BACKGROUND

Haringey Street Pastors (HSP) started its activities in the London Borough of Haringey in December 2006. HSP became a CIO on 20.11.2019. It is a small local initiative currently with 7 active members in 2 teams.

All Street Pastors are members of local Churches of various Christian denominations.

ACTIVITIES

Out of the 24 patrols scheduled for the reporting period HSP realised 23 outings.

During these patrols a total of 430 empty glass bottles were collected and safely disposed off.

On each patrol at least 3 Street Pastors are present, which is the required minimum as stipulated by its umbrella organisation Ascension Trust.

Before a patrol is going out the Police is asked by email for a CAD number and is told where a Team will be going that night. Patrolling usually starts at around 11:00 pm on a Friday night and finishes around 1:00 am Saturday morning. Teams normally go to those areas in the Borough where social unrest is not unusual, but when we encounter (serious) disturbances we inform the Police and try to stay out of trouble. Luckily, these situations are rather uncommon.

We engage with local shopkeepers and members of the public and as it is quite common being asked about the meaning of the highly visible 'Street Pastor' logo on our uniforms we explain what Street Pastoring is about, for which we, almost without exception, receive a very positive response. When we meet homeless people, we inform the Streetlink Organisation about their location and hand out information on Services provided by the Borough for homeless people as well as Soup kitchens and Foodbanks active in the Tottenham area.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETINGS

During the reporting period we had apart from an AGM, 2 Management Committee Meetings. Regular contact between members have been maintained by email and text messages.

Chairman's Report

During this reporting period Haringey Street Pastors realised 23 patrols each with an adequate number of participating Street Pastors. For each patrol, there have to be at least 3 Street Pastors present.

Interactions between members of the public and Haringey Street Pastors have been excellent and our nightly presence on the streets of the Borough is definitely appreciated.

Throughout the reporting year, contacts with the Metropolitan Police have been maintained by email to obtain a CAD number before going out on patrol. After having finished patrols, the Police is informed to close the CAD number.

Homeless people are referred to Streetlink and we provide information on services provided by the Borough for homeless people and on Soup kitchens and Foodbanks active in the Tottenham area.

Recruiting candidate Street Pastors to reinforce our limited numbers has been as in previous years difficult. People simply are mostly reluctant to sacrifice a couple of (nightly) hours during weekends, but recruiting candidates remains nevertheless urgent as most of our currently active Street Pastors are over 70 years of age, while some of them have been active for almost 20 years. The absence of a (part-time) coordinator puts an extra burden on the Trustees' secretary functioning as substitute, exacerbated by increased domestic responsibilities.

The rather large amount of £800.00 we have to pay Ascension Trust as yearly contribution is certainly putting a heavy burden on our limited financial resources and puts our long term viability in doubt. It has proven to be rather hard to get financial support of local Churches; private donations are Haringey Street Pastors' main source of income.

Haringey Street Pastors (HSP) started its activities in the London Borough of Haringey in September 2006. HSP became a CIO on 20.11.2019. HSP is a small local initiative currently with 7 active members in 2 teams, all being a member of a local Church with various Christian denomination.

ACTIVITIES

Out of the 25 outings scheduled for the reporting period, HSP realised 23 patrols, amounting to about 234 volunteers hours. During these patrols, a total of 553 bottles were collected and safely disposed off.

On each patrol at least 3 Street Pastors are present, which is the required minimum as stipulated by its umbrella organisation Ascension Trust.

Before a patrol is going out, the Police is asked for a CAD number and told where a Team will be going that night. Patrolling usually starts at around 11:00 pm on a Friday night and finishes around 1:00 am Saturday morning. Teams normally go to those areas in the Borough where social unrest isn't unusual but when we encounter (serious) unrest, we inform the Police and try to stay out of trouble. Luckily, these situations are rather uncommon.

We engage with local shopkeepers and members of the public and as it's quite common being asked what's the meaning of the highly visible markings on our uniforms we explain what Street Pastoring is about, for which we, almost without exception, receive a very positive response.

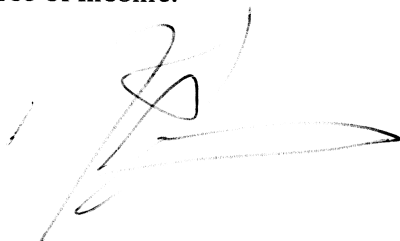

BACKGROUND

Haringey Street Pastors started its activities in the London Borough of Haringey in September 2006. Haringey Street Pastors became a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 20 November 2019. It is a small Initiative having 8 active members in 2 Teams. All its Street Pastors are members of a local Church of various Christian denominations

ACTIVITIES

At the beginning of 2023, Covid restrictions had been lifted and we started our outings mid January 2023. Patrols continued mostly uninterrupted during the year until mid December 2023.

In line with the aims of our umbrella organisation Ascension Trust we provide a Caring, Listening and Helping influence on the night-time economy in the Borough of Haringey.

We focus our patrols on the areas where anti-social behaviour has been a problem in the past and mostly still is.

PATROLS

Before each patrol we gather together outside Westbury Avenue Baptist Church, Wood Green to socialise and pray before we set off. Moreover, two retired Haringey Street Pastors commit to pray for each patrol. Before we set off, we get in touch by email with the Metropolitan Police for Haringey and Enfield, informing them where and when we will be going and asking for a CAD number.

We walk in those areas where people are gathering in the late hours of the day and early morning.

As is common policy with Street Pastors we clear the streets of potential lethal weapons like glass bottles, of which we collected over the reporting year almost 800. Most bottles are usually collected in the West Green Road area; sometimes over 100 during one patrol!

During the reporting year we had 24 patrols, involving a combined total of 95 Street Pastors and amounting to over 280 hours of volunteering

We engage with people in conversation as it is quite common for us to be asked what is the meaning of the highly visible markings on our uniforms. We frequently meet and greet Security Guards at pubs and night-clubs. We try to provide a reassuring ear, encourage safe behaviour and ultimately to remind them of a loving God who delights to hear us call on Him.

BACKGROUND

Haringey Street Pastors started its activities in the London Borough of Haringey in September 2006. Haringey Street Pastors became a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 20 November 2019.

It is a small Initiative having 10 members in 2 Teams at the beginning of the reporting period; unfortunately, 2 members resigned during the reporting period.

All our Street Pastors are members of a local Church of various Christian denominations

ACTIVITIES

Like the previous year, because of the continuing Covid pandemic 2021 has been a difficult year. However, once restrictions were lifted and it became apparent that staying outside and wearing a face mask sufficiently reduced infection risks, patrolling resumed in April 2021. During the month of August we don't usually patrol, but because of the 'late' start, we had one patrol in August. Regular patrolling resumed in September, continuing uninterrupted until mid December 2021.

Because of the restrictions imposed by the lock down at the beginning of the year, we only realised 17 patrols, which equals to about 185 hours of volunteering.

In line with the aims of the umbrella organisation Ascension Trust we provide a Caring, Listening and Helping influence on the night-time economy in the Borough of Haringey. We focus our patrols on the areas where anti- social behaviour has been a problem in the past.

PATROLS

Before each patrol we used to meet at Westbury Avenue Baptist church who have generously supported us over the years allowing us to use their facilities.

However, since the outbreak of the pandemic we have not actually used the church building; we gather together outside to pray before each patrol. Moreover, two previous members commit to pray for each patrol.

One of them is recently retired Street Pastor and so familiar with the challenges that we meet.

Before we set off, we get in touch with the Metropolitan Police in our area, informing them where we will be going and asking for a CAD number.

We walk in those areas where people are gathering in the late hours of the day and early morning. As is common policy with Street Pastors we clear the streets of potential lethal weapons like glass bottles.

We engage with people in conversation as it is quite common for us to be asked what is the meaning of the highly visible markings on our jackets. We frequently meet and greet Security Guards at pubs and night-clubs. We try to provide a reassuring ear, encourage safe behaviour and ultimately to remind them of a loving God who delights to hear us call on Him.

Chairman's Report

Despite the restrictions posed by the lock down during the reporting period, Haringey Street Pastors managed to do 17 Patrols, each with an adequate number of participating Street Pastors. (There have to be at least 3 Street pastors present for a patrol to go out). Interactions between members of the public and Haringey Street Pastors have, as always, been excellent and our presence on the streets of the Borough is clearly appreciated.

During the year contacts with the Metropolitan Police Force have been maintained to obtain a CAD number before setting off.

A major and ongoing challenge Haringey Street Pastors faces is the recruiting of new candidates to reinforce its numbers, which is in particular relevant as some of our most active Street Pastors are over 70 years of age. Also, of its 10 members, only 8 can be considered as 'active' in the sense that they come out on patrol on a regular base. Therefore, it was a disappointment that 2 experienced Streetpastors resigned during the reporting period. This loss has been partly compensated by the recruitment of a candidate Street Pastor who completed her training and joined our ranks in November 2021.

The absence of a (part-time) coordinator puts an extra burden on the Trustees' secretary's shoulders, functioning as a substitute.

The rather steep increase in the contribution from Street Pastor Initiatives to Ascension Trust, is a heavy burden on our limited financial resources and puts our long-term viability in doubt. It certainly necessitates to increase its fund-raising efforts.
