1. Pakistan – Food Relief: £200 to Alkhair Foundation for food packs to vulnerable families.
2. Pakistan – Emergency Relief: £2,000 to Alkhair Foundation for urgent humanitarian aid.
3. United Kingdom – Winter Clothing for Children: £474.33 spent on hats, gloves, and scarves for children from families struggling to make ends meet, distributed via Broad Heath School.
4. United Kingdom – Community Arts Support: £100 to Starr in the Community to share the art of circus with disabled, vulnerable, and disadvantaged people.
