BASIS OF INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

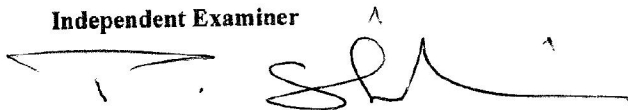
