Friends of Street Library Annual Report 2025

In a year which has seen the celebration of 100 years of having a public library in Street, the Friends have continued to provide support for our library.

We have maintained the provision of the local newspapers, thanks in part to a grant from Street Parish Council. The Council also managed to secure a donation of two national daily papers from Premier Stores in Street, which have proved very popular with the users of the library. We are very grateful for all this help.

Marilyn, our volunteer coordinator, has been doing a fantastic job of ensuring that we meet our commitment to provide customer support volunteers to work alongside the librarian each afternoon. A new library management system was introduced in all libraries across Somerset around this time last year. This meant that all staff and volunteers had to be trained to use the new system, which led to a few of our volunteers deciding that the role was no longer for them. Marilyn did a brilliant job of ensuring that all the volunteers had a chance to become familiar with the new system and were confident to work with it when it went live. After a few 'teething problems' everything seems to be working well, and we have been fortunate enough to have some wonderful new volunteers to ensure we always have full cover.

The Friends have continued to organise many children's activities during the holiday periods, as well as providing prizes for treasure hunts and competitions. This year we have also been able to offer some very popular activities for adults. We hope to be able to develop some new ideas to build on this further.

Due to changes in the fire evacuation regulations for the Parish Building, we have been unable to use the upstairs rooms for any of our activities. This has restricted our ability to offer as many activities as we would have liked. This has also led to the popular Booker book group and Poetry group having to hold their meetings in the downstairs library space. Whilst this space is a bit more limited, it has been working well so far. Some of the members of these groups have been encouraged to join the Friends, which has been a welcome boost to our membership, for which we are very grateful.

Once again, we were able to support the library with the annual Summer Reading Challenge. The theme for 2024 was 'Marvellous Makers' for which we donated several books and organised related activities and competitions. Sadly, I think the main winners of the sunflower competition were the slugs, although there were some very impressive successful entries. The banner which hangs on the outside of the library to promote the Summer Reading Challenge was unfortunately damaged during bad weather and we are in the process of purchasing a new one in time for the 2025 event.

In November 2024 there was a celebration of the Street Library's centenary. An incredible cake was supplied by Johanne Saunders, which tasted every bit as good as it looked. The event was attended by members of Street Parish Council, Somerset Library Service and many of the Friends of Street Library, including a few of the founding members. It was lovely to see everyone there and the display of photos of the library through the years sparked many interesting stories and discussions.

Negotiations are already underway for the renewal of the Community Library Partnership contract, which is due to be signed in 2026. We are very proud of the way that Street has been able to thrive as a community library and look forward to that continuing well into the future.

Thinking of the future, the Friends of Street Library really need your help. Despite the fact that we have over seventy current members, we only ever seem to see around 6-10 people at our meetings, usually the same 6-10 faces every time. We don't expect everyone to join us at every meeting, but a few fresh faces would be

very welcome, we are always on the lookout for some new ideas of things we could be doing to encourage people to come into our library. In addition, when we do put on events, we usually have the same small group of people doing all the work to organise and run things, again it would be lovely to see some new helpers. So, if you feel you may be able to play a more active role in how the Friends is run, or have some fresh ideas for activities or fundraisers, please let us know. We can't keep doing this without you, I look forward to meeting more of you soon.

Finally, I would like to say a massive thank you to all our committee, trustees and Street Parish Council, without your support none of this would be possible.

Friends of Street Library Annual Report 2024

This year has seen a continued increase in numbers of visitors and new members signing up in the library. Volunteer hours are up and there are many new activities on offer, thanks in large part to the hard work and dedication of our volunteer co-ordinator, Marilyn. All this despite some major challenges, including the closure of the Crispin shopping centre, affecting the access to the library from the High Street and also removing the parking available to the volunteers working in the library. The much-publicised problems for Somerset Council are leading to some reductions in funding for services. Happily, as a Community Library, Street will be spared some of the cutbacks but there will be inevitable budget restrictions.

As usual, we have offered regular craft activities for children during the holidays and provided prizes for the competitions run by the library. This year we are running a Giant Sunflower competition over the summer, giving seeds to children on production of their library cards. Watch out for all the photos in September! Our Christmas Story Time was a huge success this year. We had Kirsty and Jenny who did a fantastic job reading a number of stories and even including some songs to a packed audience before they all had hot chocolate and cookies.

The Summer Reading Challenge in 2023 was very popular. Over 230 children signed up to take part in the challenge and medals were handed out to those who completed before the deadline. The theme was 'Get Set Read', the Friends donated a number of books to support the scheme as well as organising activities in the library. We are now gearing up for the 2024 Summer Reading Challenge with the theme 'Marvellous Makers'.

The Friends continued to offer several Author Talks in the library during 2023 and we are just starting out on a new series of talks during 2024.

We were given the chance to publicise what we do and what the library has to offer at the Merriman Park Fun Day in September and the Street Parish Council 'Discover Your Community' event in March. We were also invited to attend the Family Fun Day at Brookside Academy, we supplied a Lego activity day which was very rewarding and we have been invited to do it again this year. We are also hoping to share a stall with Street Parish Council at the market on the High Street in the summer. Many thanks again to all the volunteers who gave up their time to help man these events.

In addition to these activities, The Friends have provided items for the library to help with displays and storage. We provided a new magazine rack to display the papers along with a varied selection of magazines which are generously donated by members of the Friends. We are also in the process of purchasing some display stands for the leaflets in the foyer area which should not only make it easier for customers to see the leaflets but also make the area look a little tidier. Thanks to some very generous grants from Street Parish Council and Clarks Village we have been able to ensure the continued provision of newspapers in the library, despite a surprising number of price increases through the year.

None of this would have been possible without the support of all of our members, trustees, committee and Street Parish Council, thank you to you all.

Friends of Street Library Annual Report for the year ending 5th April 2023

This year has seen a return to 'normal service', although there is still some caution as Covid appears to be here to stay.

The library is fully up and running again and, despite all the challenges, is thriving. A recent meeting of members of the Community Library Partnership revealed that Street Library is performing particularly well amongst Somerset Community Libraries. Across the county numbers are down around 27% compared with pre-pandemic figures, Street has managed to achieve figures only 7% down. This is due to a magnificent effort by our librarians and wonderful volunteers as well as all the work carried out by the Friends.

Throughout the year the Friends have organised several very successful craft events, usually having at least one activity to coincide with each of the school holidays and major events. Thanks go to all those volunteers who gave up their time to help at these events. Prizes have also been provided for all the competitions and treasure hunts organised in the library. We finally managed a return of the Christmas bedtime story event in 2022. We used a professional performer to read the stories which provided great entertainment. We were a little disappointed with the number who failed to attend, despite having been fully booked with several on a waiting list, however those who did manage to join us had a wonderful time and we received some very positive feedback.

The Summer Reading Challenge in 2022 was very popular. Over 200 children signed up to take part in the challenge and 135 medals were handed out to those who completed before the deadline. We were very fortunate to have the services of the library outreach officer who visited all the local schools to introduce the challenge with the theme 'Gadgeteers'. The Friends donated several books to the library to support this theme. For the launch day in July there was a display of interesting and intriguing gadgets, many of which had been donated by members of the Friends. While there was some debate on whether one or two items were technically gadgets or tools, the display stimulated a great deal of interest among visitors, with some very imaginative suggestions for what the gadgets were used for. We are now looking forward to this year's reading challenge.

The Friends organised a number of successful author talks in the library during 2022 and we are just starting out on a new series of talks during 2023. There are also plans for some writing workshops to be held in the library, both for children and adults.

The Friends have taken part in some community events in Street, most notably the Merriman Park Fun Day in September and the Street Parish Council 'Discover Your Community' event in February. Many thanks again to all the volunteers who gave up their time to help man these events. We were given a great opportunity to promote the library and

all it has to offer. It was also a chance to remind everyone that the Friends still need support and are always ready to welcome new members and volunteers to work in the library.

In addition to all of these activities, The Friends have helped to provide items for the library to help with displays and storage. When Somerset Libraries decided they would no longer pay for the provision of newspapers in libraries The Friends agreed that this was a vital service in Street Library and have ensured the continued provision of a paper every day. We were successful in obtaining some generous donations from a couple of local businesses which will ensure funding for most of this year, but, with ever increasing costs, we are searching for further funding from other sources to enable us to continue to provide the newspapers long term.

Somerset Libraries organised a Community Library event in Taunton in September 2022. This was a session which involved community libraries from across Somerset being able to share ideas and information and was a very useful chance to find out how the different community libraries operate. It really highlighted how very fortunate we are in Street to have such a lovely library space, professional and enthusiastic librarians together with dedicated volunteers and the support of the Parish Council, and of course great support from all the members of the Friends.

Towards the end of 2023 The Friends of Street Library will be celebrating the 10th anniversary of our formation, so much has changed in that time. We have moved from supporting a County Library with craft events and fundraising activities to being a part of the Community Library Partnership; narrowly avoiding losing a library in Street altogether, moving from the old building into a very much reduced space and then into the bright, inviting new library following so much building work. We provide volunteers every afternoon to support the library staff and look forward to celebrating how much has been achieved in keeping a vibrant and much used library in Street.



Friends of Street Library Annual Report for the year ending 5th April 2022

Another strange year for us all with the pandemic causing so much uncertainty. However, it looks as if normality is returning, even if it is not quite the normality we remember.

We began the year with the library only open for 'click and collect' service and have worked our way through various restrictions and conditions and now, as we end the year, the library is fully open with no restrictions, although there is still a very high degree of caution around.

All the uncertainty and restrictions have limited our activity through the year. The members have managed to continue to meet monthly via Zoom, which, although far from ideal, has allowed us to keep up to date and share our thoughts and ideas. The trustees have finally been able to hold a face-to-face meeting after several virtual meetings, ensuring that FoStL keep working toward the goals we set when we became a CIO. The regular meetings with the library staff have been reinstated, allowing us to continue to provide the resources needed by them. We were very pleased that a high number of people maintained their membership and their subscriptions have helped to boost our funds in a year in which we were unable to hold many fundraising events.

The Summer Reading Challenge was somewhat different from what we have been able to do in previous years. Because of the restrictions in place at the time, we were unable to visit any of the local schools and numbers were severely limited within the library, so most of the 'Wild World Heroes' challenge was run online. Because the numbers participating were collected centrally by Somerset Libraries, we do not have the individual figures for Street this year. We were only able to organise one craft session in the library during the summer holidays and Covid fears seemed to affect the numbers attending. However, thanks to Hindhayes School Holiday Club there were enough children to make it a success. We hope that in 2022 we will be able to provide more activities in the library and help to raise the profile of the Summer Reading Challenge once more.

In September we were able to participate in the Merriman Park Fun Day. This was a fun event on a beautiful day, and we were able to provide storytelling and competitions, as well as quizzes and a second-hand book stall. All of which helped to provide some much-needed funds and to maintain our profile in the area. We are very grateful to Kate Midgely who has designed a flyer to highlight the presence of the library in Street, this has been printed and distributed throughout the area.

Other events planned for December and January were sadly cancelled because of rising infection rates and fears of another lockdown. Fortunately, we have been able to rearrange the author talk to follow our AGM and are looking forward to several future events.

During this year we were able to provide some books for the Summer Reading Challenge, as well as donating several prizes for the writing competitions and treasure hunts organised by the library staff. We made a donation towards providing new blinds in the library. We also agreed to provide some sponsorship for the first Strode Literary festival which took place over the first weekend in April. A number of workshops for both adults and children were held in the library over the weekend, which has helped to raise the profile of both the library and the Friends. A stall was set up at Strode Theatre during the festival, manned by volunteers from FoStL, which we hope will yield some new members, and make more people aware that the library is fully open for business again.

Throughout the year Liza Markham has continued to provide her very popular quizzes, including one specifically for the Literature Festival. These helped to raise further funds for the library.

We are very pleased that as the library opens up again most of the usual activities are returning to normal business, in particular the book groups and poetry group. The Digital Den, offering 3D pen activities and video games, has started again as well as Lego Club. We have also been fortunate enough to have students from Strode College on work experience who have been offering IT help to customers.

Sadly, in September, our chair, Claire Axton, announced her intention to step down in December after several years of invaluable work ensuring that a library continued to exist in Street. As part of her role was to train and coordinate the volunteers for the library, she took the decision to separate this role from the chair and invited Marilyn Fletcher to take over. Marilyn has made a great success of this task, organising the weekly rota of volunteers for the library, as well as ensuring that any new volunteers receive all the training they need to join the team. Volunteer numbers have been depleted during the pandemic and Marilyn has been very active in further recruitment to ensure we are able to keep the library open. Sarah Ivory agreed to step into the role of chair for the remaining part of the year, and with immeasurable help from Peter Fry and Angela Southern, FoStL has continued its work.

In conclusion we look forward to the coming year as an opportunity to resume 'normal service'. We hope to have a new chair confirmed at our AGM, some new trustees appointed and lots more activities planned, which will enable us to raise the funds to support the library and ensure it continues to provide such an essential service for Street.

Friends of Street Library Annual Report to 5th April 2021

The year began and ended with the library being 'Locked Down'.

However, thankfully some really good things happened during this strange and unpredictable time.

In June 2020 the Partnership Agreement was fully updated and implemented to include Friends of Street Library as a full partner. Our role is to support the library with resources, publicity and most importantly, by providing volunteers. There are two types of volunteers, those who are fully trained and volunteer for duties on a regular basis to ensure that the library is properly staffed, and those who volunteer on occasions to plan and organise special events such as family craft mornings, coffee mornings, and fund raising events. Both are equally important and we hope that both will continue as lockdown comes to an end.

The building work in the Library and Parish rooms was completed in November. This was a very exciting time as all the partners came together to make it happen. We now have a library fit for purpose with many exciting opportunities ahead. At present the library is operating a 'Click and Collect' service but we are hopeful of further developments soon. Staff had been working from home, and keeping in touch with all stakeholders, but are now back in the building.

During December, when the building was first completed, we had a short time of the library being open for customers albeit with Covid restrictions. Volunteers were part of this service and it was working well. As volunteer coordinator I gave training to them before they started and people were pleased to be back. Sadly this did not last for long but it gave a flavour of exciting times ahead.

During this year the Trustees of FoStL have been concerned about losing members because of the lack of activity. In order to ameliorate this we have continued to meet regularly by Zoom and recently we have held monthly meetings to keep everyone up to date and share our thoughts. These meetings have been encouraging, although we are clear that there is still more to do.

We are pleased that some of the reading groups have continued using technology and we would like to thank those members involved.

In conclusion, we are looking forward to brighter days, knowing that despite the pandemic we have managed to get the groundwork in place for our new library to thrive and go from strength to strength.


