.

Events and contacts with fellow Catholics

Contact with schools was hampered by the strong support that the Catholic Education Service has given to a single set of resources produced by another

company; these are less well-founded than ATW on scientific evidence. We have approached the Catholic Union (CU) to see if there may be ways to encourage a more open approach. We have also contacted individual dioceses with our materials.

Louise Kirk was well received at a weekend for Catholic Educationalists at the Christian Heritage Centre, where she met a teacher who tried out ATW with difficult pupils and found them very successful in instilling sound values and helping them settle into the school as good students making positive contributions.

We have also developed close relations with the Theology of the Body Network UK.

Home schoolers

We have prepared the ground for contact with various home-schooling bodies which we shall be following up.

Other

Louise Kirk remains a core member of the Lords & Commons Family & Child Protection Group. She was part of a working group to produce a report on the role of family in society and how to support it; she contributed the section on motherhood.

She critiqued Miriam Cates's much lauded paper on some of the horrors included in RSE teaching, pointing out that the roots of the problems we are now witnessing in school programmes go further back. She remains in touch with Mrs Cates's office.

She also wrote a paper outlining what a positive approach to RSE might look like; this has been well received.

Report of the trustees

The trustees have pleasure in submitting their report and the financial statements of the company for the period ended 31st May 2022.

Objectives and activities

The charity's object is the advancement of the education of the public in the subject of physical, health and sex education (commonly known as PHSE). A facility to sell teacher guides and student books started up in June 2021, both via the charity's website and in hard copy.

Charity's organisation and dependence on unpaid volunteers

The charity is a charitable incorporated organisation ('CIO') and is governed by the trustees in accordance with its constitution. Its day-to-day running is in the hands of Mrs Louise Kirk as co-ordinator, whose salary is funded by a third party. Functions other than administrative and secretarial services are performed by her with assistance from other unpaid parties. Mrs Kirk is the wife of Mr David Kirk, one of the trustees.

All the trustees are unpaid volunteers.

The appointment of a new trustee with substantial academic experience in the field is envisaged during the year.

Mrs B.J. Brown was appointed a trustee on 25th February 2023.

Development work

Website This was launched in June 2021, after most of a year's work with web designer Vicky Stanaway (Panda Press) and in close co-operation with Christine Vollmer over the content. The website was made possible by generous donations from the Nantwich and Crewe Catenian Circle and from money which our co-ordinator, Louise Kirk, earned in Lithuania and by working on a major Commonwealth Project (2020).

Electronic teacher guides The Guide for Year 3 was completed, together with pictures specially commissioned from Paul Yanque. All three Guides (Years 1-3) were funded by Cardiff Archdiocese's Education Department.

Compliance charts These have been drawn up to show how the Alive to the World (ATW) resources meets the Department for Education's statutory guidance for Relationships Education and Health Education (Primary) 2021 for England. Also included in them are the codes from the PSHE Association's Programme of Study for PSHE, which are not compulsory but which teachers regularly consult. Our co-ordinator was happily surprised by how well we were able to follow both sets of guidance, with some interpretation. A few PSHE codes were necessarily omitted.

Compliance charts for our Year 7 and 8 books have not yet been attempted. It is doubtful whether many schools will use these as their main resources at secondary school, whereas they could provide good supplementary materials for both secondary and primary schools.

Model framework for Catholic RSE Mrs Kirk put her ideas in a paper which was partly responsible for winning our invitation to Kazakhstan, and gave rise to an article in *Adamah Media* (April 2022) and *Faith* magazine (December 2022).

Presentations

Marriage, Sex and Culture Group (MSC) Mrs Kirk spoke and had a table at the MSC's August barbecue in Huntingdonshire and at their London conference in February 2022. The MSC gave her an introduction to:

The Scottish Family Party In October 2022, she was the invited guest on their livestream show, which gave her 50 minutes to chat to Phil Holden about ATW (399 views to date). The interview features on our website.

Christian Schools Trust (CST) We had a table at their two-day conference for small independent Christian schools. Mrs Kirk sold some copies of *Sexuality Explained* to a teacher, who has since told her that they are being used and valued in Nigeria. She gave sets of the ATW books to Karen Bryson, headteacher and founder of a Bright Futures for All school in Croydon. Sadly, her school is currently in abeyance while she finds a new building, but she assures me of her deep belief in ATW.

Knife-crime Think Tank Mrs Vollmer was invited to speak at an online think tank arranged by the Lords & Commons Family Child Protection Group in June 2021. Her 5-minute presentation on how ATW has helped contain youth violence and truancy in Venezuela was praised by members of the Group.

Family Education Trust (FET) Mrs Kirk is invited each year to give a report at the FET's AGM. She tried to get the Trust to create a register of approved resources for RSE. Piers Shepherd, as research assistant, came behind this but sadly the Trustees were not persuaded.

Contact with other bodies

Lords & Commons Family & Child Protection Group Mrs Kirk is a core member of the Group and sometimes fills in as Minutes Secretary. She prepared the chapter on "The Role of Mothers" in the Group's report on the Family, to be published shortly and distributed to MPs and more widely.

Catholic Union (CU) Mr and Mrs Kirk called on Rob Ffello, the newly appointed Chairman of the Catholic Union, asking if the CU ask the Catholic Education Service to widen the number of RSE resources it approves.

Christian Concern Steve Beegoo, Education Director, has given Mrs Kirk valuable tips and invited her to the CST meeting (see above).

Michaela Community School Mrs Brown secured an invitation for her and Mrs Kirk to call on Kathryn Birbalsingh at her school. They had a fascinating morning at the school.

Cardiff Archdiocese It has been a major disappointment that, having sponsored our Years 1 – 3 books from the beginning, Fr Bernard Sixtus, Education Director of Cardiff Archdiocese, has failed to sell them to his schools. He found himself sponsoring the Fertile Heart (FH) programme, which involved his best teachers, alongside ATW, and FH got priority.

We have, however, been lucky that Cardiff put some £12,000 towards the production of our early year resources. Fr Bernard remains personally supportive.

Southwark Archdiocese Mrs Kirk was told that the Archdiocese was bedding in the Ten Ten resources but, after their preliminary examination, she was invited to reapply in April 2023 for ancillary status.

Shrewsbury Diocese Mrs Kirk met Canon Jonathan Brandon, head of catechesis for Shrewsbury, in June 2021. He promised to arrange a meeting between her and the catechetical team, which is pending.

Christian Coalition for Education (CCfE) Mrs Kirk had a working lunch with Fr Michael Nazir-Ali and was invited to speak to the CCfE which he chairs. This became a zoom meeting where she was put in touch with the new head of the Association of Christian Teachers, who has linked ATW to their website.
