Performance of fundraising activities against objectives set	Para 1.41	<p><u>Online Fundraising (unrestricted):</u> target match of £473.92 was set for 2021-2022, and £571.61 was raised (increase of 21%)</p> <p><u>Community Fundraising (unrestricted):</u> target match of £500 was set for 2021-2022, and £1,101.00 was raised (increase of 120%)</p> <p><u>Corporate/major donor Fundraising (unrestricted/restricted):</u> target match of £1500 was set for 2021-2022 and while we secured 0% through corporate/major 'one off donations,' we were able to raise £338.40 through corporate donations (Work for Good) and £2138 through corporate fundraising (total increase of 65%)</p> <p><u>Trusts and Foundations (unrestricted/restricted):</u> Skiggle achieved a 43% grant success (successfully receiving £39,400 from 6:14 grants), which is +3% more successful than 2020-2021.
