


To support women and their families with practical help, holistic treatments and to raise funds to support research into Triple Negative breast cancer.</b>

Para 1.17 and 1.19	<b>We have continued to keep in mind the Charity Commissions guidance and meet to discuss fundraising ideas regularly. We made a further donation to Action Against Cancer to support Dr Leandro Castellano at The University of Sussex where he has been researching and developing new drugs for harder to treat breast cancers such as Triple Negative. We have continued to pay for holistic treatments, such as reflexology for women and their family members to help overall wellbeing. These treatments have been particularly beneficial at end of life where family members have reported their loved ones were calmer and in visibly less pain. We have recognised the link between mental health and physical health and paid for Counselling for women and their family members. This is sometimes hard to access on the NHS and quite often there can be a long wait or sessions are time restricted. The cost of living crisis has sadly meant families are struggling with the cost of food and luxury items or treats are few and far between. We have issued supermarket vouchers, sent treat hampers and been able to send families cinema vouchers, theme park vouchers etc to enable them to create lasting memories. We have also</b>

		sent gifts to the children of those recently bereaved in order to help them deal with loss. We continue to signpost to other organisations if needed and promote breast cancer awareness on our social media platforms.



