We were able to support beneficiaries of all ages, gender, ability, culture and ethnic backgrounds.</p> <p>The provision of special dietary products has helped many individuals who suffer from food intolerances.</p> <p>Our support also helped beneficiaries manage anxiety, stress and depression that may have been brought on due to worrying about obtaining basic necessities.
