Objectives and Activities

The Glynnis Gale Foundation is established for the benefit of the public in South Africa with the charitable purpose of advancing education and awareness of mesothelioma in Southern Africa and improving access to equitable healthcare and palliative care options for mesothelioma patients.

Events and Activities

Awareness and patient support remain central to the Foundation's mission. During the reporting period, the Foundation continued to expand its work across research, advocacy, education, and direct patient support. Our outreach efforts have significantly increased, with the Foundation **speaking directly to more than 1,200 individuals and responding to nearly 3,000 telephone enquiries from people affected by historical asbestos mining and related diseases**. These interactions highlight the ongoing impact of asbestos exposure and reinforce the importance of sustained awareness, education, and support.

Key activities during the period included:

1. Northern Cape Palliative Alliance

- Our continued mission of establishing a **formal Palliative Care Framework for the Northern Cape region** remains a priority.
- Strengthened collaboration between healthcare providers and palliative care stakeholders to improve coordinated care for patients with life-limiting illnesses.

2. Medical Equipment Advocacy



- Over the past three years we continue to build out our palliative care equipment library, offering equipment to patients with life limiting illnesses.
- Engaged with healthcare stakeholders to highlight the importance of timely access to appropriate equipment to support patient comfort and quality of life.
- A priority for the coming year is to continue to build this out and offer a more expanded range.

3. Support for Terminally Ill Patients

- Continued providing **direct support to patients and their families**.
- Facilitated connections with specialist nurses, palliative care doctors, and access to essential medical equipment.
- Maintained a **patient-centred approach** focused on improving quality of life and care outcomes for individuals living with terminal illness.

4. Patient Education and Awareness

- Expanded the distribution of **educational materials on mesothelioma and asbestos-related diseases**.
- Increased outreach to clinics and hospitals to support **earlier identification of symptoms and improved referral pathways**.
- Maintained awareness campaigns highlighting the **ongoing legacy of historical asbestos mining in affected communities**.

5. Kimberley Office (South Africa)

- The **Kimberley office** has now been operational for **three and a half years**.
- The Foundation continues to establish itself as **the only organisation in South Africa dedicated specifically to supporting individuals affected by mesothelioma**.
- Ongoing engagement with local healthcare providers has strengthened **awareness, collaboration, and patient referral pathways**.

6. Advancing Palliative Care in the Northern Cape

- Our collaboration with the **Henrietta Stockdale School of Nursing** continues, we are determined to help support additional palliative care nurses in the Northern Cape.
- The province has a severe shortage of nurses which means palliative care support is lower down on the list of priorities.

Achievements and Impact

Over the reporting period, the Foundation has:



- Strengthened its role in international research collaboration.
- Continued to strive to build a regional framework for palliative care.
- Expanded its reach in patient education and awareness.
- Maintained direct and meaningful support for patients and families.

These efforts contribute to improving both the understanding and management of mesothelioma and asbestos-related diseases in Southern Africa.

Objectives and Activities

The **Glynnis Gale Foundation** is established **for the benefit of the public in South Africa** with the following charitable purpose to advance education and awareness on Mesothelioma in Southern Africa and to advance access to equitable healthcare options for Mesothelioma patients.

Events and Activities

During the reporting period, the **Glynnis Gale Foundation** undertook several key activities aligned with its charitable purposes to support the public in South Africa. These activities were designed to provide direct benefit to individuals affected by **mesothelioma-related conditions and diseases**.

1. WUN Grant and Multinational Research Project

- Part of a multinational research team that secured a WUN grant to participate in a research project titled "*Equitable Approaches in Global Palliative Care Research: Insights from a Multinational Project*".
- In October 2024, The Glynnis Gale Foundation hosted an international meeting of the researchers of this project (Mesothelioma UK, the University of Sheffield Mesothelioma Research Centre, the Henrietta Stockdale School of Nursing, Compass Ghana, and the African Palliative Care Association) in Kimberley South Africa. The purpose was to bring together the research team to finalise the research paper ahead of publication.

2. Northern Cape Palliative Alliance

- Established the Northern Cape Palliative Alliance to drive the development of a Palliative Care Framework for the region.



3. Medical Equipment Donations

- Continue to push for the adoption of TIP Catheters for the Robert Mangalisa Sobukwe Hospital in Kimberley. This will dramatically improve the management of Pleural Effusions in Mesothelioma patients. We have experienced several delays due to changes in hospital management and structures.

4. Support for Terminally Ill Patients

- Provided critical support by connecting terminally ill patients with specialist nurses, palliative doctors, and essential equipment.

5. Patient Education and Awareness

- Produced educational materials to raise public awareness about mesothelioma, its symptoms, and available treatment pathways.

6. Establishment of Kimberley Office (South Africa)

- Our South African office has been operational for over a year now, and we are establishing ourselves as the only organisation in South Africa, dedicated to supporting mesothelioma in Southern Africa
- Distributed our literature throughout the local clinics and hospitals to help both patients and medical teams identify the signs and symptoms of Asbestos related diseases.

7. Advancing Palliative Care in the Northern Cape

- Continued collaboration with the Henrietta Stockdale School of Nursing to inform and advance palliative care practices and mesothelioma awareness among local healthcare professionals.

This report highlights the significant progress made in research, advocacy, patient support, education, and collaboration, furthering the charity's mission to combat the impacts of asbestos-related diseases and improve palliative care.

1. WUN Grant and Multinational Research Project

- Secured a WUN grant to participate in a multinational research project titled *"Equitable Approaches in Global Palliative Care Research: Insights from a Multinational Project"*.
- Collaborating with partners including Mesothelioma UK, the University of Sheffield Mesothelioma Research Centre, the Henrietta Stockdale School of Nursing, Compass Ghana, and the African Palliative Care Association. The multi-year project involves comprehensive reviews of existing research and conducting interviews, with a publication date set for 2024.

2. Northern Cape Palliative Alliance

- Established the Northern Cape Palliative Alliance to drive the development of a Palliative Care Framework for the region.

3. Medical Equipment Donations



- Engaged in discussions with Rocket Medical (UK) to secure a donation of Tunnelled Indwelling Pleural Catheters (TIPC) for Robert Mangalisa Sobukwe Hospital in Kimberley, Northern Cape. Despite delays caused by leadership changes at the hospital, negotiations are ongoing.

4. Support for Terminally Ill Patients

- Provided critical support by connecting terminally ill patients with specialist nurses, palliative doctors, and essential equipment.

5. Patient Education and Awareness

- Produced educational materials to raise public awareness about mesothelioma, its symptoms, and available treatment pathways.

6. Action Mesothelioma Day

- Supported Action Mesothelioma Day in the UK, linking this campaign to impactful patient stories in South Africa's Northern Cape.

7. Legal Support for South African Victims

- Partnered with Hugh James Solicitors to facilitate legal claims for South African mesothelioma victims, securing compensation from international organisations. Increased the number of families supported to 8 within reporting period.

8. Addressing Asbestos in Schools

- Collaborated with the [Democratic Alliance party](#) in South Africa to tackle the issue of asbestos in schools in the Northern Cape, working to prevent the closure of primary schools affecting 383 children under 10.

9. Legacy of Asbestos Presentation

- Delivered a presentation to Hugh James Solicitors' Asbestos Team on the "*Legacy of Asbestos in South Africa*".

10. Nurse Training

- Partnered with Mesothelioma UK to deliver specialised nurse training on managing mesothelioma symptoms, including a session on "*Managing Breathlessness*" led by Christine Jones, a Mesothelioma UK CNS.

11. Establishment of Kimberley Office (South Africa)



- Established an office in Kimberley, South Africa, the epicentre of asbestos-related diseases in the country.
- The office will strengthen networks among clinicians and nurses to enhance awareness and education about mesothelioma, addressing challenges such as misdiagnosis with tuberculosis.

12. Advancing Palliative Care in the Northern Cape

- Met with the Northern Cape Health Department's Head of Palliative Care to further develop a support network for state patients.
- Continued collaboration with the Henrietta Stockdale School of Nursing to inform and advance palliative care practices and mesothelioma awareness among local healthcare professionals.

- Partnered with Dr Rakesh Patel from University Hospital Leicester to deliver virtual training to Palliative nurses in the Northern Cape
- Discussions with Rocket Medical in the United Kingdom to try and secure a donation of Tunnelled Indwelling Pleural Catheter (TIPC) to Robert Mangalisa Sobukwe Hospital in Kimberley Northern Cape
- Set up the Northern Cape Palliative alliance with the purpose to progress a Palliative Care Framework for the Northern Cape.
- Supported Terminally Ill patients connecting them with Specialist nurses, Palliative doctors and equipment.
- Supported Action Mesothelioma Day in the UK, although linked this back to patient stories in South Africa, Northern Cape.
- Patient Literature and Education - to raise public awareness about mesothelioma, its symptoms, and available treatment pathways.


