The grant was needed to support WNRPF a very vulnerable group of women that the grant would support: Gaining bed space in one of the secure, anonymously located refuges, key workers and wrap around support including counselling, practical help, and support with their leave to remain applications and resettlement costs.</p>

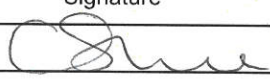
