




Sahrudaya raised GBP3007.03 to support its objectives. We have provided fund to families distressed by the worst flood in Kerala and also individuals affected by the Covid 19.

All the pupils of the language classes have progressed and improved their knowledge of the Malayalam language and the history, culture and heritage of India. With a primary focus on the Malayalam language, all the students in the advanced group familiarized with the Malayalam alphabet, and they can read and write in Malayalam. The children have made considerable progress in reading and writing in their parents' mother tongue. Lessons are always a fun and interactive activity for all children attending the classes.

Christmas new year celebrations, International mother language celebrations are the major two events held during this year for families to engage in a casual and fun environment and to showcase some of their talents. Different programmes reflecting the cultural heritage were presented.


