However, due to work, life, and private commitments, our focus in 2024 shifted from direct fundraising events to creating greater awareness and engagement through social media and community activities. During this period, we concentrated our support on Centrepoint, ensuring our contributions made a tangible difference to young people in need across London. Our fundraising and awareness efforts were primarily channelled through JustGiving and social media platforms, maintaining our charitable impact even with limited capacity.

Through our advocacy and online presence, we proudly amplified their mission and encouraged our supporters to engage and contribute directly.

- **Looking Ahead**

As we look to 2025, we will continue to uphold our belief in creating a better London — one that is inclusive, fair, and full of opportunity. Our efforts will remain focused on four key areas:

- **Preventing or alleviating poverty** – particularly among young people.
- **Promoting arts and culture** – ensuring access to London’s creative life for all.
- **Education** – supporting learning in all its forms, from academic to cultural.
- **Environmental conservation and improvement** – promoting awareness and positive action for a greener city.



To our valued stakeholders, supporters and partners,

The past year has been one of unwavering commitment to our causes and a moment of reflection on our ambitions and growth. In 2022, we committed to diversifying our revenue streams and exploring new income opportunities. However, 2023 presented challenges that led us to prioritise a different path. Instead of immediate expansion, we focused our energy on amplifying the voice of the projects we support - championing them on social media, providing one-to-one advice and promoting their invaluable work across London.

London remains a city of remarkable opportunity, but we know that many of these opportunities remain inaccessible to large swathes of our community. This insight has informed our ongoing commitment to these four core areas of focus:

- 1. Preventing or alleviating poverty:** Poverty, particularly its impact on young people, continues to be a barrier to the future for many in our city. We are committed to supporting organisations that aim to address and alleviate this entrenched inequality.
- 2. Promoting Arts & Culture:** Arts and culture are at the heartbeat of London, yet for many these experiences feel out of reach. By supporting organisations working to widen access to the city's cultural treasures, we aim to ensure that this heartbeat is felt by all Londoners.
- 3. Education:** Education is the cornerstone of empowerment, extending beyond the walls of the traditional classroom. We support organisations committed to promoting all dimensions of learning - whether academic, sporting or cultural - and making a meaningful impact on the lives they touch.
- 4. Environmental conservation, protection and improvement:** The climate challenge we face requires both awareness and action. We continue to support organisations working to improve London's environmental performance, from tackling air quality issues to promoting recycling and renewable energy.


It is with regret that we report that, due to the constraints we faced this year, we were unable to develop any new income streams. As a result, our total earned income for 2023 is £0. However, we owe an immense debt of gratitude to Trustee Max Bruckner, whose generosity has covered all running costs and ensured that we have been able to continue our work uninterrupted.

Looking ahead to 2024, we are laying the foundations for sustainable and diversified fundraising. Plans are in place to revitalise our social media presence to increase online fundraising, while also introducing a cold-calling initiative run by dedicated volunteers. We believe these steps will bring much-needed stability to our funding sources and increase our impact on the causes we champion.

To our supporters, thank you for your unwavering belief in our mission. Together, we will continue to make progress towards a more inclusive London, where opportunity is truly within reach for all.

In pursuit of this vision, the McBride Foundation is committed to extending its support to charities and organizations that align with our core areas of focus:




Our vision of the McBride Foundation remains to close the gap between those who can afford the great opportunities of London and those who are increasingly left behind. Therefore, we will support charities and organisations whose focus is in any one of the following:

- **Preventing or relief of poverty:** The lack of money and increasing poverty in some areas of London is preventing young people from fulfilling their potential, or even experiencing a social life. It is key to reduce this inequality by giving young people a chance to develop. The McBride Foundation will support financially those organisations whose goal it is to fight and reduce poverty.
- **Advancement of arts & culture:** Art and culture are still not accessible to a lot of Londoners. The McBride Foundation would like to support organizations who are invested in widening access to art and culture.
- **Advancement of education:** The McBride foundation sees education as an important ally in this fight. It is important to give people access to new knowledge and ideas. This could be in the classical sense such as school education, but furthermore, McBride sees education also in the broad sense, such as sport or studying different cultures and religions. Therefore, we will support organisations whose focus is on giving people access to knowledge in all its forms.
- **Conservation, protection and improvement of the environment:** The Foundation sees the threat of climate change as one of the biggest challenges facing us today. Therefore, it is not only important to make people aware of this challenge, but also to educate, as well limiting the increasing rate of climate change in London. McBride will support organisations that are actively involved in combating environmental issues such as air quality and waste-reduction, in addition to assisting those focussed on recycling and renewable energy.

Due to the uncertainties in the gastronomy caused by the covid pandemic and especially by the unpredictability of the virus leading to further lockdowns in 2021, there was no social media income for 2021. However, we were able to generate £410 by distributing the book Jack through the McBride Support limited. Currently all cost are paid privately by trustee Max Bruckner, therefore the P/L for 2022 is net £410. Our goal for 2022 is to stabilize the income from donations.

The McBride Foundation will increase its fundraising efforts in 2022 by stabilizing the income from donations.



2019/2020 Trustee statement

The vision of the McBride Foundation is directed towards closing the gap between those who can afford the great opportunities of London and those who are increasingly left behind. Therefore, we will support charities and organisations whose focus is in any one of the following:

- **Preventing or relief of poverty:** The lack of money and increasing poverty in some areas of London is preventing young people from fulfilling their potential, or even experiencing a social life. It is key to reduce this inequality by giving young people a chance to develop. The McBride Foundation will support financially those organisations whose goal it is to fight and reduce poverty.
- **Advancement of arts & culture:** Art and culture are still not accessible to a lot of Londoners. The McBride Foundation would like to support organizations who are invested in widening access to art and culture.
- **Advancement of education:** The McBride foundation sees education as an important ally in this fight. It is important to give people access to new knowledge and ideas. This could be in the classical sense such as school education, but furthermore, McBride sees education also in the broad sense, such as sport or studying different cultures and religions. Therefore, we will support organisations whose focus is on giving people access to knowledge in all its forms.
- **Conservation, protection and improvement of the environment:** The Foundation sees the threat of climate change as one of the biggest challenges facing us today. Therefore, it is not only important to make people aware of this challenge, but also to educate, as well limiting the increasing rate of climate change in London. McBride will support organisations that are actively involved in combating environmental issues such as air quality and waste-reduction, in addition to assisting those focussed on recycling and renewable energy.

2019 was a strong year for the Foundation by kicking-off the vision of linking social activities in entertainment, social media, and hospitality with charity - by organizing the first McBride dinner in September 2019 well before the official set-up of the McBride Foundation. The money has been collected and donated via a JustGiving page to support CentrePoint, a charity which provides much needed support to homeless people. From the founding phase of the McBride Foundation in Q4-2019 we continue to raise money for CentrePoint via a JustGiving page, which so far totals £1,900.

McBride foundation has been impacted strongly by Covid and the restrictions on the hospitality industry which held-back our collaboration and fundraising efforts in 2020. Instead, we looked for a new kind of fundraising opportunity - by securing the book rights of "Jack" by Max McBride and publishing the book successfully on Amazon in August 2020. Due to regulation and accounting reasons the Foundation has outsourced the publication of the Book to McBride Ltd, which is owned 100% by the McBride Foundation. As it stands on 31-December 2020 McBride Ltd hasn't donated any money to the Foundation, therefore the McBride Foundation's annual balance sheet and P&L for the year 2019/2020 is £0.

The McBride Foundation will increase its fundraising efforts in 2021 via
McBride Ltd by focusing on entertainment and hospitality, Covid-permitting.
