TRUSTEES REPORT

AIM AND PURPOSES

Christ Church Fareham exists to bring the hope, joy, truth, and love of Jesus in the Fareham area and surrounding regions. We seek to live out the Great Commission, given by Jesus Christ to his disciples to make disciples, baptising them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all of Jesus' commands. As part of this, we seek to grow a Bible-believing, Gospel-proclaiming, Spirit-filled Church in Fareham for today and future generations.

We have four charitable aims, defined in our governing document.

- 1) To advance the Christian faith
- 2) To relieve persons in conditions of need or hardship
- 3) To advance education in accordance with Christian principles
- 4) To provide community facilities and opportunities

The trustees are committed to encouraging as many people as possible to worship Jesus Christ and to be part of our community. Our activities take into account the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit including guidance on charities for the advancement of religion. We want to help ordinary people to live out their faith in Jesus every day, encouraging and supporting one another, and being led by the Holy Spirit. Our activities comprise:

- Loving God: worship and prayer; preaching the Gospel; and deepening our faith in Jesus Christ
- Loving one another: caring for people who live in and around Fareham, helping those who are in need or hardship
- Loving the world: mission and outreach work

OVERVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

Worship and prayer; preaching the Gospel; and deepening our faith in Jesus Christ

- We preach from the Bible every Sunday at our weekly meetings. During 2022, we have preached sermon series from the Old Testament including Habakkuk, Ruth and Psalms; and have preached through a large portion of Matthew's Gospel and all of Colossians from the New Testament. In 2022, Jeff Moss preached a thematic sermon series looking at The Journey Home, a series on life, death and Jesus' return. Visitors to the Church have often commented appreciatively on the Bible teaching we provide.
- Throughout 2022, we ran three Life Groups that met weekly. These groups encouraged time together in one another's homes to build friendships, pray together and learn together in discipleship
- The whole Church meets together to pray each month, supporting one another's needs, as well as praying for our town and the World.
- Each Sunday we offer Children's Work for children under 11. There have been games, crafts, videos and teaching from the Bible to help our children grow in understanding of who God is and the salvation offered in Jesus Christ.
- In 2022 we launched separate youth work for the first time. The youth in the Church take part in the adults meeting one week and have age-specific teaching in a classroom the other week. There are also midweek activities, learning more about Jesus.
- In September 2022, we employed Jason Manning as Administrator and Under 18s Ministry Lead. He brought leadership and greater theological input for our under 18s and support for the parents in the Church. We have also funded him to study a graduate diploma at Union Bible College
- In 2022, we saw excellent growth in numbers, as people from the local area around Orchard Lea Junior School came to visit and stay with the church
- We brought 24 adults (with 14 children) into formal church membership at the start of the year, with others completing a membership course at the end of the year ready to be brought into membership soon

We pray that in 2023 God will continue to bring growth and impact lives with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Caring for people

- We ensure church members are well provided for and no one goes without; and also use our finances to bless people outside the church – including people who visit us and others we make contact with as a Church
- Over Christmas, we prepared 15 Christmas hampers in partnership with local schools and charities and blessed the most needy families in the area
- We also sent 2 hampers for members of the Church to make their Christmas more special than it otherwise would have been
- We have begun building relationships with the care homes in Fareham, offering assistance, pastoral support and lifts to and from our meetings
- We now have 52 people who we are in ongoing relationship with via email, who regularly receive offers of help and support, and who themselves join in with the work of caring for those less fortunate.
- In addition to caring for the people in the church and local area, through a partnership with an individual missionary we now help alleviate poverty in East Asia and we continue to look for local partners, working to care for people in Fareham and the surrounding region.

Mission and outreach

- As we emerged from lockdown, numbers on a Sunday have steadily increased. On average, 45 people gather, adults and children, that was an increase of 50% versus 2021
- We also saw an accelerated number of visitors towards the end of 2022, who have stayed in 2023. We now gather between 70 and 80 people every Sunday
- Our Pastor, Duncan Sills, uses some of his employed time serving Commission (part of New Frontiers) who seek to preach the Gospel and reach out across nations. On a monthly basis, he has been teaching theology to people across the South of England. This was the third year the course has run and Duncan is now responsible for leading the course, as we take our first steps as a charity into a more formal education setting.
- In 2022, we continued to support a missionary in East Asia. His work alleviates poverty and shares the Gospel with people who have never heard it before.
- We have also begun regularly supporting Commission, the family of churches we are part of. They use their funds to spread the Gospel across the UK, India, Spain, Portugal and USA and into new regions. They also help alleviate poverty in those regions

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

2022 was a very encouraging year for us. We saw good growth and began to impact the lives of people in Fareham in greater ways than in previous years. We have significant plans moving forward and with 2 full time employees good levels of resources to make it happen

- We will be launching more life groups in 2023, as well as trialling a concept called focus groups, learning together about a particular theological topic
- We are looking to build deeper relationships with people in the community, looking for ways to help people in need across our town. We have had a meeting with Fareham Foodbank and may look to develop this relationship moving forward.
- We will be running an Alpha course for the first time after Easter and hope to see a Gospel impact, with new people learning the Gospel and putting their faith in Christ
- Our under 18s work will expand – we will take a group of teenagers to Newday, as well as offering greater input for the youth in our church.
- In August the Church will attend the Commission Festival in Shepton Mallett, camping and learning about God all together.
- Most importantly, we are steadily growing our congregation and are excited for new people joining us in the future.

RISK MANAGEMENT

Even with a small church, it is important to identify key risks and ensure that they are managed. The trustees consider that principal risks faced by Christ Church Fareham have been:

Safeguarding

We are members of 31:8 and ensure all our Children's Workers are DBS checked to work with children. Our pastor, Duncan Sills, is also certified to work with vulnerable adults.

Financial

We are grateful to God for his generous financial provision. The trustees protect the charity by preparing budgets each year; monitoring actual receipts and spend against budget; ensuring we have the funds to continue running the charity appropriately; and having the accounts independently checked each year. Three different people have access to the accounts and so ensure each other person is using finances appropriately.

Employment Policies

As we take on a new member of staff, CCF have adopted a number of employment policies designed to protect our employees. These will need to grow and adapt over time.

FINANCIAL REVIEW AND RESERVES POLICY

£72,051 income has been received in 2022 (£39,570 in 2021) and payments made of £62,570 (£31,454). This brought total reserves to £62,364 all of which was being held in the bank. This is well above the required 3 month operating cost requirement.

Our giving has nearly doubled in one calendar year, which has enabled us to be more generous and do significantly more in the mission field. We are greatly encouraged by our financial position and give praise to God for the real generosity of church members who have grown giving to the church to nearly double what we expected so early in the life of the church.

There is a monetary asset of £7,204.85 of gift aid, which we will claim from the HMRC in 2023.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Christ Church Fareham is a Registered Charity (No 1186046).

Christ Church Fareham is affiliated to Commission, part of the New Frontiers family of churches.

The trustees are responsible for making decisions on all matters of general concern and importance to Christ Church Fareham including deciding on how the funds of the charity are to be spent.

The trustees met 3 times during the year with an average attendance of 100%. In October 2022, Peter McBeth stepped down as a trustee and was replaced by Jeff Moss.

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STATEMENT OF TRUSTEE RESPONSIBILITIES IN RESPECT OF THE ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Charities Act 2011 requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the Charity's financial activities during the year, and its financial position at the end of the year. In preparing financial statements, the Trustees seek to:


