Our Shed is very well established in Ripon as a place for the community to bring items for repair and refurbishment, and we have strong links with other charities whose aim is to provide furniture for those in need.</p> <p>Members are loving their participation at the Shed with sessions seeing full attendance and many friendships are being formed.</p>

We also have carried out restoration work on various items giving new life to things which would otherwise have gone to landfill or waste-to-energy.</p> <p>The sessions that have operated to date have made a huge difference to its members, providing a warm and welcoming atmosphere with many friendships being made.</p>
