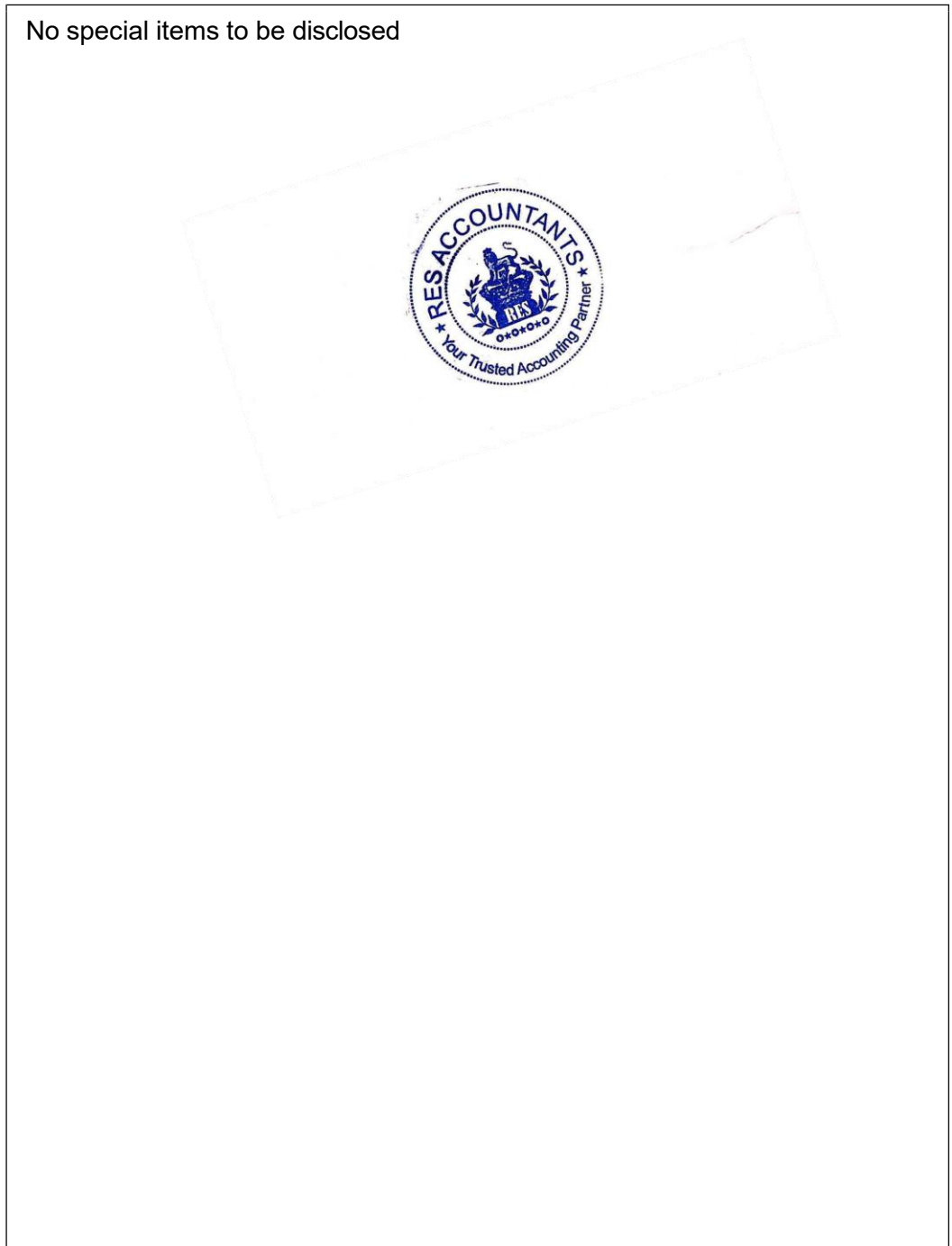

- 1) Completion of Shrine room: The charity successfully completed the construction of a unique shrine room featuring the only hand-crafted statue of Lord Buddha in the UK. This marks a significant cultural and spiritual milestone for the organization and the community.
- 2) VAT and Gift Aid registration: For the first time, the Charity managed to reclaim taxes on eligible donations, increasing their financial efficiency and funding potential.
- 3) Ground floor completion: With financial support from the Big Lottery Fund, the Charity completed the construction of the ground floor of our premises. This enhances the facility's functionality and accessibility for various community activities.
- 4) Automated Gate Installation
The charity installed an automated gate funded by the Home Office's security Funds. This improves the safety and security of the charity's premises, ensuring a secure environment for visitors and resident Buddhist monks.
- 5) Sunday Dhamma School:
The Charity launched a Sunday Dhamma School with now has well over 40 students enrolled. This initiative provides religious education and community engagement for young people, fostering cultural and spiritual development.
- 6) Sri Lanka dance classes: The Charity introduced dance classes that teach traditional Srilankan dances.





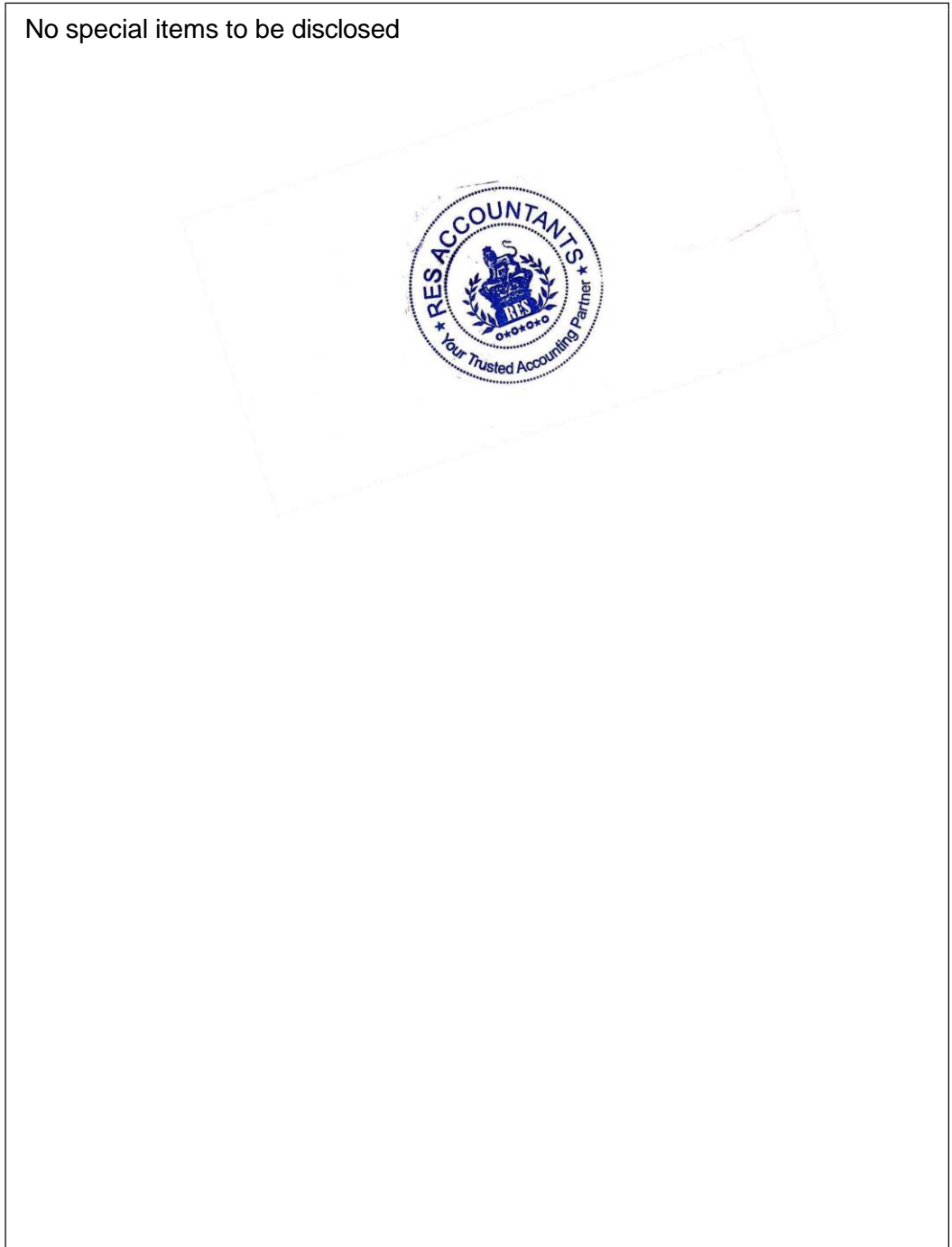
