

Hope Community Projects Coventry Trustees Report

At Hope Community Projects Coventry we are dedicated to providing practical support that fosters social interaction, offers a family program of activities and extends friendship, support and advice to those in need. Our goal is to ensure that children, families and individuals receive the right support at the right time and in the right way. To achieve this we have implemented a diverse range of programs that empower individuals, boost their capabilities, confidence, understanding and overall wellbeing.

Over the past 12 months we have actively engaged in community outreach initiatives collaborating with local schools, family hubs, health visiting teams to deliver programmes of activities that directly benefit our local community.

Highlighted below are some of the activities we have undertaken

1. Warm Space

During the winter period we opened our doors to the community as a warm space. We want everyone to find a place of belonging and reconnection. The Warm Space was an opportunity for people to make new friends and connect with their community. Reducing social isolation and ensuring the community are warm and space we offer fuel support and gave out warm packs for people to keep warm in their own home.

2. Christmas Hampers/Children's Christmas Presents

This year through fundraising and support from business and donations we have been able to provide 120 food hampers for households in our community who have been affected by the cost-of-living crisis. We also were able to gift 226 children 5 Christmas presents each. These children had been at risk of not receiving a gift this Christmas.

3. Summer Funday

Our Annual summer Funday brings together the whole community through a day of fun and games and community organisations coming together. We offer food and stalls to support fundraising efforts and raise awareness about the positive impact of Hope Community Projects in our community.

4. Hope Families

Hope Families brings families together during the school holidays providing a range of activities to enable families to reach their full potential , recognising the challenges faced during school holidays such as increased food costs, lack of stimulating activities and social isolation. This has included a brunch club, cooking sessions along with engaging activities and day trips

5. Community Mile

We launched the Community Mile for the local authority, people from our local community received training from the Mason Foundation to become community champions. The Community Mile is an innovative to support vulnerable communities to make a positive difference to people's lives, working to bring communities together, encouraging more open conversations and improving overall wellbeing, all by doing 'Their Mile, Their Way.' For many of these groups, for various reasons, they don't feel able to, or ready to participate in any physical activity. The Community Mile helps to break down these barriers, providing that important first step and offering a nurturing, supportive and safe environment to help them get started on their physical activity journey!

6. Hope Community Meals

We distribute dinner kit boxes to over 2 schools and a day nursery within our local area So that any member of staff at these places can give a box to any child, whenever they see the need. We trust the amazing teachers, TA's, pastoral teams, children's workers and receptionists to give away Meals to children who are in need. The meals boxes contain everything for a family to cook a meal that evening. we aim to make life a little bit better for children affected by poverty while at the same time building a different future where the lives of children are not defined by poverty in the first place.
