The Charity we have sent the money to in India for them to construct the road is the same as before: Mercy Integrated Rural Health Care Ministries – Indian FCRA Registration Number 010190316

The Charity in India has asked us not to send any more money to them until they are free enough from Lockdown to start building work on the land previously purchased, and we intend to do that from reserves as soon as they give us the go ahead

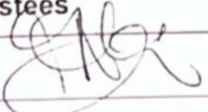

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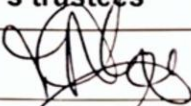
