To support impoverished children, including orphans in Ghana, by providing quality education that empowers them, opens opportunities, and contributes to breaking the cycle of poverty.

In addition to the positive impact the charity has already made—and continues to make—in the lives of a few children, whose education we have supported from the beginning, we have now embarked on establishing and operating a school—offering both primary and junior secondary education. This expansion has led to a significant increase in our funding requirements to cover building infrastructure, capital expenditures, and ongoing running costs.

The main activities during this financial period included the development of physical and administrative infrastructure, the establishment of the school, the registration of the charity in Ghana, and the organisation of an annual educational trip for the children, which serves to inspire and encourage them.

In addition, an educational science workshop was held at Korle Bu Hospital, facilitated by Dr. Hephzi Tagoe, a member of the school board; to provide the children with practical learning experiences.

We are taking a view on this for the coming year, as we expand to running and operate the school which most of our children attend. This will demand a much larger funding requirement and planning.

Activities were lower than usual. However, the charity maintained its purpose of securing children in education. No educational visit took place in this financial period, due to insufficient funds raised and personal circumstances of the chair completing nursing degree. However, the trustees were attentive and ensured the needs of the children were taken care of and the initial administration of taking over and running the school went underway.

Towards the last month of the financial year, we received funding support by two grant-making trusts which provided funds to pursue the building /restructuring and set up of the new school. These funds were utilised in the following year.

To help impoverished children including orphans of Ghana get an education; to encourage and support the parents /guardians to understand the importance of keeping their children in education and furthermore, encourage financial sustainability. Thereby, reducing the impact of poverty on young lives and equipping them to embrace opportunities.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

The trustees agreed that the school at large could benefit hugely from developing its sanitation and hygiene facilities, restoring the bore hole (inactive for over ten years) and undertaking educational trips. These projects accomplished, are noted to enhance self-esteem, bring hope, and inspire and educate the children 'outside the classroom'.

Therefore, the trustees set out an ambitious drive towards achieving the objectives of the charity through performing the activities as stated above.

Local fund-raising activities have not resumed since Covid-19 and is not a significant source of raising funds. We have been successful with the research in grant-funding trusts, and our story, vision, openness, and transparency have helped secure enough financial support to satisfy the present requirements of the charity.

The charity's financial strategy remains - to maintain available funds to meet our annual commitments.

The projects undertaken have brought an atmosphere of excitement, happiness, hope, and improved morale among staff and children. This was particularly evident when the bore hole was restored, and clean running water flowed.

There was no local fundraising event due to Covid-19. However, the charity increased pursuit of sending appeal letters to grant funding trusts. This was successful.

Operation for the year ending 2021, continued to be successful, despite COVID-19. The charity's commitments to the young lives we support, were met. The charity was able to build a good rapport and relationship with the children through regular phone calls and video calls, though many connection challenges, conversations were had.

The charity cannot guarantee receipt of grants and therefore has a strategy to reserve funds to cover emergencies with these young lives, and to keep them in education. It is therefore our aim to have a buffer beyond our planned yearly commitments.

It is the charity's plan to visit Ghana at least once per year to further develop relationships with children and families and to further the charity's objectives. A visit is planned for 2022. These trips are planned to include educational visits, activity clubs and parents' workshops. The charity appeals for grants are target led.

The Trustees agree that the school at large could benefit hugely from developing the school's computer science lab. However, due to lack of security, only a few computers were installed in a small secure area. We hope to address this and provide more computers in the coming year.

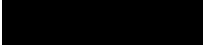

Our first year of operation has been successful in maintaining eight children in primary education by paying school fees, providing uniform, books, and school lunches. During Covid -19, the charity was able to provide catch up lessons and summer school at opportune times of restrictions lifting, catering for over 40 children.

Thankfully, all provisions were funded by the successful applications for grants, our fundraising efforts of cooking Afro-Caribbean takeaways such jerk chicken, curried goat, and oxtail stew - served with rice and plantain. Sales from our African hand-made merchandise and donations from friends of the charity were valuable contributions.

With a steady flow of grants and sales from fundraising efforts, we were able to increase our commitment to supporting 12 children including one orphaned teenager in vocational training.

It is also imperative that we the Trustees receive termly reports on the children's attendance record and academic report. Our volunteer assists with this but it has not been consistent, and many phone call chasings had to be done.
