

Charity Commission Trustees Annual Report **2021-2022 Financial Year**

The Trustees of Clapgate Community Fund Charity present their annual report and audited accounts for the year 2020-2021 and confirm they comply with the requirements of the Charities Act 1993, as amended by the Charities Act 2006, the trust deed and the Charities SORP 2005.

Background Information

We are a charity called Clapgate Community Fund (1185914) and we aim to improve facilities for children aged 3-11 that attend Clapgate Primary School in South Leeds and improve facilities for local residents and families. The population of children and families comes from the 10% most deprived in Leeds with many families using food banks on regular occasions just to be able to feed their children. The area our charity is based in is called Belle Isle and is made up of clusters of council estates.

Our Aims

The aim of our Charity is to provide the pupils of Clapgate Primary School with extracurricular activities, access to residential, equipment and experiences that they may not otherwise have access to and support work in the local community of Belle Isle to improve life chances of families in the area.

Our Objectives

Our objectives are set to reflect our educational aims and the ethos of the School. It is important to us that we maintain and enhance the academic success of the School. This objective is, however, set in the context of the broader goals we set for the School and its pupils.

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit. Our key objectives for the year included:

- Fund raise towards a community solar dome
- Provide pupils with additional education experiences e.g. after school clubs, trips
